A PROCLAMATION

PROHIBITING UNDER SECTION 8 OF "THE CUSTOMS AND INLAND REVENUE ACT, 1879," AND SECTION ONE OF "THE EXPORTATION OF ARMS ACT, 1900," AND SECTION ONE OF "THE CUSTOMS (EXPORTATION PROHIBITION) ACT, 1914," THE EXPORTATION FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM OF WARLIKE STORES.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas by Section 8 of "The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879," it is enacted that the exportation of arms, ammunition, and gunpowder, military and naval stores, and any articles which We shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military or naval stores, provisions, or any sort of victual which may be used as food for man may be prohibited by Proclamation:

And whereas by Section one of "The Exportation of Arms Act, 1900," it is enacted that We may by Proclamation prohibit the exportation of all or any of the following articles, namely, arms, ammunition, military and naval stores, and any article which We shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of arms, ammunition, or military or naval stores, to any

country or place therein named whenever We shall judge such prohibition to be expedient in order to prevent such arms, ammunition, military or naval stores, being used against Our subjects or forces or against any forces engaged or which may be engaged in military or naval operations in co-operation with Our forces:

And whereas by Section one of "The Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914," it is enacted that Section 8 of the aforesaid Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, shall have effect whilst a state of war in which We are engaged exists as if in addition to the articles therein mentioned there were included all other articles of every description:

And whereas it is further enacted by Section 2 of "The Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914," that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8, as so amended, of "The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879," may whilst a state of war exists be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is enacted by Section 2 of "The Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914," that any Proclamation made under Section one of "The Exportation of Arms Act, 1900," may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas a Proclamation dated the 10th November, 1914, and various Orders dated respectively the 20th November, the 5th, the 11th and the 23rd December, 1914, and the 4th and the 8th January, 1915, prohibiting the exportation of certain articles therein referred to from the United Kingdom to certain or all destinations, have been issued in pursuance of the aforesaid powers:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Proclamation and Orders should be consolidated, with amendments and additions, and that such Proclamation and Orders should be revoked:

And whereas the articles, other than arms, ammunition, or military or naval stores hereinafter enumerated are articles which We judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of arms, ammunition, or military or naval stores:

And whereas in order to prevent such arms, ammunition, or military or naval stores being used against Our subjects or forces or against any forces engaged or which may be engaged in military or naval operations in co-operation with Our forces, We have deemed it expedient to prohibit the exportation of the articles hereinafter enumerated:

Now, Therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, declaring, and it is hereby declared, that the above-mentioned Proclamation and Orders be and the same are hereby revoked:

And We have further thought fit, by and with the advice aforesaid, and in virtue and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, further to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

(A) That the exportation of the following goods be prohibited to all destinations:—

Aeroplanes, airships, balloons and aircraft, of all kinds and their component parts,

together with accessories and articles recognisable as intended for use in connection with aeroplanes, airships, balloons, and aircraft, including:—gold beaters' skin; shantung silk in the piece; flax fabric suitable for aeroplanes; non-inflammable "celluloid" sheet (or similar transparent material non-soluble in lubricating oil, petrol or water); aeroplane dope; high tensile steel tubes; aeroplane instruments (aneroids, barographs, revolution indicators); aeroplane turnbuckles; steel stampings; magnetos; aeroplane engines and parts; fusel oil (amyl alcohol); amyl acetate; aceto-celluloses; trephenyl phosphate;

Animals, pack, saddle and draught, suitable for use in war;

Cannon and other ordnance and machine-guns, and parts thereof;

Carbons, suitable for searchlights;

Carriages and mountings for cannon and other ordnance, and for machine guns and parts thereof;

Cartridges, charges of all kinds, and their component parts;

A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING SUBSECTION (6) OF SECTION ONE OF THE CURRENCY AND BANK NOTES ACT, 1914, WHEREBY POSTAL ORDERS ARE MADE LEGAL TENDER.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS by subsection (6) of section one of the Currency and Bank Notes Act, 1914, it was provided as follows:—

“(6) For the purpose of meeting immediate exigencies all postal orders issued either before or after the passing of this Act shall temporarily be current and legal tender in the United Kingdom in the same manner and to the same extent and as fully as current coins, and shall be legal tender in the United Kingdom for the payment of any amount.

"The holder of any such postal order shall be entitled to obtain on demand, during office hours at the Bank of England, payment for the postal order at its face value in any coin which is for the time being legal tender in the United Kingdom for the amount of the note.

