NATIONAL INSURANCE ACTS, 1911 TO
1913.

LEEDS.

Whereas the Lord Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens of the City of Leeds (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the said City, have made application to the Local Government Board for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and Section 59 of the Local Government Act, 1888, to partially repeal, alter, or amend the Leeds Corporation (Consolidation) Act, 1905, and the Leeds (Extension) Order, 1912, which was confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 12) Act, 1912, so as:—

(1) To abolish the Consolidated and Highway Rates now leviable in the City of Leeds, and to provide for the charging of all expenses at present payable out of those Rates to the City Fund and City Rate;

(2) To enable the Corporation to establish and contribute towards a fund for the encouragement of thrift amongst their officers and servants, and to make provisions with respect to such Fund;

(3) To extend the limits of the Corporation for the supply of gas by the inclusion therein of the township of Thorner, in the Wetherby Rural District;

(4) To remove the limitation contained in Section 46 of the said Act as to the amount of rebate which may be allowed by the Corporation to gas consumers, or to repeal that section and confer further powers upon the Corporation for the supply of gas by agreement; and

(5) For the several purposes of the application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make such provision with reference to exemptions, allowances or deductions from rates and otherwise, and such other alterations or amendments of the said Local Act and Order, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said City as may be necessary or desirable;

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

Notice is hereby given, that R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the said Board, will attend at the Town Hall, Leeds, on Thursday, the eighteenth day of March, 1915, at a quarter past ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.
