At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 7th day of January, 1915.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS it is enacted by the County Courts Act, 1888, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council from time to time to order, amongst other things, the consolidation of any two or more Districts, and to order by what name and in what towns and places a Court shall be held in any District:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the District of the County Court of Kent held at Hythe and the District of the County Court of Kent held at New Romney shall be consolidated under the name of the County Court of Kent held at Hythe and New Romney, and a Court shall be held in that District at Hythe, and New Romney.

This Order shall have effect as from the 1st day of January, 1915.

W HEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means, His Majesty the King has power, jurisdiction, and authority, within the territory known as Swaziland:

And whereas the Swaziland Crown Lands and Minerals Order in Council, 1908, as amended by the Swaziland Crown Lands and Minerals Amendment Order in Council, 1910, vested as Crown Lands in His Majesty's High Commissioner for South Africa on behalf of His Majesty such lands in the said territory as should not be set apart and demarcated by or on the authority of the High Commissioner for the sole and exclusive occupation of natives of the territory:

And whereas it is expedient to empower the High Commissioner to effect exchanges of
