"2. And whereas a state of war exists between Your Majesty and the German Empire, the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary, and the Ottoman Empire: "3. We beg humbly to submit that Your Majesty may now be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to declare Your intention to grant Prize Bounty to the Officers and crews of Your Majesty's Ships of War.

"4. We further beg humbly to submit that Prize Bounty as ascertained under the provisions of the Naval Prize Act, 1864, should be paid by the Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury into the account of Your Majesty's Paymaster General at the Bank of England for distribution under our direction among the Officers and crews of Your Majesty's Ships of War entitled thereto in the shares in that behalf to be specified hereafter by Your Order in Council.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to make a Declaration in the terms mentioned, and to approve of what is thereinafter proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the territories of Africa known as the East Africa Protectorate are under the protection of His Majesty the King:

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the said Protectorate:

And whereas by an Order of His late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 11th day of August, 1902, and entitled "The East Africa Order in Council, 1902," provision was made for the administration of the Government of the said Protectorate by a Commissioner:

And whereas by a further Order of His late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 22nd day of October, 1906, and entitled "The East Africa Order in Council, 1906," it was provided that a Governor should be appeinted for the said Protectorate in place of a Commissioner:

And whereas by the Fifteenth and Sixteenth Articles of the last-recited Order provision was made for the administration of the Government of the said Protectorate in the absence of the Governor:

And whereas by a further Order of His late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 2nd day of November, 1907, and entitled "The East Africa Order in Council, 1907," fresh Articles were substituted for the Fifteenth and Sixteenth Articles of the last-recited Order:

And whereas it is desirable to make other provision in regard to the appointment of a Deputy by the Governor during his temporary absence:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers on that behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise, in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

I. This Order may be cited as "The East Africa Order in Council, 1915."

II. The Article which was substituted by the above-recited Order in Council of the 2nd day of November, 1907, for the aforesaid Sixteenth Article of the above-recited Order in Council of the 22nd day of October, 1906, is, as from the coming into operation of this Order, hereby revoked without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and in place thereof the following Article shall be substituted and take effect:—

"XVI. In the event of the Governor having occasion at any time to be temporarily absent for a short period from the seat of Government, or, in the exercise or discharge of any powers or duties conferred or imposed upon him by His Majesty, or through one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, to visit any territories adjacent to or near to the Protectorate, he may, by an Instrument under the Public Seal of the Protectorate, appoint the Lieutenant-Governor, or if there be no such Officer or such Officer is absent or unable to act, then any other person to be his Deputy within any part of the Protectorate during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform, and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor (except the power of pardon) as shall in and by such Instrument be specified and limited, but no others.

"Every such Deputy shall conform to and observe all such instructions as the Governor shall from time to time address to him for his guidance. Provided nevertheless that by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid the power and authority of the Governor shall not be abridged, altered, or in any way affected otherwise than His Majesty may at any time think proper to direct."

III. His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in Council may at any time revoke, alter, or amend this Order.

IV. This Order shall be published in the Official Gazette of the East Africa Protectorate, and shall thereupon commence and come into operation.

of HEREAS by Section 30 Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, as amended by Section 2 of The Municipal Corporations Act, 1893, it is (amongst other things) provided that, if a majority of the whole Council of a Borough agree to petition, and the Council thereupon petition, The King for the alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the Borough, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, from time to time, by Order in Council, to fix the number of Wards into which the Borough shall be divided, and that the Borough shall be divided into that number of Wards, and that where an Order in Council has been so made the Secretary of State shall appoint a Commis-sioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of the Wards and apportioning the Councillors among them.

And whereas a majority of the whole Council of the County Borough of Blackpool did, on the 2nd day of September, 1913, agree to petition, and the Council of the said County Borough thereupon petitioned, His Majesty for the alteration of the number and boundaries of the Wards of the said County Borough.

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 22nd day of November, 1913, to fix the number of Wards into which the County Borough of Blackpool should be henceforth divided, and to order and direct that the number of the said Wards should be twelve.

And whereas on the 4th day of December, 1913, the Right Honourable Reginald McKenna, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, did appoint Harold McKenna, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, a Commissioner to prepare a Scheme for determining the boundaries of such Wards, and for apportioning the Councillors of the said County Borough among such Wards.

Borough among such Wards. And whereas by Section 30 (5) of The Municipal Corporations Act, 1882, it is provided that, in case of alteration of Wards, the Commissioner shall so apportion among the altered Wards the Councillors for those Wards as to provide for their continuing to represent as large a number as possible of their former constituents.

