In sub-section (5) of section 1, for the words "seventeen of the Summary Jurisdiction Act, 1879," there shall be read "twenty of the Petty Sessions and Summary Jurisdiction Act, 1900," and for the words "in England to a Court of Quarter Sessions" to the end of such sub-section there shall be read "to the Staff of Government Division of the High Court of Justice in manner provided by section fourteen of the Petty Sessions Act, 1864." For sub-section (2) of section 2 the following provision shall be substituted:-

"The Defence of the Realm Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (No. 2) Act, 1914, made applicable to the Isle of Man by Order in Council dated the 9th September, 1914, are, so far as they apply to the said Isle, hereby repealed."

All that portion of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mary, Cloughton, in the County of York, and in the Diocese of York, which is bounded upon the east, upon the north-east and upon the north by the sea, upon the west partly by the Parish of Fylingdales and partly by the Parish of Hackness, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the boundary stone on Hardhurst Moor where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hackness from the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Cloughton, meets the boundary of the Civil Parish of Cloughton, and extending thence north-eastward along the said Civil Parish boundary for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the south-western side of the road leading from Whitby to Scarborough, and extending thence north-eastward in a straight line (thereby crossing the said road) for a distance of fifteen chains or thereabouts to the centre of Wash Beck Ford where the footpath leading from Way Side Farm House to Staintondale crosses the stream known as Thorny Beck, which here forms the boundary which divides the Civil Parish of Cloughton from the Civil Parish of Staintondale, and extending thence first south-eastward and then in various directions along the middle of the said stream, which for some distance is known as Hayburn Beck (thereby following the said Civil Parish boundary), to the sea.

"II. And also all that contiguous portion

of the said Parish of Fylingdales which is bounded upon the north-east by the sea, upon the east by the above-described portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mary, Cloughton, upon the south-east partly by the said portion of the last-mentioned Parish and partly by the said Parish of Hackness, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the southwest and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hackness from the said Parish of Fylingdales at the centre of Helwath Bridge which carries the road leading from Scarborough to Whitby across the stream known as Helwath Beck, and extending thence first north-westward, then westward, and then again north-westward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of two miles and thirty-three chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading past the house known as Kale Croft to the houses attached to South House Farm and Mill Beck Farm, and extending thence first north-eastward, then and then again north-eastward eastward, along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of two miles and a half or thereabouts to its junction with Stoupe Bank Lane and the road called Mill Bank, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Mill Bank for a distance of twenty-two chains or thereabouts to its north-eastern end on the shore at Boggle Hole, and extending thence in a straight line due east (thereby crossing the rocks known as High Scar and Low Scar) to

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Magdalen College, Oxford, on the 4th day of November, 1914, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford. duly made at a General Meeting of the President and Fellows especially summoned for this purpose on the 4th day of November, 1914, and passed at that Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

STATUTE for Magdalen College, made by the College under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

PENSIONS.

1. Pensions shall be granted to Tutors, Lecturers, and Bursars of the College, upon their retirement, subject to the following conditions:—

(a) No person shall be qualified for a pension who shall not have completed the forty-

fifth year of his age.

(b) No person shall be qualified for a pension unless the number of the years of his age and the number of the years of his period of service to the College as Tutor, Lecturer, or Bursar shall, taken together, be sixty-five or more.

(c) No persion shall exceed the sum of

£400 a year.

- (d) No pension shall exceed a sum equal to one-fortieth part of the maximum yearly stipend which shall have been received at any time by the person to whom it is granted during his period of service multiplied by the number of the years of the period of service.
- (e) All pensions hereafter allowed to Tutors or Lecturers who have not served the College as Bursar shall be provided by the Tutorial Pension Fund hereinafter mentioned.
- (f) All pensions hereafter allowed to Bursars who have not served the College as Tutor or Lecturer shall be payable out of the corporate revenue of the College, and shall not be charged upon the Tutorial Pension Fund.
- (g) If the service by which any person is qualified for a pension has been rendered by him partly as Tutor or Lecturer and partly as Bursar, the sum allowed as pension for such service shall be provided in part by the Tutorial Pension Fund and in part out of the corporate revenue of the College. The proportion of the two parts of such pension shall be determined by the ratio between the total amount of the yearly stipends received by the pensioner as Tutor or Lecturer of the College and the total amount of the yearly stipends received by him as Bursar during his whole period of service.
- (h) If any person to whom a pension shall have been granted shall at the date of the grant hold or shall thereafter be appointed or elected to any Office in the University, or in any other University, or to any Office or Fellowship with emolument in any College or Public Hall in the University, or in any other University, or to any Office in the service of the Crown. he shall not receive during his tenure of such Office or Fellowship any larger part of the yearly pension allowed to him than such a sum as will together with the emoluments of such Office or Fellowship amount to £1.000 a year, and such part of his pension as shall be in excess of such sum in any year of his tenure of such Office or Fellowship shall return to the Tutorial Pension Fund or to the corporate revenue of the College, or rateably to such fund and revenue, as the case may be.

