REGULATIONS.

In the exercise of the powers conferred on me by the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), I, the Right Honourable Reginald McKenna, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, make the following Regulations:—

Form of Certificate of Naturalization in the United Kingdom.

1. A certificate of naturalization granted in the United Kingdom shall, save as otherwise hereinafter prescribed, be in one of the following forms:—

(A) *Where the names of children are not included.*

Whereas *A.B.* has applied for a certificate of naturalization, alleging with respect to himself [herself] the particulars set out below, and has satisfied me that the conditions laid down in the above-mentioned Act for the grant of a certificate of naturalization are fulfilled in his [her] case:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by the said Act, I grant to the said *A.B.* this certificate of naturalization, and

declare that upon taking the oath of allegiance within the time and in the manner required by the regulations made in that behalf he [she] shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be entitled to all political and other rights, powers and privileges, and be subject to all obligations, duties and liabilities, to which a natural-born British subject is entitled or subject, and have to all intents and purposes the status of a natural-born British subject.

(2) Every certificate of naturalization granted in a British Possession, other than British India or a Dominion specified in the First Schedule to the Act, and every oath of

allegiance relating to any such certificate, shall be registered both in London at the Home Office and in the Possession at such place as the Governor of the Possession may direct.

Registration of Declarations.

10.—(1) Every declaration of alienage and declaration of retention or resumption of British nationality, wherever made, shall be registered in London at the Home Office.

(2) Every such declaration made in a British Possession, other than British India or a Dominion specified in the First Schedule to the Act, shall also be registered at such place in the Possession as the Governor of the Possession may direct.

Oath of Allegiance.

11.—(1) The following persons may administer the oath of allegiance:—

In England or Ireland—

Any justice of the peace or any commissioner authorized to administer oaths in the Supreme Court.

In Scotland—

Any sheriff, sheriff-substitute, or justice of the peace.

In a British Possession—

Any judge of any court of civil or criminal jurisdiction, any justice of the peace, or any officer for the time being authorized by law, in the place in which deponent is, to administer an oath for any judicial or other legal purpose.

In any British Protectorate or British protected state—

Any officer for the time being authorized by law in that territory to administer an oath for any judicial or other legal purpose.

Elsewhere—

Any officer in the diplomatic or consular service of His Majesty.

(2) The oath of allegiance shall be subscribed as well as taken, and the form in which the oath of allegiance is subscribed and attested shall be as follows:—

I, A.B., swear by Almighty God that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty, King George the Fifth, His Heirs and Successors, according to law.

(3) The oath of allegiance sworn, subscribed

(4) The oath of allegiance may be proved in any legal proceedings by the production of the original certificate or any copy thereof certified to be a true copy by the Secretary of State or by any person authorized by him in that behalf or, where the oath has been administered in a British Possession, by the Governor of the Possession.

Time within which Oath of Allegiance to be taken.

12. The oath of allegiance shall be taken within one calendar month after the date of the certificate of naturalization to which it relates, or, in any case where the Secretary of

State grants an extension of time, within such extended time as the Secretary of State may direct, and if the oath is not so taken the certificate shall be void.

Persons before whom Declarations may be made.

13. The persons before whom declarations of alienage and declarations of resumption or retention of British nationality may be made, shall be the same as the persons by whom the oath of allegiance may be administered.

Fees.

14. The following fees, to which the consent of the Treasury has been obtained, may be taken and shall be applied in the manner hereinafter shown; but this regulation shall not be in force in any British Possession.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 31ST DECEMBER 1914.)

BEDFORDSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 3).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Orders.

1. The Bedfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," and the Bedfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914 (No. 2), hereinafter referred to as Order (No. 2), are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Contraction of Limits of Scheduled District.

2. The restrictions on movement of animals contained in the above-mentioned Orders shall apply only to the Zone I and the Zone II described in the Schedule hereto, which together shall be the Scheduled District for the purposes of those Orders instead of the Scheduled District therein referred to.

*Continued Prohibition of Movement in Zone I:
Special Provision for Movement into Borough
of Bedford for Slaughter.*

3.—(1.) The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall apply to the Zone I described in the Schedule hereto, subject to the following modifications.

(2.) An animal may be moved without a licence by railway from premises not situate within the Scheduled District to a railway station within the borough of Bedford; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughterhouse situate within the borough if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough.

(3.) An animal may also be moved from any premises situate within the Zone II described in the Schedule hereto to any slaughterhouse situate within the borough of Bedford if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough; provided that the movement from the Zone into the borough shall be effected by railway.

Movement into and within Zone II.

4. The provisions of Order (No. 2) applicable to the Zone described in the First Schedule thereto shall cease to apply to that Zone, and shall apply to the Zone II described in the Schedule hereto.

General Provisions as to Movement.

5. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Provision as to Licences.

6. Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

*Movement of Animals through Zones
by Railway.*

7. For the purposes of this Order an animal shall not be deemed to be moved into or out of a Zone where it is moved through such Zone by railway from a place outside such Zone to another place outside such Zone without unnecessary delay and without the animal being untrucked within such Zone except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animal within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

Provisions as to Farms on borders of Zones.

8. If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without a Zone, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Zone, and where the farm extends to two Zones

the whole shall be deemed to be in the inner-Zone.

Commencement.

9. This Order shall come into operation on the second day of January, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

Short Title, &c.

10. This Order may be cited as the BEDFORDSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1914 (No. 3), and shall be read with the principal Order and Order (No. 2).
