COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice, that on the 15th January, 1915, he made an Order under section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, entitled "The Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 15th January, 1915," the effect of which is to add the following explosives, viz.:—"Abelite No. 4," "A. 2. Monobel," "Kynarkite No. 2," "Victor Powder No. 2," "Viking Powder No. 1," and "Viking Powder No. 2," to the permitted explosives named and defined in the First Schedule to the Explosives in Coal Mines Order of the 1st September, 1913.

NATIONAL INSURANCE ACTS, 1911-14.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE.

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS, 1915.

Whereas in pursuance of section 91 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, Regulations have been made by the Board of Trade, entitled the Unemployment Insurance Regulations, 1912, and dated May 6th, 1912, the Unemployment Insurance (Supplementary) Regulations, 1913, and dated January 8th, 1913, and the Unemployment Insurance (Supplementary) Regulations, 1914, and dated August 10th, 1914, respectively, now the Board of Trade, in further exercise of their powers under the said section of the National Insurance Act, 1911, and in exercise of their powers under the National Insurance (Part II, Amendment) Act, 1914, and all other powers in this behalf, make the following Regulations:—

1.—(1) These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Supplementary) Regulations, 1915, and shall be construed as one with the Unemployment Insurance Regulations, 1912, the Unemployment Insurance (Supplementary) Regulations, 1913, and the Unemployment Insurance (Supplementary) Regulations, 1914.

(2) These Regulations shall come into force on the date hereof.

2. In these Regulations the expression "the Act" means the National Insurance Act, 1911, and the expression "the Amending Act" means the National Insurance (Part II, Amendment) Act, 1914.

3. The following paragraph shall be added at the end of Regulation 7 of the Unemployment Insurance Regulations, 1912:—

"(5) If any person refuses or fails to pay any sum for the payment of which he is liable under this Regulation, the Board of Trade may, if they think fit, recover such sum by deduction from any benefit or other payment due or to become due to such person under Part II of the National Insurance Act, 1911, or the Regulations made thereunder."

4. In Regulation 10 (1) (a) of the Unemployment Insurance Regulations, 1912, the words "in writing" shall be omitted, and the following words shall be added after the words "in such other manner as the Board may direct": "or may for good cause accept as sufficient in any special case."

5. In provisoes (a) and (b) to Regulation 11 (1) of the Unemployment Insurance Regulations, 1912, the words "four miles" shall be substituted for the words "five miles."

6. The following words shall be added after the words "lodged at a local office" in Regulation 18 (2) (a) of the Unemployment Insurance Regulations, 1912:—

"Unless the lodging of the book was dispensed with in accordance with the proviso to Regulation 10 (1)."

7. The following paragraph shall be added after the words "for determination" in Regulation 19 of the Unemployment Insurance Regulations, 1912:—

"Provided that if the question relates to the amount which a workman, being a member of the association, would have received by way of unemployment benefit if no arrangement had been made with the association under section 105 of the Act, the ques-

tion shall be determined by reference to an insurance officer, a court of referees, and the umpire, as the case may require, in like manner as if the workman had made a claim to unemployment benefit, and the provisions of the Act and the Amending Act and the Regulations made thereunder relating to the determination of claims to unemployment benefit shall apply accordingly, subject to the following modifications:—

(a) All rights conferred on the workman by the aforesaid provisions shall be vested in the association, and may be exercised only by or on behalf of the association;

(b) Regulation 13 of the Unemployment Insurance Regulations, 1912, shall not apply;

(c) The Board of Trade or the association may in all cases require the recommendations of the Court of Referees to be referred to the Umpire for determination."

8. The following words shall be added after the words "in advance" in Regulation 21 (2) of the Unemployment Insurance Regulations, 1912:—

"If the court has more than one place of meeting, a separate rota for service at each place of meeting shall be prepared where the Board of Trade so direct."

Proposed Alteration of Boundary.

Whereas in pursuance of section 54 of the Local Government Act, 1888, a representation has been made to the Local Government Board by the Council of the borough of Kendal that it is desirable that by a Provisional Order under the said Act the boundary of the said borough should be altered so as to include therein a part of the parish of Scalthwaiterigg, which parish is at present included in the rural district of South Westmorland.

Bye-laws with respect to Reserved Cars run upon the Newcastle upon Tyne Corporation Tramways.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City and County of Newcastle upon Tyne, acting by the Council, as the promoters of the Newcastle upon Tyne Corporation Tramways, pursuant to the powers conferred upon them by section 38 of the Newcastle upon Tyne Corporation Act, 1914, and of the Act or Acts therein referred to, and of all and every other power of what nature soever them thereunto enabling, did on the 13th day of January,

1915, duly make the bye-laws and regulations with respect to cars which may be reserved for any special or other purpose run on any of the Corporation Tramways as follows:—

(1) Throughout these Bye-laws and Regulations the expression "Corporation" means the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City and County of Newcastle upon Tyne and shall include any lessees or persons for the time being working the Corporation Tramways as hereinafter defined; the expression "the Tramways" means all tramways and tramroads for the time being belonging to or leased or worked by the Corporation; the expression "the bye-laws of 1903" means the Bye-laws and Regulations made by the Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City and County of Newcastle upon Tyne with respect to the tramways and portions of tramways for the time being then belonging to them dated the 4th day of February, 1903, and allowed by the Board of Trade on the 11th day of April, 1903; the expression "Reserved Car" means any car reserved by the Corporation acting by the Tramways Committee for any special purpose which the Corporation may consider necessary or desirable pursuant to the powers conferred upon the Corporation by section 38 of the Newcastle upon Tyne Corporation Act, 1914, and upon which there shall be conspicuously displayed a notice indicating that such car is reserved. Other words and expressions not hereby expressly defined or to which no meaning is assigned by these Bye-laws shall have the same respective meanings as are assigned thereto by the Bye-laws of 1903 unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant to such construction.

(2) No person other than a person for the conveyance of whom any reserved car shall have been provided shall mount, enter, or remain upon any such reserved car, and if found in or upon any such car any such person may if he neglects or fails to leave such car immediately upon being requested so to do by the Conductor or any duly authorized officer of the Corporation be immediately removed therefrom by or under the direction of such Conductor or other duly authorized officer.

(3) The Byelaws and Regulations of 1903 in so far as the same are not inconsistent with the terms of these Byelaws shall in all respects apply to and be enforceable upon reserved cars.

(4) Any person offending against or committing a breach of the above Byelaws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding 40s.

(5) These Byelaws and Regulations shall come into force on the 20th day of March, 1915.
