Alberbury, Brampton Bryan, Brilley with Michaelchurch-on-Arrow, Churchstoke, Great Wollaston, Hyssington with Snead, Kent-church with Llangau, Lydham, Mainstone, Middleton, Old Radnor, Presteigne with Discoed, Dixton Newton, Llanymynech, Sarn, Dodleston, Lache-cum-Saltney shall, for the purposes of the Welsh Church Act, 1914, be treated as being wholly without Wales and Monmouthshire.
