ORDER OF THE BOARD OF

(DATED 2ND JANUARY 1915.)

WART DISEASE OF POTATOES  
(INFECTED AREA).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

*Declaration of Wart Disease of Potatoes  
(Infected Area).*

1. The area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be infected with Wart Disease, and an Infected Area for the purposes of the Wart Disease of Potatoes (Infected Areas) Order of 1914.

*Notification of Disease.*

2. Reports of the existence of Wart Disease within the Infected Area shall be made to the Board, or to Mr. Aaron Potton, Main Road, Nuncar Gate, Nottingham.

*Commencement.*

3. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL  
IN ENGLAND.

(Dated January 2nd, 1915.)

Whereas by the 21st Section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient (1) in order that the Municipal Borough of Doncaster may by itself constitute a separate Registration Sub-district, that the part of that Borough and Parish which, prior to the 9th November last, the date when the Doncaster (Extension) Order, 1914, took effect, constituted the Urban District and Parish of Balby with Hexthorpe, should be transferred from Tickhill Sub-district of Doncaster Registration District to Doncaster Sub-district of the same Registration District; and (2) that Tickhill Sub-district as thus reduced should be united with Bawtry Sub-district of the same Registration District, and that the enlarged Sub-district should be called and known as Bawtry and Tickhill Sub-district;

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the eleventh day of January, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT  
ACT, 1907.

ULVERSTON URBAN DISTRICT.

NOTICE is hereby given, that by an Order dated the 16th day of December, 1914, the Local Government Board have confirmed an Order made on the third day of November, 1914, by the Urban District Council of Ulverston, in pursuance of section 112 of the Public Health Act, 1875, as amended by section 51 of the Public Health Acts Amendment Act, 1907, declaring each of the trades of a Blood-drier, a Tanner, a Leather-dresser, a Fat-melter or Fat-extractor, a Glue-maker, a Size-maker, a Gut-scraper, a Rag and Bone Dealer, and a Fish-fryer within the Urban District of Ulverston to be an offensive trade.