"Provisoes (b) and (c) to subsection (1) of section twenty-four of the Post Office Act, 1908, shall not apply to any such postal orders.

"This subsection shall have effect only until His Majesty by Proclamation revokes the same, and any Proclamation revoking this subsection may provide for the calling in or exchange of any postal orders affected thereby."

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that in accordance with the powers thereby conferred the said subsection should be revoked as from such date and subject to such provisions for the calling in thereof as are contained in this Proclamation:

NOW, THEREFORE, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, and We do hereby proclaim direct and ordain as follows:—

1. Subsection (6) of section one of the Currency and Bank Notes Act, 1914, is hereby revoked as from the date of this Proclamation; and accordingly any postal orders to which that subsection applies shall cease to be current and legal tender as therein provided as from that date.

2. The holder of any such postal order shall be entitled to obtain on demand at any time before the first day of June nineteen hundred and fifteen, during office hours at any money order office in the United Kingdom, payment for the order at its face value in coins or currency notes which are for the time being legal tender in the United Kingdom.

"6A. If any special constable who has been appointed since the commencement of the present war and whose appointment was for a specified period agrees to continue to serve as a special constable after the expiration of that period, his appointment shall be

extended and he shall retain all the powers and privileges and remain subject to all the duties of a special constable so long as he continues so to act."

WHEREAS a state of war now exists between this Country and His Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkey, so that His Majesty's Fleets and Ships may lawfully seize all ships, vessels, and goods belonging to the said Sultan or the Ottoman Government or the Citizens and Subjects thereof, or other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories, or dominions of the said Sultan, and bring the same to judgment in such Courts of Law within His Majesty's Dominions, Possessions, or Colonies, or elsewhere as shall be duly commissioned to take cognizance thereof:

His Majesty is therefore pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that a Commission in the form of the draft annexed hereto shall issue under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom, authorizing the Commissioners for executing the Office of Lord High Admiral to will and require His Majesty's High Court of Justice and the Judges thereof, and His Britannic Majesty's Prize Court in Egypt, His Britannic Majesty's Court for Zanzibar in Zanzibar, and the Supreme Court of Cyprus in Cyprus, and all the Judges of those Courts or other the persons or person executing the duties of the Office of Judge for the time being, to take cognizance of and judicially proceed upon all and all manner of captures, seizures, prizes and reprisals of all ships, vessels, and goods that are or shall be taken, and to hear and determine the same, and according to the course of Admiralty and the Law of Nations, and the Statutes, Rules, and Regulations for the time being in force in that behalf, to adjudge and condemn all such ships, vessels, and goods as shall belong to the Sultan of Turkey or the Ottoman Government or to the Citizens or Subjects thereof, or to any other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories, or dominions of the said Sultan or be otherwise condemnable as Prize.

Whereas a state of war now exists between this Country and His Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkey so that Our Fleets and Ships may lawfully seize all ships, vessels, and goods belonging to the said Sultan or the Ottoman Government or the Citizens and Subjects thereof, or other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories, or dominions of the said Sultan, and bring the same to judgment in such Courts of Admiralty within Our Dominions, Possessions, or Colonies, or elsewhere as shall be duly commissioned to take cognizance thereof.

These are therefore to authorize and We do hereby authorize and enjoin you, Our said Commissioners, now and for the time being, or any two or more of you, to will and require Our High Court of Justice and the Judges thereof, and Our Prize Court in Egypt, Our Court for Zanzibar in Zanzibar, and Our Supreme Court of Cyprus in Cyprus, and all the Judges of those Courts or other persons or person executing the duties of the Office of Judge for the time being, and the said High Court and other the said Courts and the Judges thereof and other the persons or person executing the duties of the Office of Judge for the time being are hereby authorized and required to take cognizance of and judicially to proceed upon all and all manner of captures, seizures, prizes and reprisals of all ships, vessels, and goods already seized and taken, and to hear and determine the same, and according to the course of Admiralty and Law of Nations, and the Statutes, Rules, and Regulations for the time being in force in that behalf, to adjudge and condemn all such ships, vessels, and goods as shall belong to the Sultan of Turkey or to the Ottoman Government or to the Citizens or Subjects thereof, or to any other persons inhabiting within any of the countries, territories, or dominions of the said Sultan or which are otherwise condemnable as Prize.