(i) In the interpretation of this Statute | shall thereupon cease until the ord the term "period of service" shall include | supension is withdrawn or modified.

- any time during which the person concerned shall have acted either as Tutor or as Lecturer or as Bursar of the College, or in more than one of these capacities: and the term "stipend" shall be taken to include any annual remuneration paid to him in respect of his service in one or more of these capacities, and in the case of a Fellow of the College also to include the emoluments of his Fellowship, and in the case of an Official Fellow of the College holding the Office of Tutor or Lecturer also to include the sum of £100 payable to him from the corporate revenue of the College: provided that in any case where a distinction has to be made between the stipend received by any person as Tutor or Lecturer and that received by him as Bursar the emoluments of any Official Fellowship so held by him shall be reckoned as part of the stipend of that Office in respect of which he was elected to such Official Fellowship, and the emoluments of any other Fellowship in the College held by him shall be deemed to be equally divided between the remaining two portions of his total stipend.
- 2. A pension may be granted to any Tutor, Lecturer, or Bursar of the College, who is compelled by ill-health or other infirmity to retire from the service of the College before the date at which he would have become qualified for a pension under the last preceding clause, provided that
 - (a) Such pension shall not in any case exceed the sum of £200 a year.
 - (b) In determining the amount of such pension the President and Fellows shall take account of the special circumstances of the case, and of the length of the period of service of the person to whom it is granted.
- 3. For the provision of pensions for the Tutors and Lecturers of the College there shall be a Tutorial Pension Fund to which shall be transferred upon the approval of this Statute by His Majesty the King in Council the whole capital of the Pension Fund established and maintained under the Statute of 1881 as to Pensions and under the subsequent Statutes of 1888, 1899, and 1910, together with other sums standing to the credit of that Fund. Ten per cent. shall be deducted from the yearly income of the Tuition Fund and contributed to the Tutorial Pension Fund, and there shall also be paid to the Tutorial Pension Fund a yearly contribution of not less than £500 nor more than £700 from the corporate revenue of the College. The President and Fellows may further contribute to the Tutorial Pension Fund from surplus revenue such annual or other sums as may be allowed or directed to be so applied under any scheme for the disposal of surplus revenue sanctioned by the Visitor of the College under the provisions of Statute XIV. clause 3 of the Statutes of 1881 and in force for the time being
- 4. If at any time it shall be the case that the Tutorial Pension Fund amounts to a sum sufficient to meet all existing claims for pensions and to provide for all such as are likely to arise, the Visitor may order the partial or total suspension of the payment of any contribution to the Fund from corporate revenue or from the Tuition Fund, and such payment shall thereupon cease until the order for its supension is withdrawn or modified.

- 5. In the administration of the Tutorial Pension Fund the President and Fellows may make provision for pensions for Tutors and Lecturers either by payments from the income of the Fund or by the purchase of immediate or deferred annuities, and may for these purposes enter into agreements with any principal Life Insurance Company incorporated under the laws of the United Kingdom, or with the University, or with any College or Colleges in the University.
- 6. No Tutor or Lecturer of the College shall continue to hold his appointment after the completion of the fifty-seventh year of his age, unless by a resolution of the President and Fellows passed upon the recommendation of the Tutorial Board his tenure is prolonged for a further period. Such further period shall not in any case extend beyond the date at which the Tutor or Lecturer will complete the sixtieth year of his age, and shall not, except by special resolution of the President and Fellows, be reckoned as part of his period of service for the purpose of computing the amount of his pension.
- 7. The President and Fellows may by resotion passed at an Extraordinary General Meeting (but in the case of a Tutor or Lecturer only upon the recommendation of the Tutorial Board) enforce the retirement of any Tutor, Lecturer, or Bursar of the College. Such resolution shall not affect any claim to a pension which may have been acquired by such Tutor, Lecturer, or Bursar, unless the resolution shall have been passed in consequence of neglect of duty or misconduct on his part, in which case it shall be at the absolute discretion of the President and Fellows to allow or to refuse a pension, or to reduce the amount of any pension to which he would otherwise have been entitled at the date of his retirement.
- 8. Subject to the conditions contained in this Statute the President and Fellows may by bye-laws passed at a stated General Meeting prescribe a scale of pensions for Tutors and Lecturers of the College, and may in like manner provide that every Tutor or Lecturer qualified for a pension under this Statute shall upon his retirement be entitled to a pension of the amount appropriate to his case according to such scale, and may from time to time vary or rescind any such bye-laws.
- 9. All pensions which have been granted to Tutors or Lecturers of the College before the date of the approval of this Statute by His Majesty the King in Council, and which at that date are a charge upon the Pension Fund, shall upon the approval of this Statute as aforesaid become a charge on the Tutorial Pension Fund, and shall be provided by means of that Fund in the same manner as pensions which may hereafter be granted to Tutors or Lecturers under the provisions of this Statute.
- 10. Any pension which has been granted to a Bursar of the College before the date of the approval of this Statute by His Majesty the King in Council, and which at that date is a charge upon the Pension Fund, shall upon the approval of this Statute as aforesaid become a charge on the corporate revenue of the College.

