

NATIONAL INSURANCE ACT, 1911.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Insurance Commissioners (England), after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by sections 42 (c) and 65 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, to make regulations as to the sums payable in the year 1915 in respect of the Administration Expenses of Deposit Contributors.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Wales) (Registration of Branches) Order, 1914 (No. 2), dated December 31st, 1914, made by the Welsh Insurance Commissioners under Sections 78 and 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 and 2 Geo. V, ch. 55).

Whereas by the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Registration of Branches) Order, 1914, made by the Welsh Insurance Commissioners (in this Order called "the Commissioners") under sections 78 and 82 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), for the reasons more particularly specified in the recitals to the said Order, it was provided that where a branch of such Societies as are therein mentioned in respect of which separate accounts have been kept before the date of the said Order has applied or has given notice to the Commissioners of its intention to apply, under the Friendly Societies Act, 1896, to be separately registered and has or may become so registered before the 31st day of December, 1914, it shall

for the purposes of the Act be deemed to have been a registered branch from the date when it commenced to transact business under the Act as a branch of a Society:

And whereas it has been represented to the Commissioners by certain Approved Societies and by the Chief Registrar of Friendly Societies that it will not be possible for certain branches of Approved Societies to whom the said Order is intended to apply to comply with the requirements of the Friendly Societies Act, 1896, with regard to the registration of branches and to be or become registered before the date aforesaid and the Commissioners are satisfied that a difficulty has thereby arisen within the meaning of the said section 78:

And whereas by sub-section (1) of section 40 of the National Insurance Act, 1913, it is provided that any Order or Special Order made under the Principal Act may be revoked, varied or amended by an Order or Special Order made in like manner as the original Order:

Now, therefore, the Commissioners, in virtue of the powers conferred on them by sections 78 and 82 of the Act and by sub-section (1) of section 40 of the National Insurance Act, 1913, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Registration of Branches) Order, 1914 (No. 2), and shall be read as one with the National Health Insurance (Wales) (Registration of Branches) Order, 1914 (in this Order called "the Principal Order").

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 1 of the Principal Order, the branches of the Societies specified in the Schedule to this Order, being branches in respect of which separate accounts have been kept of Societies which have in accordance with section 27 of the Act made provision by Rules with respect to the matters for which provision is required by that section to be made by a Society with branches, and which have before the date of this Order applied or given notice to the Commissioners of their intention to apply under the Friendly Societies Act, 1896, to be separately registered, shall, for the purposes of the Act, be deemed to have become registered branches on the dates on which they severally commenced to transact business under Part I of the Act as branches of Approved Societies, and the provisions of the Act relating to branches of Approved Societies shall apply accordingly.