In witness whereof We have caused the Great Seal of the United Kingdom to be put and affixed to these Presents.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the President of the United States of America, dated the 9th April, 1910, the benefits of the United States Act of 1909, entitled

"An Act to amend and consolidate the Acts respecting Copyright," were extended to the Subjects of Great Britain and her Possessions, but no provision was made therein for the protection of the musical works of British Subjects against reproduction by means of mechanical contrivances:

And whereas His Majesty is advised that the Government of the United States of America has undertaken, upon the issue of this Order, to grant such protection to the musical works of British Subjects:

And whereas by reason of these premises His Majesty is satisfied that the Government of the United States of America has made, or has undertaken to make, such provision as it is expedient to require for the protection of works entitled to Copyright under the provisions of Part I of the Copyright Act, 1911:

And whereas by the Copyright Act, 1911, authority is conferred upon His Majesty to extend, by Order in Council, the protection of the said Act to certain classes of foreign works within any part of His Majesty's Dominions, other than self-governing Dominions, to which the said Act extends:

And whereas it is desirable to provide protection within the said Dominions for the unpublished works of Citizens of the United States of America:

NOW, THEREFORE, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Copyright Act, 1911, including the provisions as to existing works, shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of this Order, apply—

(a) to literary, dramatic, musical and artistic works the authors whereof were at the time of the making of the works Citizens of the United States of America, in like manner as if the authors had been British Subjects:

(b) in respect of residence in the United States of America, in like manner as if such residence had been residence in the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which the said Act extends.

Provided that—

(i) the term of Copyright within the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which this Order applies shall not exceed that conferred by the law of the United States of America:

(ii) the enjoyment of the rights conferred by this Order shall be subject to the accomplishment of the conditions and formalities prescribed by the law of the United States of America:

(iii) in the application to existing works of the provisions of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the 26th July, 1910, in subsection 1 (b).

2. This Order shall apply to all His Majesty's Dominions, Colonies and Possessions, with the exception of those hereinafter named, that is to say:—

The Dominion of Canada.

The Commonwealth of Australia.

The Dominion of New Zealand.

The Union of South Africa.

Newfoundland.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1915, which day is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 112, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Cornworthy, in the County of Devon, and in the Diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Cornworthy is vested for an estate in fee simple, in possession, free from incumbrances, in Arthur Johnston Mackey, of No. 2, The Close, Exeter, in the County of Devon, Esquire.

"And whereas the said Arthur Johnston Mackey is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Cornworthy, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Archibald, now Bishop of Exeter, and his successors in the same Bishopric.

"And whereas the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he, the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, has executed this Scheme as herein-after mentioned.

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Cornworthy which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say in the Parish of Cornworthy.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur Johnston Mackey (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of

and presentation to the said Benefice of Cornworthy, now vested in him the said Arthur Johnston Mackey as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Archibald, Bishop of Exeter, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a new Archdeaconry within the Diocese of Ely, and for endowing such new Archdeaconry.

"Whereas the said Diocese of Ely comprises two Archdeaconries namely, the Archdeaconry of Ely and the Archdeaconry of Huntingdon, and also the Rural Deaneries of Ely, March, Wisbech, Fincham, and Lynn Marshland, which are not comprised in either of the said two Archdeaconries.

"And whereas by an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, dated the 26th day of June, in the year 1884, and published in the London Gazette on the 1st day of the following month, a Scheme of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, was ratified wherein after

recitals that there were within the Diocese of Ely the two Rural Deaneries of Ely and Wisbech not within any of the Archdeaconries of the said Diocese, but subject only to the archidiaconal jurisdiction of the Bishop of Ely, and that the area comprised within the said two Rural Deaneries of Ely and Wisbech was commonly known as the Archdeaconry of the Isle of Ely, it was provided that the said two Rural Deaneries of Ely and Wisbech should be divided into the three Rural Deaneries of Ely, March, and Wisbech as in the said Scheme set forth.

"And whereas by another Order of Her said late Majesty, dated the 8th day of August, in the year 1899, and published in the London Gazette on the 11th day of the same month, the aforesaid arrangement as to the said three Rural Deaneries of Ely, March, and Wisbech was confirmed.

"And whereas by an Order of Your Majesty in Council, dated the 10th day of August, in the present year, and published in the London Gazette on the 21st day of the same month, relating to the constitution of the Bishopric of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, the said Rural Deaneries of Fincham, and Lynn Marshland were transferred from the Diocese of Norwich and the Archdeaconry of Lynn to the Diocese of Ely and the so-called Archdeaconry of the Isle of Ely.

"And whereas the Right Reverend Frederic Henry, Bishop of Ely, has represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the said Rural Deaneries of Ely, March, Wisbech, Fincham, and Lynn Marshland should be constituted a new Archdeaconry by the name of the Archdeaconry of Wisbech, and that such new Archdeaconry should be endowed in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"And whereas it appears to us to be undesirable that procurations, synodals, visitation fees, and induction fees should be received by the Archdeacon of the said proposed new Archdeaconry.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that there will be no annual income available for the said proposed Archdeaconry from fees, dues, and emoluments, and that the grant hereinafter recommended and proposed will not be such as to raise the annual income of the said proposed Archdeaconry to an amount exceeding £200.

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Frederic Henry, Bishop of Ely, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Scheme), humbly recommend and propose that, upon and from the day upon which any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, one new Archdeaconry shall be created within the said Diocese of Ely, and that such Archdeaconry shall be named 'The Archdeaconry of Wisbech' and shall comprise and consist of the said Rural Deaneries of Ely, Fincham, Lynn Marshland, March, and Wisbech.

"And we further recommend and propose that the Rural Deans and other the Clergy and the inhabitants generally of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Wisbech shall be under and subject to the archidiaconal jurisdiction authority and control of the Archdeacon of

such proposed Archdeaconry for the time being, and free from all other archidiaconal jurisdiction authority and control, and that such Archdeacon shall have and exercise all the rights powers and duties of an Archdeacon within the limits of his Archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that we be authorized to pay by half-yearly instalments on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in every year out of the Common Fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act to the Archdeacon of the said proposed Archdeaconry of Wisbech, and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry, the yearly sum of £200, the instalment so first becoming due being an apportioned part only of the said sum of £200 in respect of the period between the date of the appointment of the first Archdeacon and the first half-yearly day of payment next ensuing: Provided always that every payment in respect of the said yearly sum of £200 shall be made by us only after we shall have been satisfied that the Archdeacon who applies for the same has during the previous twelve calendar months complied with the conditions as to residence which for the time being are required by law, and that he has not collected procurations, synodals, visitation fees, or induction fees during the same period.

"And we further recommend and propose that whenever any Archdeacon who may be entitled to receive the said yearly sum of £200 shall resign or otherwise avoid his Archdeaconry such yearly sum shall be apportioned between such Archdeacon or his representatives (as the case may be) and the Archdeacon who shall next be collated to the same Archdeaconry.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ely.

any new burial ground in any city or town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any city or town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in any city or town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such city or town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parishes affected by such representation, one month before such representation is so considered: Provided also that no such representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any Parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such Parish.

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Cardington, in the County of Bedford, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Cardington aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed.

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 28th day of November, 1914, notice of such representation was given, and it was ordered that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 9th day of January, 1915, and that the said Order in Council be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such representation one month before the said 9th day of January, 1915.

And whereas the said Order in Council of the 28th day of November, 1914, has been duly published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed in the manner directed by the said Order.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the opening of any new burial ground in the said Civil Parish of Cardington, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, be and the same is hereby prohibited, and that burials in the said Parish be discontinued as follows, viz.:—

CARDINGTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Saint Mary, Cardington,

(Civil Parish of Cardigton), in the County of Bedford; and in the adjoining Churchyard, with the following exceptions, that is to say:—

(a) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(b) In the said Churchyard, in a grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the bodies of Edith Mills and of members of the Whitbread family at their decease, subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said Churchyard, in a grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of Sir Frederick Howard, Knight, at his decease, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

LLANGRANOG.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of St. Cranog, or Llangranog, in the Parish of Llangranog, in the County of Cardigan; and in the Churchyard attached thereto, with the following exceptions, that is to say:—

(a) Burials may be allowed in the under-mentioned vault and walled graves now existing in the said Churchyard subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or graves be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented, namely,

The vault belonging or reputed to belong to Charles William Webley Hope and the walled graves belonging or reputed to belong to Esther Davies, John Evans, David Griffiths, Margaret Ann Griffiths, Ann Jenkins, James Lloyd, Jane Owens, Sarah Polgrim and Sarah Rees.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such Representations, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 17th day of March next.

The following Statute made by the Provost and Fellows of Oriel College, Oxford, on the 7th day of December, 1914, (and sealed on the 8th day of December, 1914), has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions contained in "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

A STATUTE to amend a Statute made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, (40 and 41 Vict., c. 48), and approved by the Queen in Council on the 3rd day of May, in the year of our Lord 1882, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, duly made at a General Meeting of the Provost and Fellows, specially summoned for the purpose, held on Monday, the 7th day of December, in the year of our Lord 1914, and passed at such Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting,

and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas by Statute II, 6 and 7, of the Statutes made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and approved by Her Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the 3rd day of May, in the year of our Lord 1882, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, it was enacted as follows:—

"6. The Provost shall receive out of the Corporate Revenue, so long as the cure of souls of the Benefice of Purleigh, and the Canonry in the Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Rochester, or either of them, shall continue to be annexed to his office, the annual sum of £450; and after the severance of the office of Provost as well from the said cure of souls as from the said Canonry, the annual sum of £800, in addition to the annual sum which, under the provisions of the Universities and College Estates Amendment Act, 1880, shall be charged upon lands or the other endowments of the Benefice of Purleigh, and payable to the Provost for the time being. The Provost shall also be entitled to the use of his lodgings free of rent, the expense of necessary repairs being defrayed by the College.

"7. If at any time the Provost shall become permanently incapable of performing the duties of his office, the Lord Chancellor may, on the petition of the Provost, presented with the consent of a majority of the Fellows present at a College Meeting specially summoned, direct that the Provost shall be permitted to retire from his office with such a pension, not exceeding £500 per annum, as the Lord Chancellor shall deem suitable to the circumstances of the case.

"If no such petition shall have been presented by the Provost, the Lord Chancellor may, if he think fit, on the petition of a majority of the Fellows present at a Meeting specially summoned, and after inquiry held by him, make an order declaring that the Provost has become permanently incapable of performing the duties of his office, and may direct that the Provostship shall be deemed to be vacant at the expiration of a time to be fixed by the same order, and the Fellows shall thereupon proceed to the election of a new Provost, pursuant to these Statutes. The Lord Chancellor shall by the same order assign to the Provost on his ceasing to hold office such a pension, not exceeding £500 per annum, as the Lord Chancellor may deem suitable to the circumstances of the case. Any pension assigned under this clause to a Provost shall be provided for and paid as follows, namely, one-half shall be deducted from the stipend of his successor in the office of Provost, and the other half shall be paid out of the corporate revenues of the College. . . ."

And whereas the Provost and Fellows are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the said Statute in manner hereinafter appearing:

We, the said Provost and Fellows of the said College, do hereby, in exercise of the powers given to us by the fifty-fourth section of the said Act, alter Statute II, 6 and 7, of the said Statutes by adding at the end of Statute II, 6, the following paragraph:—

"The Provostship may be held with a Professorship or other office in the University,

but in that case (unless the office be that of Vice-Chancellor) the stipend payable to the Provost out of the revenues of the College shall not exceed the sum which will make his emoluments (including those of his Professorship or other office) £1,600 a year."

And also by inserting the following new clause:—

"If the Provost, being of the age of seventy years, and having held office for not less than twenty years, or having served the College as Provost, Dean, Treasurer, Tutor, or Lecturer for twenty years in all, shall wish to retire from his office, and shall have received the consent of the Provost and Fellows to his retirement, he shall retire with such a pension, not exceeding £500 a year, as the Provost and Fellows shall deem suitable to the circumstances of the case, provided that there be not at the time any former Provost in receipt of a pension under this or the following clause.

"On attaining the age of seventy-five years the Provost shall retire from his office, and shall be entitled to a pension of £500 a year, provided that if a Provost retiring under the provisions of this or the following clause shall be or become entitled to a pension from the Tutors' Pension Fund, or any other fund existing within the College for the provision of retiring pensions, the pension received by him as Provost shall be reduced by the amount of such pension: and if the Provost so retiring shall have served the College as Tutor or Treasurer for twenty years, but shall not have had a pension assigned to him in respect of such service, it shall be within the power of the Provost and Fellows to determine what portion of his pension as Provost shall be charged on the Tutors' Pension Fund, or any other fund existing within the College for the provision of retiring pensions."

And also by inserting in Statute II, 7, in the second paragraph, after the words "assigned under this" the words "or the preceding," and, after the words "paid as follows" the words "except in respect of any such portion of it as may be chargeable on the Tutors' Pension Fund or any other fund for the provision of retiring pensions."