11. The Statutes of 1888, 1899, and 1910 as to Pensions are hereby repealed.

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of Trinity College, Cambridge, which amending Statutes were duly made at a College Meeting, being a Meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for this purpose, and held on the 28th day of November, 1914, and having been passed at such Meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Master, Fellows, and Scholars of Trinity College, in the University of Cambridge, in exercise of the powers given to us by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do hereby alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College in the manner following:—

By adding to Statute X intituled "The Fellows" the following Section to form Section 7 of the same Statute:—

"7. The Council shall have power by a resolution passed within six calendar months after the approval of this Statute by His Majesty in Council to suspend temporarily all or any of the provisions in the Statutes of the College contained relating to the annual election of Fellows (including those relating to the computation of vacancies, the suspension of fellowships, the provision of temporary additional fellowships, and the persons eligible). Such suspension may be terminated either by a resolution of the Council or by a resolution carried at a College Meeting by a majority of those present and voting on the question, and shall continue until it is so terminated. During the period of such suspension the Council shall have power to make and from time to time to alter and amend regulations to take the place of the provisions so suspended, and the election of Fellows under title (a) shall take place either annually or otherwise under such regulations. Provided always that nothing herein contained shall extend so as to enable the Council to alter the tenure or the value of any fellowship.

By repealing Section 4 of Statute XLVIII intituled "Accounts and Audit," and substituting therefor the following Section to form an amended Section 4 of the same Statute:—

"4. All the accounts of the College shall be audited every year. For this purpose the Council shall in each year appoint an

Auditor, not being the Master or a Fellow or Officer of the College, and shall pay to him such a stipend as they shall determine, and they shall also appoint from the Fellows of the College one or more Assessors to whom they may assign such reasonable remuneration as they shall think fit. The Auditor shall examine and verify all the said accounts and the vouchers thereof, and shall ascertain the balance on each account and compare the same with the respective balances as shewn by the books of the College The Assessors shall attend at such part of the annual audit as the Council shall from time to time direct, and shall report to the Council on such matters conwith the College accounts and finances as are referred to them and such other matters (if any) connected therewith as they may consider desirable. The conclusion of the audit and final passing of the accounts shall take place in the presence of the Council and of such Fellows as may choose to attend. The Auditor shall pass the several accounts by signing the same or shall state in writing to the Council his reasons for not passing the accounts or any of them, and such statement (if any) shall be communicated to all the Fellows.

By repealing Section 12 of Statute XLIX intituled "Distribution of Revenues," and substituting therefor the following Section to form an amended Section 12 of the same

Statute:

"12. The Council shall fix for the year the amount being not more than two hundred and fifty pounds (£250) free of income tax to be called a modulus. And there shall be paid to each Fellow (not being a Supernumerary Fellow) his proper dividend fixed as hereinafter mentioned by reference to the amount of the modulus.

To alter and amend the Statutes of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity, in the University of Cambridge, such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College or Hall (specially summoned for this purpose, and held on the 5th day of December, 1914,) and passed at such Meeting by the votes of all persons present and voting, and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Master, Fellows, and Scholars of the College or Hall of the Holy Trinity, in the University of Cambridge, do hereby, in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College or Hall in the

following manner: By repealing Statute I., intituled "Constitution of the College," and substituting therefor the following Statute to form an amended Statute I.

