SUBMARINE TELEGRAPH CABLES BETWEEN ENGLAND, IRELAND, NORTH AMERICA AND THE AZORES.

Notice is hereby given that an application has been received by the Board of Trade (to whom by the Crown Lands Act, 1866, the management of the rights and interests of the Crown in the foreshores of the United Kingdom has been transferred) from the Commercial Cable Company for the renewal of their licences to maintain and use upon the foreshore and bed of the sea at Weston-super-Mare, Somerset, and Waterville, County Kerry, four submarine telegraph cables between Waterville and North America, one cable between Waterville and the Azores, and three cables between Waterville and Weston-super-Mare.

All persons interested are to take notice that 28 days after this date the Board of Trade will proceed to consider the application, and in the meantime they will receive any objections which may be made thereto.
