#### PRESENT

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. THEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of February,

1915, in the words following, viz.:—
"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alsa, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in

"And whereas by the Naval Forces Act, 1903, it is enacted that the Admiralty shall have power to raise and maintain a force to be called the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, and that any Volunteer enrolled under this Act, when serving for training affoat, or called out for actual service shall be deemed to be serving in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force within the meaning of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865:

"And whereas we deem it expedient, under the authority conferred on us by the said Naval Forces Act, 1903, to establish temporarily a

rank of Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve Officer

to be entitled Dental Surgeon:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the establishment temporarily of this rank accordingly, under the regulations set forth in the accompanying Schedule. "The Lords

Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in these proposals.

#### "SCHEDULE.

"REGULATIONS FOR THE ENTRY OF DENTAL SURGEONS FOR TEMPORARY SERVICE IN THE ROYAL NAVAL VOLUNTEER RESERVE.

"1. Relative Rank - To be that of Surgeon R.N.V.R.

" 2. Pay - To be at the rate of £1 a day.

".3. Widows Pensions, Compensation for injury and Pensions etc. and Allowances to widows, children, etc., to be on the same scale, and payable under the same conditions, as those applicable to Sur-

geons R.N.V.R." His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right

Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 47th and 48th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 65, (The New Parishes Acts and Church Building Acts Amendment Act, 1884,) duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 28th day of January, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 47th and 48th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 65, (The New Parishes Acts and Church Building Acts Amendment Act, 1884,) have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a dissolution of the District of Saint Agatha, Shoreditch, in the County of Middlesex, and in the Diocese of London.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Eler said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 10th day of May, in the year 1872, and published in the London Gazette on the 14th day of the same month, a Separate District for spiritual purposes was constituted under the New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856, or some or one of them, out of the New Parish of Saint James, Curtain Road, in the said County of Middlesex, and in the said Diocese of London, and the said District was named 'The District of Saint Agatha, Shoreditch,' and the boundaries thereof were defined in and by such Order, and were delineated on a map or plan annexed to the same.

"And whereas the boundaries of the said District, and the extent of the area included within them, are and remain the same as they were at the date of the constitution of the same District.

"And whereas by an Instrument under our Common Seal, bearing date the 14th day of November, in the year 1872, and published in the London Gazette on the 22nd day of the same month, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, did grant to the Minister or Incumbent of the said District, and to his Successors, Ministers or Incumbents of the same District, one yearly sum or stipend of 200l. to be payable out of the Common Fund under our control.

"And whereas no Church or Chapel has been provided for or allotted to the said District of

Saint Agatha, Shoreditch.

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council, bearing date the 19th day of March, in the year 1908, and published in the London Gazette on the following day, the whole right of patronage of the said District of Saint Agatha, Shoreditch, was vested in the Bishop of London, and his Successors, for ever.

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would be expedient that the said District should now be dissolved in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and pro-

posed.

And whereas the Incumbency of the said District is now full, the Reverend Everard Digby, Clerk in Holy Orders, being the present Minister thereof.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of the said Diocese of London, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as and from the day upon which the said Everard Digby shall cease to be Incumbent or Minister of the said District of Saint Agatha, Shoreditch, the said District shall be dissolved, and that as and from the same day the whole of the area of such District, as the same was defined and set forth in the Order in Council and in the map or plan above-mentioned, and as the same area is set forth and delineated on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall be re-incorporated into the said New Parish of Saint James, Curtain Road, and shall again become and be and form part of such New Parish.

"And we further recommend and propose that, as and from the day of the date of such dissolution of the said District, and without any other assurance in law, the said yearly sum or stipend of 2001. so provided as aforesaid for the said District, and payable out of our Common Fund to the Minister of the said District, shall absolutely cease and determine and shall return to and again become absolutely vested in us the said Commissioners in as full and ample a manner as if the said yearly sum

or stipend had not been granted.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint James, Curtain Road, and to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the District of Saint Agatha, Shoreditch.

And whereas the Patron and the Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint James, Curtain Road, and the Patron of the District of Saint Agatha, Shoreditch, have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme or have offered no objections thereto.

And whereas the Incumbent of the District of Saint Agatha, Shoreditch, has offered certain

objections to the same Scheme.

And whereas notwithstanding these objections the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the day upon which the said Everard Digby shall cease to be Incumbent or Minister of the said District of Saint Agatha, Shoreditch. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

### BRISTOL PIGGERIES (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in. them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Premises to which this Order applies.

- 1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the city of Bristol to which this Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said city and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.
- (2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.
- (3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Restrictions on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

Movement of Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected Place and their movement not being prohibited by Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from

- any premises to which this Order applies to any slaughter-house for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as amended by the Swine-Fever Order of 1911, authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Bristol, which licence shall be in force for not more than eight days, inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.
- (3.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (4.) A copy of a licence which authorises movement of swine to premises in a District other than the District of the Local Authority of the city of Bristol shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.
- 5.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and shall, after their arrival at the slaughter-house, be there detained until they are slaughtered.
- (6.) During the movement the swine shall not be permitted to come in contact with swine not marked in manner prescribed by this Article.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used for Conveyance of Swine.