And whereas the said Commissioner has accordingly prepared the following Scheme, dated the 15th day of September, 1914:—

"COUNTY BOROUGH OF BLACKPOOL.

"I, Harold McKenna, in pursuance of the powers given me by virtue of the said appointment under the said Act, do hereby determine as hereinafter mentioned the Boundaries of the said Wards into which the said County Borough is divided, which Wards are hereinafter named and numbered as follows, that is to say:—

Number 1.—WARBRECK WARD.
Number 2.—CLAREMONT WARD.
Number 3.—TALBOT WARD.
Number 4.—BANK HEY WARD.
Number 5.—BRUNSWICK WARD.
Number 6.—FOXHALL WARD.

Number 8.—ALEXANDRA WARD.
Number 9.—VICTORIA WARD.
Number 10WATERLOO WARD.

And where in the following descriptions of the Ward Boundaries (so far as such descriptions do not refer to the Borough Boundary) a street, road, or footpath is given as the Boundary of a Ward, the Boundary is to be taken as the centre of such street, road, or footpath, and where any street or road is described as joining another street or road, the point of junction is to be taken as the point at which lines drawn along the centres of the two streets or roads and continued would intersect each other, and a point described as being opposite a street or road is to be taken as opposite the centre of the street or road.

And where a river or stream is given as the Boundary of a Ward, the Boundary (except when it refers to the Borough Boundary) is to be taken as the *medium filum* of such river or stream.

Number 1.-WARBRECK WARD.

I do hereby determine that Warbreck Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Black-

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pool as is contained within the following Boundary:---

Commencing on the northern Boundary of the Borough at the point of conjunction of the northern and western Boundaries of the Borough, thence proceeding in an easterly and .subsequently in a southerly direction following the Borough Boundary to the centre of the Lancashire and Yorkshire and London and North-Western Joint Railway line, thence proceeding south-westward along the centre of the said Railway Line to a point opposite the centre of Back Fairfield Road, and thence north-westward to and along the centre of Back Fairfield Road to the intersection of Claremont Road, thence south-westward along the centre of Claremont Road to the intersection of Sherbourne Road, thence north-westward along the centre of Sherbourne Road to the intersection of Clevedon Road, thence south-westward along the centre of Clevedon Road to the intersection of Egerton Road, thence north-westward along the centre of Egerton Road to the intersection of Carshalton Road, thence westward along the .centre of Carshalton Road to the intersection of Warbreck Road, thence southward along the centre of Warbreck Road to the intersection of Derby Road, thence westward along the centre of Derby Road, and thence continuing westward in a straight line to the Borough Boundary, thence following the Borough Boundary northward to the point of commencement afore-.said.

Number 2.—CLAREMONT WARD.

I do hereby determine that Claremont Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Blackpool as is contained within the following Boundary:—

Commencing on the western Boundary of the Borough at the point of conjunction of the western Boundary of the Borough with the southern Boundary of Number 1 Warbreck Ward as hereinbefore described, thence eastward following the said Boundary of Number 1 Warbreck Ward to the centre of the Lancashire and Yorkshire and London and North-Western Joint Railway Line, thence southwestward along the centre of the said Railway Line to a point on the said Railway Line at the intersection of the said Railway Line with an imaginary line drawn in continuation of the centre of Howard Street in a south-easterly direction, thence north-westward along such imaginary line to the conjunction of Howard Street and Banks Street, thence proceeding south-westward along the centre of Banks Street, and thence continuing westward in a straight line to the borough Boundary, thence following the Borough Boundary northward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

Number 3.-TALBOT WARD.

I do hereby determine that Talbot Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Blackpool as is contained within the following Boundary:--

Commencing on the western Boundary of the Borough at the point of conjunction of the western Boundary of the Borough with the southern Boundary of Number 2 Claremont Ward as hereinbefore described, thence eastward following the said boundary to a point in the centre of the Lancashire and Yorkshire and London and North-Western Joint Railway Line opposite the eastern boundary wall of Percy Street, Grafton Street, Osbourne Street

and St. Anthony's Place, thence south-eastward in a straight line along such boundary wall to the centre of New Road, thence eastward along the centre of New Road to the intersection of Devonshire Road, thence southward along the centre of Devonshire Road to the intersection of Caunce Street, thence southwestward along the centre of Caunce Street to the intersection of Cookson Street, thence northwestward along the centre of Cookson Street to a point opposite the northern side of the passage (or roadway) at the back of Brighton Grove, thence westward to and along the north side of the said passage (or roadway) to the south-eastern corner of the premises known as the Talbot Hotel, thence continuing in a westerly direction along the southern boundary fence (or wall) of the said premises to Topping Street, thence in a straight line across Topping Street to the centre of Upper Talbot Street, thence westward along the centre of Upper Talbot Street to the intersection of Abingdon Street, thence southward along the centre of Abingdon Street to the intersection of Back Clifton Street, thence westward along the centre of Back Clifton Street to the intersection of Lytham Street, thence southward along the centre of Lytham Street to the intersection of West Street, thence westward along the centre of West Street and continuing westward in a straight line to the Borough Boundary, thence following the Borough Boundary northward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

Number 4.—BANK HEY WARD.

