TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1909.

In accordance with Regulations made under section 18 of the above Act by the Board of Trade and dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act for certain branches of the Tailoring trade in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 10th January, 1914, hereby give notice, as required by section 4 of the above Act, that they propose to vary the minimum time-rates fixed by them on the 19th August, 1912, for female workers other than learners (as defined. by the Trade Board) in those branches of the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring trade in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons as follows, viz.:

(a) For female workers other than homeworkers, from 31d. to 31d. an hour.

(b) For female home-workers, from 31d. to 3½d. an hour.

The Trade Board also give similar notice that they propose to vary the terms of section 3 of their Notice, dated 19th August, 1912, fixing minimum rates for female workers so as to read as follows:

The above rates shall apply to all female workers as specified above who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring trade which is engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons, but they shall not apply to any persons engaged merely as Clerks, Messengers, persons engaged in work ordinarily carried on in the stock-room or warehouse, saleswomen, travellers, packers, parcellers, persons engaged in cleaning pre-mises, or to any other persons whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to

that of the foregoing excluded classes.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above variations which may be lodged with them within three months from the 18th January, 1915. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same, adding full name and address, and should be sent to the Secretary of the Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), Old Serjeants' Inn Chambers, 5, Chancery Lane, London, W.C. It is desirable that the objection should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

In accordance with Regulations made under section 18 of the above Act by the Board of Trade and dated the 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act for certain branches of the Tailoring trade in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 10th January, 1914, hereby give notice, as required by section 4 (2) of the above Act, that they propose to fix the following minimum or lowest time-rates of wages clear of all deductions for female workers in those

branches of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring trade in Great Britain which are engaged in making garments to be worn by male persons, and in which at least three persons or two female persons (in both cases exclusive of cutters and trimmers) are engaged in making one garment, that is to say:

For female workers other than homeworkers, 3½d an hour.

For female home-workers, $3\frac{1}{2}d$. an hour.

NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE.

The National Health Insurance (Deposit Contributors, Adjustment of Accounts) Order, 1914, dated December 31, 1914, made by the Insurance Commissioners' under Section 78 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5, c. 55).

Whereas by paragraph (e) of Section 42 of the National Insurance Act, 1911 (in this Order called "the Act"), it is provided that the sums payable in respect of a deposit contributor for the purposes of medical and sanatorium benefit, and towards the expenses of administration shall be deducted at the commencement of each year from the amount standing to his credit in the Deposit Contributors Fund:

And whereas by sub-section (2) of Section 43 of the Act it is provided that where a deposit contributor becomes a member of an Approved Society, there shall be transferred to the Society the amount standing to his credit in the said Fund, or the value of the contributions paid by or in respect of him, whichever sum shall be the less:

And whereas it will not be practicable to ascertain what amount is standing to the credit of a deposit contributor who becomes a member of an Approved Society as at the date of such transfer, and delay will arise in ascertaining his position in insurance and in the administration of his benefits by his Society:

And whereas under the aforesaid Section 43, where the amount standing to his credit is less than the value of the contributions paid by or in respect of him, it is provided that he should be treated as being in arrear to the amount of the deficiency, and under Section 8 of the National Insurance Act, 1913, it is provided that insured persons in arrear are liable to such deduction, postponement, or suspension of benefits as shall be approximately equivalent to the loss by the failure to pay the contributions in arrear; and it is not practicable to recover such deficiencies as aforesaid otherwise than by way of permanent reduction of benefits, or to express in exact terms of such reduction the amount of the deficiency; and by reason of the premises a difficulty has arisen with regard to deposit contributors who become members of Societies, and in connection with the necessary transfer and adjustments in respect of such persons:

Now, therefore, the Insurance Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by Section 78 of the Act, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, with the consent of the Treasury, hereby order as follows:—

- 1. This Order may be cited as the National Health Insurance (Deposit Contributors, Adjustment of Accounts) Order, 1914.
- 2. For the purpose of ascertaining the amount standing in the Deposit Contributors. Fund to the credit of a deposit contributor who becomes a member of an Approved Society, there shall first be credited to him so much of any sum which has been credited to an Insurance Committee in respect of him for the expenses of medical and sanatorium benefit, and towards the expenses of administration, as the Commissioners may think fit, having regard to the date on which he becomes a member of the Society (hereinafter called "the date of transfer"); and such consequential adjustments shall be made as are appropriate to the case.
- 3.—(1) In the case of a deposit contributor who becomes a member of an Approved Society on or after the 1st day of January, 1915, the balance standing to his credit as at the beginning of the half-year in which he becomes a member of the Society, shall be credited to a Suspense Account to be opened by the Insurance Commissioners in the Deposit Contributors Fund.
- (2) Any contributions paid by or in respect of a deposit contributor for the period from the beginning of the half-year in which he becomes a member of an Approved Society to the date of transfer shall be credited to the Society, and dealt with as if the contributor had been a member of the Society from the beginning of that half-year.
- (3) If the amount standing to the credit of a deposit contributor as at the beginning of the half-year in which he becomes a member of an Approved Society, together with such an amount as the Commissioners may determine to represent the average amount of contributions payable during a period equal to the period from the beginning of the half-year to the date of transfer (hereinafter called the "transfer adjustment"), is equal to or more than the value of the contributions paid by or in respect of him as at the date of transfer, there shall be transferred from the Suspense Account to the Society a sum equal to the value aforesaid after deducting the transfer adjustment, or if the transfer adjustment exceeds the value aforesaid, the excess shall be deducted from the contributions for the halfyear credited to the Society and shall be transferred to the Suspense Account.
- (4) If the amount standing to his credit as at the date aforesaid, together with the transfer adjustment, is less than the value of his contributions at the date of transfer, there shall be transferred from the Suspense Account to the Society—
 - (i) if the deficiency is less than 10s., a sum equal to the value of his contributions after deduction of the transfer adjustment;
 - (ii) if the deficiency is equal to 10s., or an exact multiple of 10s., a sum equal to the amount standing to his credit; and

- (iii) if the deficiency is more than 10s., but is not an exact multiple of 10s., a sum equal to the amount standing to his credit, together with a sum equal to the excess over 10s., or the highest integral multiple of 10s. contained in such deficiency, as the case may be.
- (5) The amount to which the deposit contributor shall be treated as being in arrear shall be the amount by which the value of his contributions as at the date of transfer, after deduction of the transfer adjustment, exceeds the sum transferred to the Society as aforesaid.
- (6) Where a payment has been made to a deposit contributor in respect of any benefit accruing during the half-year in which he becomes a member of an Approved Society, and before he becomes a member of the Society or where a deposit contributor enters into insurance after the beginning of the half-year in which he becomes a member of an Approved Society, the date up to which benefit has been paid or the date on which he enters into insurance, as the case may be, shall, for the purposes of this Article, be treated as the beginning of the half-year.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 14TH JANUARY 1915.)

BEDFORDSHIRE AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1915 (No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Withdrawal of Existing Orders.

1. The provisions of the Bedfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1914, the Bedfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1914 (Nos. 2 and 3), and the Bedfordshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1915, shall cease to operate, and instead of those provisions the following provisions shall take effect.

Prohibition of Movement out of Certain Area.

2. No cattle, sheep, goats, or swine shall be moved 'out of the Area described in the Schedule hereto: Provided that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals out of such Area where they are moved through such Area by railway from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such Area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

3. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

4. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contraven-

tion as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the sixteenth day of January, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

Short Title, &c.

6. This Order may be cited as the BEDFORD-(FOOT-AND-MOUTH AND DISTRICT DISEASE) ORDER OF 1915 (No.2).
