At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 18th day of March, 1915.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

AND WHEREAS by a Proclamation, dated the 3rd day of February, 1915, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section one of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain Warlike Stores was prohibited:

And whereas by an Order of Council, dated the 2nd day of March, 1915, the said Procla-

mation was amended and added to in certain. particulars:

AND WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 3rd day of February, 1915, as amended and added to-by the said Order of Council, dated the 2nd day of March, 1915, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the same:—

(1) That the heading "Thorium nitrate" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations should be deleted, and there should be substituted therefor the heading "Thorium oxide, thorium nitrate, and other salts of thorium."

(2) That the heading "Salicylic acid and Salicylate of soda" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations should be deleted, and there be substituted therefor the heading "Salicylic acid, Salicylate of soda and Methyl salicylate."

(3) That the following article should be added to the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations:—

Sheepgut.

(4) That the heading "All vegetable oils (other than linseed oil, boiled and unboiled, unmixed with other oil, and not including essential oils)" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Posses-

sions and Protectorates should be deleted, and there be substituted therefor the heading "Oils, all vegetable, and fats (other than linseed oil, boiled and unboiled, unmixed with other oil and not including essential oils").

(5) That the heading "Oleo oil, Premier jus, and animal tallow" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates should be deleted, and there be substituted therefor the heading "All animal oils and fats."

- (6) That the heading "Rubber (including waste and reclaimed rubber) and goods made wholly of rubber, including tyres for motor vehicles and for cycles, together with articles or materials especially adapted for use in the manufacture or repair of tyres" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates should be deleted, and there be substituted therefor the heading "Rubber (including raw, waste and reclaimed rubber, solutions containing rubber, jellies containing rubber, or any other preparations containing rubber) and goods made wholly of rubber; including tyres for motor vehicles and for cycles, together with articles or materials especially adapted for use in the
- manufacture or repair of tyres."

 (7) That the heading "Sheepskins, woolled, i.e., with the wool left on" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates should be deleted, and there be substituted therefor the heading "Sheepskins, whether woolled or not."
- (8) That the heading "Vessels, boats and craft of all kinds (including floating docks) and their distinctive component parts" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates should be deleted, and that there be substituted therefor the words "Vessels, boats and craft of all kinds; floating docks and their distinctive component parts."

their distinctive component parts."
(9) That the following articles should be added to the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates:—

Chemicals, drugs, medicinal and pharmaceutical preparations:

Ammonia and its salts, whether simple or compound, other than ammonium nitrate, perchlorate and sulphocyanide (the exportation of which is already prohibited to all destinations).

Ammonia liquor.

The compounds of aniline, except aniline salt (the exportation of which is already prohibited to all destinations).

Chloride of Tin. Copper Iodide.

Tanning substances of all kinds (including extracts for use in tanning) except chestnut extract, oak-wood extract, and valonia (the exportation of which is already prohibited to all destinations).

Urea and its compounds. Deer skins, dressed and undressed. Goat skins, dressed and undressed. Metals and ores, namely:—

Tin and tin ore.

Neat's foot oil.

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, namely:—

- "Peas, except tinned and bottled peas and peas packed in cardboard boxes and similar receptacles."
- (10) That the heading "Goat skins, undressed," in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all foreign ports in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than those of France, Russia (except Baltic ports), Belgium, Spain and Portugal, should be deleted.
- (11) That the exportation of the following goods should be prohibited to all foreign ports in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than those of France, Russia (except Baltic ports), Spain and Portugal:—

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, namely:—

Compressed and desiccated soups.

