Lieutenant Henry Beddingfield, M.B., Royal Army Medical Corps.

For coolness and daring in repeatedly superintending removal of wounded from the firing line, under heavy fire.

Captain Lightly Harold Birt, 1st Battalion, Princess Charlotte of Wales's (Royal Berkshire Regiment).

For skill and courage at Villers Cotterets, on 1st September, and at Metz Farm Valley, on 17th September, in holding his position.

Captain Basil Ferguson Burnett Hitchcock, The Sherwood Foresters (Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment).

On 26th August, at Hancourt, France, for gallantry in rallying troops in disorder and leading them against the enemy, thereby ensuring an orderly evacuation of the village.
