9055	Serjeant ...	Rogers, D. L. ...	2nd Battalion, Seaforth Highlanders	For gallant conduct and skilful leading on 13th October.
6884	Private ...	Ross, A. ...	1st Battalion, Gordon Highlanders	For gallantry on 12th to 15th October in repeatedly carrying messages under fire to and from firing line, and on several occasions brought up ammunition. Was wounded 15th October.
9947	Serjeant ...	Ross, R. A....	2nd Battalion, Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders	For gallantry on 21st October, when his company had been reduced by three-fourths through casualties, he maintained his platoon in position until ordered to retire.
3072	Private ...	Russell, W. G. ...	Irish Guards ...	For valuable and efficient work on 4th Brigade Staff. Has delivered urgent messages under fire with promptitude and despatch.
7434	Private ...	Saunders, G. ...	1st Battalion, Lincolnshire Regiment	For gallantry on 1st November at Wychaete, in volunteering to take a message from firing line under heavy fire, he was twice wounded, but got through with message.
9739	Private ...	Seager, T. H. ...	1st Battalion, The King's Royal Rifle Corps	For conspicuously good work on 30th September in carrying messages under rifle and shell fire, and for good work of a similar nature on several previous occasions.
8078	Corporal ...	Shepherd, G. F. ...	15th Hussars ...	For bravery and coolness in assisting to get the remnant of the Royal Munster Fusiliers into safety at Bergues on 27th August.
357	Serjeant-Major	Shergold, C. ... (Now Temporary 2nd Lieutenant)	Royal Canadian Engineers	For exceptional coolness and resource under a heavy shell fire at Tour de Passy, on 18th September.
1740	Private ...	Simkins, G. L. ...	12th Lancers ...	For coolness, gallantry and exceptionally good work during the operations of 23rd October to 4th November, near Messines.
6871	Private ...	Simmonds, W. A. ...	2nd Battalion, South Staffordshire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry on 7th October in locating the enemy's trench by daring scouting at night, and subsequently rushing it with two sections, driving the enemy away.
7435	Company Serjeant-Major	Smith, G. ...	1st Battalion, Royal Berkshire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry during attack on German position at Paschendaël-Becelaere - road, which resulted in taking enemy's trenches and 70 prisoners.
29520	Serjeant ...	Spain, G. T. ...	"F" Battery, Royal Horse Artillery	For conspicuous gallantry during the attack on 23rd October, in working, and later commanding a single gun with great effect, in support of Gordon Highlanders.
8473	Serjeant ...	Squires, J. ...	1st Battalion, Northumberland Fusiliers	For coolness and gallant leading under close machine gun fire north of Vailly on 14th September.
5071	Private ...	Stock, E. D. ...	2nd Battalion, Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry	Very good work as stretcher-bearer under heavy fire throughout the night operations on 23rd October.
4656	Acting Serjeant-Trumpeter	Stone, A. ...	12th Lancers ...	For coolness, gallantry and exceptionally good work during the operations of 23rd October to 4th November, near Messines.
8200	Private ...	Stroulger, E. ...	1st Battalion, Lincolnshire Regiment	At Le Cateau he gallantly drove machine gun limber under heavy fire, and picked up 3 wounded men.
8746	Serjeant ...	Stuart, A. ...	2nd Battalion, Yorkshire Regiment	For gallantry on 20th October, in going back to inform Royal Artillery as to shell direction, and on the same night attacked single-handed three German snipers, killing one and capturing two.