I do hereby determine that Bank Hey Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Blackpool as is contained within the following Boundary:—

Commencing on the western Boundary of the Borough at the point of conjunction of the western Boundary of the Borough with the southern Boundary of Number 3 Talbot Ward hereinbefore described, thence eastward as following the said Boundary of Number 3 Talbot Ward to the point of conjunction of Caunce Street and Devonshire Road, thence southward along the centre of Devonshire Road to the intersection of Raikes Road, thence westward along the centre of Raikes Road and Church Street to the intersection of Regent Road, thence southward along the centre of Regent Road to the intersection of Albert Road, thence westward successively along the centres of Albert Road and Hounds Hill, and continuing westward in a straight line to the Borough Boundary, thence following the Borough Boundary northward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

Number 5.—BRUNSWICK WARD.

I do hereby determine that Brunswick Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Blackpool as is contained within the following Boundary:—

Commencing on the western Boundary of the Borough at the point of conjunction of the western Boundary of the Borough with the southern Boundary of Number 4 Bank Hey Ward as hereinbefore described, thence eastward following the said Boundary of Number 4 Bank Hey Ward to the point of conjunction of Raikes Road and Whitegate Drive, thence southward along the centre of Whitegate Drive to the intersection of Palatine Road, thence westward along the centre of Palatine Road to the intersection of Central Drive, thence northwestward along the centre of Central Drive to the intersection of Chapel Street, thence westward along the centre of Chapel Street, and continuing westward in a straight line to the Borough Boundary, thence following the Borough Boundary northward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

Number 6.—FOXHALL WARD.

I do hereby determine that Foxhall Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Blackpool as is contained within the following Boundary:—

Commencing on the western Boundary of the Borough at the point of conjunction of the western Boundary of the Borough with the southern Boundary of Number 5 Brunswick Ward as hereinbefore described, thence eastward following the said Boundary of Number 5 Brunswick Ward to the point of conjunction of Palatine Road and Whitegate Drive, thence southward along the centre of Whitegate Drive to the intersection of Cumberland Avenue, thence westward along the centre of Cumberland Avenue to the junction of Cumberland Avenue, the continuation of Park Avenue, and Keswick Road, thence north-westward along the centre of the continuation of Park Avenue to the intersection of Ashton Road, thence south-westward along the centre of Ashton Road to the centre of Central Road, thence in a south-easterly direction along the centre of Central Road to the intersection of the road in front of the Free Library, thence along the centre of such road in a south-westerly direction to the intersection of Central Drive, thence southward along the centre of Central Drive to the intersection of Rigby Road, thence westward along the centre of Rigby Road, and continuing westward in a straight line to the Borough Boundary, thence following the Borough Boundary northward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

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Number 7.—Tyldesley WARD.

I do hereby determine that Tyldesley Wards shall comprise so much of the Borough of Blackpool as is contained within the following Boundary:—

Commencing on the western Boundary of the Borough at the point of conjunction of the western Boundary of the Borough with the southern Boundary of No. 6 Foxhall Ward as hereinbefore described, thence eastward following the said Boundary of Number 6 Foxhall Ward to the point of conjunction of Cumber-land Avenue and Whitegate Drive, thence south-eastward along the centre of Whitegate Drive to the intersection of St. Stephen's Avenue, thence westward along the centre of St. Stephen's Avenue to the intersection of Cunliffe Road, thence in a south and southwesterly direction along the centre of Cunliffe Road to the intersection of Bloomfield Road, thence northward and westward along the centre of Bloomfield Road to the intersection of Lytham Road, thence in a northerly direction along the centre of Lytham Road to the intersection of Woodfield Road, thence westward along the centre of Woodfield Road, and continuing westward in a straight line to the Borough Boundary, thence following the Borough Boundary northward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

Number 8.—ALEXANDRA WARD.