CONSTITUTION OF THE COLLEGE. STATUTE I.

"The Foundation shall consist of a Master, eleven Fellows at least, and such number of Scholars as the Governing Body may from time All other persons who to time determine. shall have been duly admitted Members of the College shall be Members not on the Founda-

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of

Trade to the following effect:—
That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of November, 1914, should be amended by making the following additions to and alterations in the same:-

(1) That the heading "Picric Acid and its components" should be deleted from the list of articles prohibited to be exported to all foreign ports in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than those of France, Russia (except Baltic ports), Belgium, Spain, and Portugal.

(2) That the export of the following articles be prohibited to all destinations:

Aniline Oil. Aniline Salt.

Picric Acid and its components.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

And whereas by the twenty-sixth Article of the said Charter of Incorporation it is provided that Bye-laws made by the said Institute shall not have effect until they have been submitted to and allowed by the Lords of the Council:

And whereas the said new Bye-laws so made by the Institute as aforesaid have been submitted to the Lords of the Council:

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said new Bye-laws (a copy whereof is hereunto annexed) into consideration, are pleased to allow the same.

BYE-LAWS REFERRED TO IN THE FOREGOING ORDER OF COUNCIL.

THE INSTITUTE OF CHARTERED ACCOUNTANTS IN ENGLAND AND WALES.

Bye-law 34a.

34A.—The Council may at a meeting convened as prescribed by Section 14 of the Royal Charter and in exercise of the powers thereby conferred elect as an Associate any candidate for admission who has served, or is serving in His Majesty's Forces during war; provided such candidate shall have complied with the provisions of the Royal Charter and these Byelaws relating to service under Articles and Examinations which are applicable in his case, with such exceptions therefrom and modifications thereof as the Council may by a Resolution passed under the provisions of this Byelaw have made in his favour.

The Council may by a Resolution passed at a meeting specially convened with notice of the object, at which meeting there shall be present not less than twenty-four of the Members of the Council, and for which Resolution not less than three-fourths of those present and voting shall vote, make in the case of any person who purposes to become a candidate for admission who has served, or is serving, in His Majesty's Forces during war such exceptions from or modifications in the provisions of the Royal Charter and these Bye-laws relating to service under Articles and Examinations as are below referred to and as may to them seem reasonable in the circumstances of his case, that is to say

(a) That the candidate shall be exempt from the Preliminary Examination.

(b) That any period of service by the candidate in His Majesty's Forces after the date

of his Articles or any specified portion of such period shall be deemed equivalent to service under his Articles.

(c) That the candidate shall be exempt from the Intermediate Examination.

(d) That the candidate may sit for any examination at any time specified by the Council, although not otherwise qualified to sit at that time.

(e) That the Certificate of service required by Bye-laws 82 and 87 or either of them be modified as the circumstances of the case

require.

(f) That the candidate's period of service in His Majesty's Forces during war be proved by the Certificate of the candidate's superior officer or otherwise to the satisfaction of the Council.

Any of the aforesaid exceptions or modifications in favour of a candidate may be made in the manner aforesaid from time to time as the occasion for each such exception or modification arises, and without prejudice to the power of the Council to make further exceptions or modifications as are above referred to in favour of the same candidate at a later stage in his candidature.

Bye-law to be substituted for the existing Bye-law numbered 74.

74.—Every person desirous of becoming an Articled Clerk shall, before he be articled, pass a Preliminary Examination to test his general education; save that the following persons shall be entitled to exemption from such examination:—

1.—Graduates of any University in the

United Kingdom.

2.—Any person who has passed the Responsions Examination or the Moderations Examination of the University of Oxford, or the Previous Examination, or the General Examination of the University of Cambridge.

3.—Any person who has passed the Matriculation Examination of one of the following Universities, viz., Birmingham, Bristol, Durham, London, or Wales; or has passed the Examination of the Joint Matriculation Board of the Universities of Manchester, Liverpool, Leeds, and Sheffield; provided that such person has passed in English, Mathematics, and two of the optional subjects under Bye-law 77, one of which at least must be a language.

4.—Any person who has passed in the same subjects as those required for the Preliminary Examination under Bye-law 77, one of the

following Examinations:-

(a) The Oxford or Cambridge Senior Local Examination.

(b) The Higher Certificate Examination of the Oxford and Cambridge Schools Examination Foard.