- 4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose as follows:
  - (i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine, or their droppings, have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then
  - (ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
  - (iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this Article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

## Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

- 5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this Order applies, if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of Bristol, under this Order or under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as the case may be. The licence shall be in force for not more than eight days, inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.
- (3.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.
- (5.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (6.) Swine while detained on premises to which this Order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

#### Licences after Completion of Movement.

7. A licence under this Order authorising movement of swine to any premises shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

#### Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Offences.

- 9.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Interpretation.

- 10. In this Order-
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
- "Swine-Fever Infected Place" means a place for the time being declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Place under any Order of the Board:
- "Slaughter-house" includes bacon-factory. Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

#### Commencement

11. This Order shall come into operation on the eighth day of March, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

12. This Order may be cited as the Bristol Piggeries (Swine-Fever) Order of 1915.

Application of Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 with Modifications.

- 1.—(1.) The provisions of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), as modified by the Swine-Fever Order of 1911, shall apply to the Scheduled Area described in the First Schedule hereto, but subject to the modifications hereinafter contained: Provided that the provisions of the principal Order relating to an Infected Area shall not apply to any part of the Scheduled Area, unless such part is for the time being declared by Order of the Board to be, or form part of, a Swine-Fever Infected Area.
- (2.) The Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1914 (Declaration substituted for licence in case of Movement of Swine Intended for Immediate Slaughter) shall, so long as the same remains in force, apply to the provisions of this Order.

### Regulation of Movement of Swine from Markets.

- 2.—(1.) The movement of swine from any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area described in the First Schedule hereto shall be subject to the following provisions of this Order.
- (2.) In the case of swine moved into the market, fairground or saleyard from premises outside the Scheduled Area with a licence (Form A), the provisions of Article 4 of the principal Order shall apply to the subsequent movement of the swine:
- (3.) But if the market or saleyard is specially authorised by the Local Authority under the principal Order or the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904, the movement of swine from the market or saleyard shall be subject to the provisions of Article 5 of the principal Order, as modified by the Swine-Fever Order of 1911 and the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1914.
- (4.) In the case of any other movement of swine from a market, fairground or saleyard the movement shall be subject to the following conditions:—
  - (i.) The swine shall be accompanied by a licence (Form C) granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the market, fairground or saleyard is situate.
  - (ii.) If the place of destination is outside the Scheduled Area it must be a bacon factory or slaughterhouse.
  - (iii.) The swine shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination except to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse, and only if accompanied by a licence (Form C) authorising such movement granted by an

Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are detained.

- (iv.) Swine moved with a licence under this Article to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.
- (v.) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.

#### Regulation of Markets, &c., in Scheduled Area.

3. No sale of swine shall be held in any market, fairground or saleyard in the Scheduled Area described in the Schedule hereto unless it is authorised by the Local Authority of the District under this Order (which authority the Local Authority are hereby empowered to grant), or is specially authorised under the principal Order or the Swine-Fever (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1904.

### Effect of Licences, &c., granted under this Order.

4. No licence or declaration shall be required under the principal Order for the movement into a Scheduled Area, or along, over, or across a highway or thoroughfare in a Swine-Fever Infected Area, of swine which are being moved under and in accordance with a licence under this Order.

#### Forms.

5. The Forms referred to in this Order are the Forms set forth in the First Schedule to the principal Order, as modified by the Swine-Fever Order of 1911.

#### Saving of certain existing Local Orders.

6. Nothing in this Order shall affect the operation of any existing local Order declaring certain parts of the Scheduled Area to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area, or affect the

operation of the Tilbury Allotment Gardens (Swine-Fever) Order of 1908, or of the Halstead District (Swine-Fever) Orders of 1912.

#### Revocation of Orders.

7. The Orders described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

#### Commencement.

8. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of March, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

#### Short Title, &c.

9. This Order may be cited as the ESSEX (SWINE-FEVER) ORDER OF 1915, and shall in relation to the Scheduled Area be read as part of the principal Order.

Priotage stations established at certain Ports on account of defensive Minefields.

Former Notice.—No. 16 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

With reference to the extension of the system of Mine defence, notice is hereby given that Pilotage is now compulsory at the following ports for all vessels (including fishing vessels) which have a draught of over eight feet, and that it is highly dangerous for any vessel to enter or leave such ports without a pilot. Outward bound vessels should steer to pass the longitude of 3° W. in latitude 56° 06′ 30° N., then shape course to pass between Anstruther Wester and the Isle of May.

The above orders apply to vessels proceeding to any port in the Firth of Forth, whether to the eastward of Inchkeith or not.

(2) MORAY FIRTH.—All vessels bound to Cromarty or Inverness must call for a pilot at Wick or Burghead.

Outgoing vessels are to discharge their pilots at one or the other of these places.

It is dangerous for any vessel to be under way to the south-westward of a line joining Findhorn and Tarbetness without a pilot.

(3) Scapa Flow.—All entrances are dangerous.

Examination services have been established in the entrances to Hoxa and Hoy sounds: vessels wishing to enter must communicate with the Examination vessel and follow the instructions received from her very carefully.

The only vessels permitted to enter Hoy sound from the westward are those bound for Stromness: vessels cannot enter Scapa Flow from Stromness.
