Whereas the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Sheffield (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said City, have made application to the Local Government Board for the issue of a Provisional Order, under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, to partially repeal, alter, or amend the Sheffield Corporation Act, 1890, the Sheffield Electric Lighting (Transfer) Act, 1898, and the Sheffield Corporation Act, 1900, as amended by the Sheffield Order (No. 2), 1902, which was confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 9) Act, 1902, so as:—

(1) To enable the Corporation to provide in connection with new offices for the Electric Supply Department proposed to be erected on certain surplus lands situate in Bow Street, in the City, buildings with all necessary accessories or conveniences for use by the Corporation, their lessees and tenants as shops; and to borrow moneys for the purpose;

(2) To authorise the Corporation to contribute towards the expenses of Private Street Works executed under the provisions of section 150 of the Public Health Act, 1875; and

(3) For the several purposes of the application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Acts, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, in force in the said City as may be necessary or desirable;

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said application;

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 2ND JANUARY 1915.)

WART DISEASE OF POTATOES (INFECTED AREA).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:

Extension of Limits of Wart Disease of Potatoes Infected Area.

1. The limits of the Wart Disease of Potatoes Infected Area declared by Order of the Board dated the twentieth day of February, nineteen hundred and fourteen, are hereby extended so as to comprise the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area so described is hereby declared to be an Infected Area for the purposes of the Wart Disease of Potatoes (Infected Areas) Order of 1914.

Commencement.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and fifteen.