I do hereby determine that Alexandra Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Blackpool as is contained within the following Boundary:---

Commencing on the western Boundary of the Borough at the point of conjunction of the western Boundary of the Borough with the southern Boundary of Number 7 Tyldesley Ward as hereinbefore described, thence eastward following the said Boundary of Number 7 Tyldesley Ward to the point of conjunction of Bloomfield Road and Cunliffe Road, thence south-eastward along the centre of Bloomfield Road to the intersection of Waterloo Road, thence westward along the centre of Waterloo Road, and continuing westward in a straight line to the Borough Boundary, thence following the Borough Boundary northward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

Commencing on the western Boundary of the Borough at the point of conjunction of the western Boundary of the Borough with the southern Boundary of Number 8 Alexandra Ward as hereinbefore described, thence eastward following the said Boundary of Number 8 Alexandra Ward to the point of conjunction of Waterloo Road and Hawes Side Lane, thence southward along the centre of Hawes Side Lane to the Borough Boundary, thence southward following the Borough Boundary to the centre of the Lancashire and Yorkshire and London and North-Western Joint Railway⁻ Line, thence westward along the centre of the said Railway Line to a point opposite the centre of Watsons Lane, thence westward along the ' centre of Watsons Lane and Watsons Road, and continuing westward in a straight line to the Borough Boundary, thence following the Borough Boundary northward to the point of commencement aforesaid.

Number 10.—WATERLOO WARD.

I do hereby determine that Waterloo Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Blackpool as is contained within the following : Boundary:----

Commencing on the western Boundary of the Borough at the point of conjunction of the western Boundary of the Borough with the southern Boundary of Number 9 Victoria Ward as hereinbefore described, thence eastward following the said Boundary of Number 9 Victoria Ward to the point of conjunction of the centre of the Lancashire and Yorkshire and London and North-Western Railway Joint Line with the Borough Boundary, thence following the Borough Boundary commencing in a south-easterly direction to the point of commencement aforesaid.

Number 11.-LAYTON WARD.

I do hereby determine that Layton Ward shall comprise so much of the Borough of Blackpool as is contained within the following Boundary:—

Commencing on the eastern Boundary of the Borough at the point of conjunction of the

eastern Boundary of the Borough with the | southern Boundary of Number 1 Warbreck | Ward as hereinbefore described, thence following the Borough Boundary commencing in an easterly and a south-easterly direction to the intersection of a straight line drawn due east of the eastern end of Mere Road, thence westward successively along the said straight line and the centre of Mere Road to the eastern Boundary of Number 5 Brunswick Ward as hereinbefore described, thence northward and following successively the eastern Boundaries of Number 5 Brunswick Ward, Number 4 Bank Hey Ward, and Number 3 Talbot Ward, and the southern Boundaries of Number 2 Claremont Ward, and Number 1 Warbreck Ward, as hereinbefore described, respectively, to the point of commencement aforesaid.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commis-sioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 14th day of January, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say:--

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Rawmarsh, in the County of York, and in the Diocese of Sheffield, between that Benefice and five other Benefices, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Northfield, in the said County of York, and in the said Diocese of Sheffield, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Hornsea, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of of Sculcoates, the Benefice (being a Vicarage), Owthorne, of all \mathbf{three} of which Benefices are situate in the said County of York, and in the Diocese of York, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Thrapston, which said last-named Benefice is situate in the County of Northampton, and in the Diocese of Peterborough, (which five Benefices are hereinafter called 'the said five Bene-

fices'). "Whereas the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Rawmarsh and each of the said five Benefices is vested in Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, and is exercised on behalf of Your Majesty by the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for

the time being. "And whereas the present endowments of the said Benefice of Rawmarsh include the sum of £21,360 15s. 8d. India three pounds per centum per annum Stock held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in trust for and for the benefit of the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Rawmarsh.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said five Benefices are at present insufficiently endowed; and that after the transfer to or for the benefit of the Incumbents of the said five Benefices of the sums of India Three pounds per centum per annum Stock hereinafter mentioned the said Benefice of Rawmarsh will still be sufficiently endowed.

