His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the appointment of the undermentioned Officers to be Companions of the Distinguished Service Order, in recognition of their gallantry whilst serving with the Expeditionary Force:—

Major and Brevet Lieutenant-Colonel Ernest Brandon Macnaghten, 30th Battery, Royal Field Artillery.

For conspicuous gallantry and ability on 25th January, 1915, during the attack by Germans on the village of Givenchy. Whilst exposed to very heavy fire he obtained valuable information as to the enemy's position, which resulted in the prevention of supports reaching them.

Major William Harley Macalpine-Leny, 115th Battery, Royal Garrison Artillery.

For conspicuous ability and courage at Wulverghem on 24th and 27th January, 1915, when he succeeded in destroying houses occupied by the enemy by the fire of his battery, during which period he had to observe the firing of his guns from a very exposed position.

Major Charles Howard Foulkes, 11th Field Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry in assisting to rescue a wounded man under heavy fire, and for very valuable services rendered at Cuinchy in placing in a state of defence the position which was captured from the enemy on 6th February, 1915.

Lieutenant Malcolm Roy Wingate, 26th Field Company, Royal Engineers.

For conspicuous gallantry on numerous occasions under dangerous conditions, especially at Givenchy on 27th January, 1915, when he led a small party and blew in the head of the enemy's sap at the White House.

Captain Arthur Leigh-Bennett, 2nd Battalion, Coldstream Guards.

For conspicuous gallantry at Cuinchy on 1st February, 1915. Leading his men with great ability against the enemy, he stopped their advance, and eventually captured their position.

Major William Oxenham Cautley, 3rd Battalion, The Suffolk Regiment, attached to

1st Battalion, The Northamptonshire Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry on 22nd December, 1914, near La Quinque Rue, when he handled his men with great skill under very critical circumstances.

Captain (temporary) Hugh Maxwell Broome Salmon, 1st Battalion, The South Wales Borderers.

For conspicuous courage at Givenchy on 25th January, 1915. Although wounded, he brought up men from the local Reserves under heavy fire on two occasions, and remained throughout the day with his Company in action.

Captain Hugh Mortimer Travers, The Royal Munster Fusiliers, attached 2nd Battalion, The Duke of Wellington's (West Riding Regiment).

For conspicuous gallantry and ability on the 8th November, 1914, near Ypres, in organizing an attack and re-capturing a trench from the enemy, and subsequently for leading a second attack and capturing another position 50 yards further to the front.

Captain Travers was killed whilst maintaining his post on this occasion.

Lieutenant Eric Christian Lang, Royal Army Medical Corps, attached 1st Battalion, The Leicestershire Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on two occasions, especially on 9th February, 1915, at Rue Du Bois, in rescuing a severely wounded Officer under very difficult circumstances whilst in full view of the enemy.

Second Lieutenant Edward Wingfield Shaw, 1st Battalion, The Duke of Cambridge's Own (Middlesex Regiment).

For conspicuous gallantry on 30th October, 1914, at La Boutillerie.

In leading a part of his platoon to recover a lost trench he was wounded and compelled to retire, but, collecting another party, he went forward again to the attack, and entered the enemy's trench, being wounded a second time in so doing.

As a result of his action the trench was recovered, 30 of the enemy being killed or wounded, and the remainder taken prisoners.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Military Cross on the undermentioned Officers, in recognition of their gallantry whilst serving with the Expeditionary Force:—

Second Lieutenant J. A. H. Gammell, 114th Battery, Royal Field Artillery.

For gallantry and marked ability at Cuinchy on the 10th January, 1915, when in the forward artillery observation station, and for leaving his trench under fire on two occasions to repair telephone wires.

Second Lieutenant F. B. B. Spragge, 25th Brigade, Royal Field Artillery.

For conspicuous gallantry and ability at Cuinchy on 10th January, 1915. Although wounded in the head whilst in the forward observation station, he remained at his post, carrying out his duties with great coolness.