Now, THEREFORE, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by Section 21 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more Benefices which have been heretofore united, or which may be hereafter united, under the provisions of this Act should be disunited," it is, amongst other things, enacted "that when two or more Benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one Benefice, and, with respect to his own Diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the Benefices within his Diocese, of which such United Benefice shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall inquire into the circumstances of the case, and, if on such Inquiry, it shall appear to him that such Union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such Benefice or Benefices, he shall, six weeks at least before certifying such Inquiry to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese a Statement in Writing of the facts, and in all other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation, to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the Church or in some public and conspicuous place

in each of the Benefices forming part of the United Benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such Disunion, and, if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent, when the Patron's Consent is necessary, to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned Benefice or Benefices from such United Benefice, and for declaring the rights of Patronage of the several Patrons, if there be more than one Patron, and such Order shall be registered in the Registry of the Diocese to which such United Benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar of such Diocese, immediately on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon immediately, if such United Benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such Union shall be, ipso facto, dissolved, so far only as regards such Benefice or Benefices so proposed to be separated from such United Benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such last-mentioned Benefice or Benefices shall be, and be deemed and taken to be, a separate and distinct Benefice or Benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such Union had taken place, and the Patron or Patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or nominate thereto respectively, and so, from time to time, upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always, that no Benefices which have been united for more than sixty years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited without the Consent in writing of the Patron or Patrons thereof."

And whereas by Section 23 of the said Act it is further enacted that "Whenever two or more Benefices which have at any time been united into one Benefice shall be disunited and become separate Benefices under the provisions of this Act, whether the Order for Disunion shall extend to the whole number of Benefices of which such united Benefice consisted, or to one or more of such Benefices only, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council on the recommendation of the Archbishop of the Province, with the Consent of the Patron or Patrons of such Benefices respectively, (such Consent to be signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons), to assign and attach such portion of the glebe lands, tithes, moduses, rent-charges or other endowments or emoluments belonging to or arising or accruing within the limits of such United Benefice to each of such Benefices respectively as to His Majesty in Council shall seem fit, notwithstanding such proportion of glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, moduses, or other endowments or emoluments, or any part thereof, may not arise or accrue within the limits of the Benefice to which the same shall be so assigned and attached as aforesaid, or may not have belonged thereto, and also to divide and apportion between such Benefices all such charges and outgoings as before the Disunion thereof were imposed upon the whole United Benefice, and in the case of mortgages with the Consent of the mortgagees in writing under their hands and seals.'

And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Lee, Lord Bishop of Lincoln, hath made a

Representation in writing, dated the 13th day of February, 1914, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord

Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—
"I, Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, do hereby represent to your Grace that it appears to me that the Disunion of the United Benefice consisting of the Vicarage of Ulceby and the Rectory of Croxton, in the County and my Diocese of Lincoln, by the separation of the said Rectory of Croxton from the said Vicarage of Ulceby, may be made with advantage to the interests of religion.

"EDWARD, LINCOLN."

And whereas, on the 25th day of February, 1914, the said Archbishop inquired into the circumstances of the case.

And whereas the said Bishop did, by a further Representation in writing, dated the 7th day of March, 1914, furnish to the said Archbishop a Statement of Circumstances as

"Whereas your Grace having inquired of me, Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, what are the circumstances of the case upon which I found my opinion that the Disunion of the United Benefice consisting of the Vicarage of Ulceby and the Rectory of Croxton, both in the County and my Diocese of Lincoln, by the separation of the Rectory of Croxton from the Vicarage of Ulceby, may be made with advantage to the interests of religion, I do hereby represent to your Grace that the following are

the circumstances:—
"That the Parish of Ulceby is separate from Croxton for all civil purposes, and that the distance between the said Benefices, computing such distance from the Church of Ulceby to the Church of Croxton, is 21 miles or thereabouts.

'That according to the Census of 1911 the population of Ulceby is 947 persons, and that according to the same Census the population

of Croxton is 119 persons.
"That the net yearly income arising from the said United Benefice, on an average of the last three years, is £416 10s. 7d. or thereabouts, and that the sources from which such income is derived are as follows:—Ulceby, £282 14s. 7d. or thereabouts, arising from Glebe Lands, Allotments, Fees and an annual charge of £170 upon the revenues of the Rectory of Croxton created by an Order in Council dated the 13th day of August, 1855: Croxton, £133 16s. Od. or thereabouts, arising from Glebe Land and Fees.