(c) The Senior or Honours Certificate Examinations of the Central Welsh Board

(d) The Examinations held by the Civ Service Commissioners for First Cla Clerkships in the Home Civil Service, on the India Civil Service; the Examinations for admission to the Royal Military College at Sandhurst or the Royal Military Academy at Woolwich.

Provided, nevertheless, that if any person seeking exemption under paragraphs 3 and 4 has not passed in all the subjects required, it shall be lawful for the Council to make such arrangements (including the charging of

fees) as they may see fit for his examination in any subject or subjects in which he has not been examined, such examination to be either one held by one of the examining subsequent Preliminary bodies, \mathbf{or} a Examination of the Institute. Provided also that the Council shall determine whether any of the subjects required may be considered to be included in or to find their equivalents in any subjects in which any person has passed in the examination of one of the examining bodies.

Any person, upon satisfying the Council that he has graduated in any of the above Universities, or passed any of the above examinations in accordance with the above conditions, shall be entitled to receive a certificate to the effect that he is exempt from passing the Preliminary Examination of the Institute, upon payment of such fee, not exceeding one guinea, as the Council shall from time to time determine.

The Council may, by a resolution passed at a Meeting specially convened for that purpose, with notice of the object, at which Meeting there shall be present not less than twelve of the Members of the Council, and for which resolution not less than three-fourths of those present, and voting, shall vote, resolve

(a) That any one or more of the examina-

longer entitle to exemption from the Preliminary Examination; or

(b) That, subject to such conditions as the Council may determine, any other examinations besides those set forth in this Bye-law shall entitle to exemption from the Preliminary Examination.

The Council may, by a resolution passed at a Meeting specially convened, with notice of the object, at which Meeting there shall be present not less than twenty-four Members of the Council, and for which resolution not less than three-fourths of those present and voting shall vote, resolve that any person, not being under thirty-five years of age, who at the date of his application shall have been for ten years continuously in service as a clerk to a Chartered Accountant, shall be exempted

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 16TH DECEMBER 1914.)

BEDFORDSHIRE AND DISTRICT. (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

- 1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.
- (2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Power to restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

- 2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—
 - (i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

- (ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.
- (2.) Copies of such notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions hereby imposed.
- (3.) A copy of every such notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, 4, Whitehall-place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- 4.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- (2.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

5. This Order may be cited as the Bedford-SHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DIS-EASE) ORDER OF 1914.

Alterations in positions or withdrawal of Light-vessels and Buoys; Extinction of Lights and lights of Light-buoys; Alteration or discontinuance of Fog-signals; Information re Pilotage.

Former Notices.—Nos. 1528, 1690 and 1795 of 1914 hereby cancelled.

- 1. Until further notice, in the English Channel and the Downs eastward of a line joining Selsea Bill and Cape Barfleur and to the southward of the parallel of 51° 20′ North latitude, all Light-vessels and buoys are liable to withdrawal or alteration in position, all Lights and the lights of Light-buoys are liable to be extinguished and the Fog-signals to be altered or discontinued.
- 2. Trinity House Pilot Stations have been established at the undermentioned places, and merchant vessels are very strongly advised to take pilots, as navigation in the area in question will be exceedingly dangerous without their aid:—
 - (a) St. Helens, Isle of Wight, where ships proceeding up Channel can obtain pilots capable of piloting as far as Great Yarmouth; and also pilots for the River Thames.
 - (b) GREAT YARMOUTH, where ships from the North Sea bound for the River Thames or the English Channel can obtain pilots capable of piloting as far as the Isle of Wight.
 - (c) Dover, where ships from Dover and also French Channel ports, but no others,

can obtain pilots for the English Channel and North Sea (including the River Thames and approaches).

- (d) THE SUNK LIGHT-VESSEL, where ships crossing the North Sea between the parallels of 51° 40′ and 51° 54′ North Latitude, but no others, can obtain pilots for the River Thames and the English Channel.
- (e) Pilots can also be obtained at London and Harwich for the English Channel and North Sea (including the River Thames and approaches).
- 3. RIVER THAMES. All traffic into and out of the River Thames must pass through the Edinburgh Channels, or through the Black Deep south of the Knock John and Knob Light-buoys, and through the Oaze Deep, until further notice.

No vessels are to remain under way in the above-mentioned Channels inside the Sunk Head Light-buoy, or within a line joining the positions of the South Long Sand and East Shingles buoys, between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

Vessels at anchor within these limits must not exhibit any lights between the hours of 7 p.m. and 6 a.m.

All other channels are closed to navigation.

Note.—The pilot station in the vicinity of the Tongue Light-vessel has been discontinued.
