(2) That the exportation of:-

Fish (whale) oil, viz., train, blubber, sperm or head matter,

should be prohibited to all destinations' abroad.

Now, THEREFORE, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and

govern themselves accordingly.