Lieutenant R. St. J. Blacker Douglass, late 1st Battalion, Irish Guards.

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in continuing to lead an attack after he had been wounded. He was killed in this attack.

Second Lieutenant A. C. W. Innes, 1st Battalion, Irish Guards (Special Reserve).

For conspicuous gallantry and ability at Cuinchy on 1st February, 1915. When all the Officers of the attacking company had been put out of action, this Officer was sent forward to take command. Leading his men he captured the enemy's post, and then advancing a further 60 yards captured another.

Lieutenant J. F. Rutledge, 2nd Battalion, The Prince of Wales's Own (West Yorkshire Regiment).

For great coolness and gallantry on 19th December, 1914, near Neuve Chapelle. When his company were moving over open ground under very heavy fire many casualties occurred, and Lieutenant Rutledge remained to the last helping the wounded away to cover.

Second Lieutenant W. H. Hodges, 1st Battalion, The Gloucestershire Regiment.

For gallantry and coolness on 25th January, 1915, at Givenchy, when he succeeded in holding a position after his senior Officers had been killed.

Second Lieutenant H. G. de L. Bush, 3rd Battalion, The Gloucestershire Regiment, attached to 1st Battalion.

For gallantry at Givenchy on 25th January, 1915. When one of his machine guns with its complement of men had been buried by a shell, he succeeded under heavy fire in digging out the men and gun and brought them into action again.

Second Lieutenant C. E. H. James, 3rd Battalion, The Border Regiment, attached 2nd Battalion, The Welsh Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry at Givenchy on 25th January, 1915, when he led 15 men into the enemy's trench and captured 40 Germans.

Lieutenant R. Leicester, 3rd Battalion, The Dorsetshire Regiment, attached 2nd Battalion, The Welsh Regiment.

For gallantry and resource in regaining a trench which he had been compelled to abandon previously.

Lieutenant W. H. C. Edwards, 1st Battalion, The Black Watch (Royal Highlanders).

For gallantry on the 25th January, 1915, at Givenchy, in rendering effective assistance with his platoon in the re-capture of the village trench, and driving the enemy from the village.

Second Lieutenant T. C. Fulton, 3rd Battalion, The Northamptonshire Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry on 22nd December, 1914, near Bethune. When partially isolated by the withdrawal of troops on his flank, he succeeded in holding the post. On the next day Second Lieutenant Fulton went in front of his trench for 200 yards and assisted in the rescue of a wounded man.

Second Lieutenant C. H. Carrigan, 2nd Battalion, The Royal Munster Fusiliers.

For gallantry and resource at Givenchy on 25th January, 1915, in handling his machine guns effectively against the advancing enemy. Being compelled to retire, he extricated his guns under heavy fire and brought them into action again 300 yards to the rear.

Lieutenant A. J. S. Hammans, 1st Battalion, The Duke of Cornwall's Light Infantry.

For gallantry and coolness on 16th December, 1914, in filling in a trench 100 yards from the enemy, being under a heavy fire for a period of three hours.

Second Lieutenant L. T. Despicht, 4th Battalion, The Bedfordshire Regiment, attached 2nd Battalion, The South Staffordshire Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry at Givenchy on 20th February, 1915, when, in command of the Right storming party, he was almost buried by a German shell.

After being extricated he was immediately shot, but crawled to the enemy's parapet, and there continued to conduct operations.

Second Lieutenant C. H. Humphreys, East Anglian Field Company, Royal Engineers (Territorial Force).

For conspicuous gallantry at Givenchy on 20th February, 1915, when, leading the Royal Engineers, which accompanied a storming party, he was wounded by shrapnel in the first few yards of the advance, but continued with his men into the German trench and assisted in driving them out with bombs.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the award of the Distinguished Conduct Medal to the undermentioned Warrant Officers, Non-commissioned Officers and Men for acts of gallantry and devotion to duty in the Field:—