"And whereas the Right Honourable Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane, now " And

Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, has represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the Cure of Souls within the Parishes of the said five Benefices by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of Rawmarsh which is hereinafter recommended and proposed. "And whereas the said Benefice of Raw-

marsh is now vacant, the late Incumbent thereof being the Reverend Theophilus Percy Ring, in whose favour an annual pension of £475 is payable out of the income of the Benefice.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, acting as Bishop of the Diocese within which the said Benefice of Rawmarsh and the said Benefice of Northfield are situate, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and with the consent of the Right and Most Reverend Cosmo Honourable Gordon, Archbishop of York, acting as the Bishop of the Diocese within which each of the said three Benefices of Hornsea, Sculcoates and Owthorne are situate, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Archiepiscopal Seal), and with the consent of the Right Reverend and Honourable Edward Carr, Bishop of Peterborough, acting as the Bishop of the Diocese in which the said Benefice of Thrapston is situate, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), and with the consent of the said Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as such Patron as aforesaid of the said Benefice of Rawmarsh; and of the said five Benefices, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), We, the said Eccle-siastical Commissioners, humbly recomand propose that, with or assurance in mend \mathbf{and} withoutany conveyance \mathbf{the} law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and as from the day of the date upon which any such Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the sum of £3,333 6s. 8d. India Three pounds per centum per annum Stock, being a portion of the afore-said sum of £21,360 15s. 8d. India Three pounds per centum per annum Stock, shall cease to form part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Rawmarsh, and shall be held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in trust for, and for the benefit of, the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Northfield, and as part of the endowments of that Benefice, and as from the day of the date on which the aforesaid annual pension of £475 shall cease to be payable to the said Theophilus Percy Ring two further sums each of £3,333 6s. 8d. India Three pounds per centum per annum Stock, and one further sum of £5,000 of the same Stock, and one further sum of $\pounds 1,666$ 13s. 4d. of the same Stock out of the same aforesaid sum of £21,360 15s. 8d. of the same Stock shall cease to form part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Rawmarsh, and shall be held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as to one such sum of £3,333 6s. 8d. of the said Stock in trust for, and for the benefit of, the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hornsea and as part of the

endowments of that Benefice, and as to the other such sum of £3,333 6s. 8d. of the said Stock in trust for and for the benefit of the Incumbent of the said benefice of Thrapston and as part of the endowments of that Benefice, and as to the said sum of £5,000 of the said Stock in trust for and for the benefit of the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sculcoates and as part of the endowments of that and as to the said sum Benefice, of £1,666 13s. 4d. of the said Stock in trust for and for the benefit of the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Owthorne and as part of the endowments of that Benefice.

"And provided always that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said Benefice of Rawmarsh shall continue to be payable by the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been ap-

proved by His Majesty in Council. Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order he forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said Dioceses of Sheffield, York and Peterborough.

W HEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is provided that, in case it appears to His Majesty in Council, upon the Representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any City or Town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any City or Town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in any City or Town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such City or Town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and

the numbers, thence following the

so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such Representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parishes affected by such Representation, one month before such Representation is so considered: Provided also that no such Representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any Parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such Representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such Parish.

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Althorpe with Keadby, in the County of Lincoln (Parts of Lindsey), ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Althorpe aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed.

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 7th day of January, 1915, notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 18th day of February, 1915, and that the said Order in Council be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 18th day of February, 1915.

And whereas the said Order in Council of the 7th day of January, 1915, has been duly published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed in the manner directed by the said Order.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the opening of any new burial ground in the said Civil Parish of Althorpe, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, be, and the same is hereby, prohibited, and that burials in the said Parish be discontinued as follows, viz. :---

ALTHORPE.—Forthwith and entirely in the Church of Saint Oswald, in the Parish of Althorpe with Keadby, in the County of Lincoln (Parts of Lindsey); and in the two Churchyards attached thereto, with the following exceptions, that is to say:—

(1) In the case of the Churchyard in which the said Church is situate the burial may be allowed of the body of the widow of the late William Gregory Harxley, at her decease, in the walled family grave now existing in such Churchyard, subject to the condition that the coffin containing the body be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(2) (a) In the case of the Churchyard situate immediately to the north-west of the said Church, and abutting on the main street of the Village of Althorpe, the burial may be

allowed in the walled grave belonging, or reputed to belong, to James Stephenson, and in the two walled graves constructed in the years-1859 and 1866 respectively, and belonging, or reputed to belong, to John Thomas Brown,. of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such. graves, subject in each case to the condition. that the coffin containing the body be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork: properly cemented; and

(b) In the last-mentioned Churchyard the burial may be allowed of the bodies of George Middleton and Jane Middleton, at their decease, in a grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, and which has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject in each case to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a. depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

HEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 3rd day of February, 1915, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section one of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain Warlike Stores was prohibited

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:

That the Proclamation, dated the 3rd day of February, 1915, should be amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the same:

(1) That the heading of "Draw plates, jewelled, for drawing steel wire " in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates should be deleted, and there be inserted in its place "Draw plates, jewelled, for drawing steel wire, and diamonds prepared for use therein."

(2) That the following articles should be added to the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates :

Paraffin Wax;

Prussiate of Soda.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
