

them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Modification of Orders.

1. The Bedfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the Bedfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1914 (Nos. 2 and 3), are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Parts of Zone I.

2. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall apply without modification to the Area described in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as the Prohibited Parts).

Movement into and within Zone I (except the Prohibited Parts).

3.—(1.) The provisions which were applied by Order (No. 3) to Zone II shall apply to Zone I (except the Prohibited Parts), except that for the purpose of movement into Zone I (except the Prohibited Parts) Zone II shall be treated as if it were not in the Scheduled District.

(2.) Article 3 of Order (No. 3) is hereby revoked.

*Free Movement into and within Zone II.
Movement out of Zone II into Zone I.*

4.—(1.) The restrictions on movement of animals imposed by the Orders referred to in Article 1 shall not apply to any movement of animals—

(a) within Zone II; or

(b) into Zone II from premises situate outside the Scheduled District.

(2.) No animal shall be moved out of Zone II except for the purpose of movement into Zone I (except the Prohibited Parts) under and in accordance with the provisions of Article 3 of this Order.

Holding of Markets and Sales in Zone II.

5.—(1.) A market or sale of animals may be held on any premises in Zone II if the Local Authority are satisfied that the market or sale will be restricted to animals intended for immediate slaughter and the market or sale is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article.

(2.) The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend at every market or sale authorised under this Article and examine the animals exposed thereat.

(3.) An animal exposed at a market or sale authorised under this Article shall not be moved therefrom unless before such movement it is marked, by and at the expense of the owner, in the manner described in Article 5 of Order (No. 2).

Commencement.

6. This Order shall come into operation on the ninth day of January, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

Short Title, etc.

7. This Order may be cited as the BEDFORDSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH

DISEASE) ORDER OF 1915, and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 1.

SCHEDULE.

Prohibited Parts of Zone I.

An Area comprising such portions of the parishes of Goldington, Eastcotts, Cardington, Cople, Willington, Moggerhanger, and Northill, in the administrative county of Bedford as lie within the following boundary, but excluding any road, lane, river, stream, or drain which forms part of such boundary.

Commencing at the point of junction with the main road from Bedford to Cardington and the road from Fenlake to Cotton End at the village of Fenlake, and proceeding in a southerly direction along the latter road (via Harrowden and Tinker's Hill) to the Bell Inn at Cotton End; thence in a southerly and easterly direction along the occupation road leading to Exeterwood Farm to the footpath leading to Park-lane; thence in an easterly direction along that footpath to the western boundary of the Midland Railway; thence in a south-easterly direction along that boundary to the southern boundary of the parish of Cardington; thence in a north-easterly direction along that parish boundary and the southern boundary of the parish of Cople to the main road from Cople to Northill at Mox Hill; thence in a south-easterly direction along that road to the cross roads at Deadman's Oak; thence in a north-easterly direction along the main road leading from Deadman's Oak to Moggerhanger to the north-east corner of Sheerhatch Wood; thence in a north-westerly direction along the northern boundary of Sheerhatch Wood and the road leading to Willington to the Methodist Chapel at Willington; thence in an easterly direction along the road and footpath leading to the Lock on the River Ouse north of Mill Farm to the southern bank of that river; thence in a westerly direction following the course of the River Ouse to the London and North-Western railway bridge at the eastern end of the New Cut; thence in a westerly direction along the southern boundary of the London and North-Western Railway to the railway bridge west of the Newnham Swimming Baths; thence in a south-easterly direction along the River Ouse to the stream or ditch at the rear of the Chapel and houses in the main road from Bedford to Cardington at Fenlake; thence in a westerly direction along the said stream or ditch to the western boundary fence of the aforesaid chapel and
