ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 23RD DECEMBER 1914.)

BEDFORDSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Modification of Order.

1. The Bedfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914 is modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Movement into the Zone for Immediate Slaughter.

2.—(1.) An animal may, subject as herein-after provided, be moved by railway without a licence from premises not situate within the Scheduled District to a railway station situate within the Zone described in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the Zone"); and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughterhouse situate within the Zone if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted
