In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Trade Boards Act, 1909, the Board of Trade are pleased to establish a Trade Board for that branch of the Box Trade in Ireland which is engaged in the making of Boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of Paper, Cardboard, Chip or similar material.

In accordance with the Regulations for the above-mentioned branch of trade, dated 8th October, 1914, the Trade Board shall consist of:—

(1) Three appointed members, namely:—

(3) Five members representing workers in the above trade, chosen by the Board of Trade