"That there is one Church belonging to the Parish of Ulceby affording accommodation for about 290, and there is one Church belonging to the Parish of Croxton affording accommodation for about 90 persons, and there is no other Church or Chapel of the Church of England in either of the said Parishes but there is a Mission Room with accommodation for about 80 persons in the said Parish of Ulceby.

That there is a good and sufficient House of Residence belonging to each of the said

Benefices.

"That the said United Benefice, which is now held by the Reverend Hector Mawson, is in the patronage of the Right Honourable Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty The King.

That, in the event of the said Rectory of Croxton being separated from the said Vicarage of Ulceby, it is proposed that the House of Residence situate at Ulceby shall be the House of Residence of the Vicarage of Ulceby, and that the House of Residence situate at Croxton shall be the House of Residence of the said

Rectory of Croxton.

"That, if your Grace shall be satisfied that such an apportionment will under the circumstances be right and proper, it is desired that you shall recommend to His Majesty in Council, conformably with the provisions of the 23rd Section of the Act I and 2 Victoria, Chapter 106, that His Majesty in Council do assign and attach to the said Vicarage of Ulceby all the following pieces or parcels of land, situate in the Parish of Croxton aforesaid, and now belonging to and forming part of the endowments of the said Rectory of Croxton, namely:—

together with a right of way over and along the south-eastern side of Field numbered 39 which said pieces or parcels of land and right of way are delineated and set forth in the Map or Plan hereto annexed, and thereon coloured yellow, subject to all charges and outgoings in respect thereof, such assignment to be in lieu of and substitution for the aforesaid charge of £170 per annum which is now payable out of the income of the said Rectory of Croxton to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Vicarage of Ulceby, under the provisions of the aforesaid Order in Council of the 13th day of August, 1855, such charge to utterly cease and determine: And further that His Majesty in Council do order that the whole of the outstanding Mortgage Debts upon the United Benefice of Ulceby with Croxton, and amounting to £31 9s. 1d. and £19 9s. 1d. respectively, due to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne shall be a debt or charge upon the Glebe and Revenues of the said Benefice of Croxton exclusively, and that the said Vicarage of Ulceby shall be exempted from all liability to pay the said debts or any part thereof: That the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, as such Mortgagees as aforesaid, do consent to such recommendation, as appears by an Instrument in writing under their Common Seal hereunto annexed: In all other respects the said Vicarage of Ulceby and the said Rectory of Croxton shall each retain its own original endowments and emoluments, and bear its own charges and outgoings.

"That this proposed Disunion forms part of an intended rearrangement of certain Benefices in my said Diocese, which rearrangement when carried into effect will be an advantage to the interests of religion, as it will make better provision for the growing population in certain districts not now ecclesiastically well served: For this reason it appears to me that the Disunion of the said United Benefice of Croxton and Ulceby will be an advantage to the interests of religion.

"That the said Right Honourable Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty The King as such Patron as aforesaid, consents to such Disunion, and to the several matters and things above proposed, as appears by an Instrument in writing under his hand hereunto annexed.

And whereas on the 29th day of June, 1914, the said Archbishop certified to His Majesty in Council as follows:—

"We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas,
Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury,
Primate of all England and Metropolitan, do
hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council:—

"That the Right Reverend Edward Lee, Lord Bishop of Lincoln, in whose Diocese is situate the United Benefice consisting of the Vicarage of Ulceby and the Rectory of Croxton, in the County of Lincoln, having represented unto us that the Disunion of the said United Benefice, by the separation of the Rectory of Croxton from the Vicarage of Ulceby, may be made with advantage to the interests of religion, we inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such Union might usefully be dissolved, and that the Right Honourable Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty The King being the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said United Benefice of Ulceby with Croxton in case the same were now vacant, consents to the proposed Disunion.

"That six weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation to be affixed to the principal outer doors of each of the Parish Churches of Ulceby and Croxton with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands to us the said Archbishop against 'such Disunion, but no sufficient cause has been shown.

"The Representation of the said Lord Bishop of Lincoln, our Inquiry into the circumstances of the case, the Statement of Circumstances in reply thereto, the Consent in writing of the said Patron of the said United Benefice, and the Copies of the Representation and Notices before mentioned, are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the Inquiry and Consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for

think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for the Disunion of the said United Benefice by the separation of the Rectory of Croxton from the

Vicarage of Ulceby, so as to constitute each of them a separate Benefice with Cure of Souls for ecclesiastical purposes only, and we recommend that the House of Residence situate at Ulceby shall be the House of Residence of the Vicarage of Ulceby, and that the House of Residence situate at Croxton shall be the House of Residence of the Rectory of Croxton: And we further recommend that there be assigned and attached to the Vicarage of Ulceby all those pieces or parcels of land containing 146a. 1r. 16p., with the appurtenances situate in the Parish of Croxton, and now belonging to and forming part of the endowments of the Rectory of Croxton, as the same are more particularly described in the before mentioned Statement of Circumstances, such assignment to be in lieu of and substitution for the charge of £170 per annum as therein mentioned, and also that the whole of the outstanding mortgage debts upon the United Benefice of Ulceby with Croxton, and amounting to £31 9s. 1d. and £19 9s. 1d. respectively, due to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, shall be a debt or charge upon the Glebe and Revenues of the said Benefice of Croxton exclusively, and that the said Vicarage of Ulceby shall be exempted from all liability to pay the said debts or any part thereof: In all other respects the said Vicarage of Ulceby and the said Rectory of 'Croxton shall each retain its own original endowments and emoluments, and bear its own charges and outgoings.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said United Benefice, consisting of the Vicarage of Ulceby and the Rectory of Croxton, situate in the County and Diocese of Lincoln, shall be disunited by separating the said Vicarage of Ulceby from the said Rectory of Croxton.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased, on the recommendation of the said Archbishop, with the consent of the Patron, to direct that the House of Residence situate at Ulceby shall be the House of Residence of the said Vicarage of Ulceby, and that the House of Residence situate at Croxton shall be the House of Residence of the said Rectory of Croxton, and to assign and attach to the said Vicarage of Ulceby all those pieces or parcels of land containing 146a. 1r. 16p., with the appurtenances situate in the Parish of Croxton, and now belonging to and forming part of the endowments of the said Rectory of Croxton, as the same are more particularly described in the hereinbefore mentioned Statement of Circumstances, such assignment to be in lieu of, and substitution for, the charge of £170 per annum as therein mentioned, and also that the whole of the outstanding mortgage debts upon the United Benefice of Ulceby with Croxton, and amounting to £31 9s. 1d. and £19 9s. 1d. respectively, due to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, shall be a debt or charge upon the Glebe and Revenues of the said Benefice of Croxton exclusively, and that the said Vicarage of Ulceby shall be exempted from all liability to pay the said debts or any part thereof.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice aforesaid, is further pleased to direct that in all other respects the said Vicarage of Ulceby and the said Rectory of Croxton shall each retain its own original endowments and emoluments, and bear its own charges and outgoings.

The KING has been pleased to approve of the award of the Albert Medal of the Second Class for saving life on land to Mr. James Julian Carter, a brakeman of the Canadian Pacific Railway, in recognition of his gallantry in saving the life of a little girl named Violet Freeman at Tweed, Ontario, on the 10th May, 1914.

On the day in question Carter was on the engine of a train running between Havelock and Smith's Falls in the Province of Ontario. The train was rounding a curve near Tweed at a speed of about 18 miles an hour, when Carter, who was on the inside of the curve, saw the child trying to cross the line 200 feet ahead. He shouted to the driver to stop, and immediately made his way along the footboard to

the "pilot" on the front of the engine. Realising that the train, the speed of which had been reduced to about 8 miles an hour, could not be pulled up in time, he jumped from the engine, and, rushing forward, just succeeded in rescuing the child, falling with her into the ditch at the side of the line. The train was stopped when the engine and 8 coaches had passed the spot where the child was rescued.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 17TH MARCH 1915.)

MITCHAM PIGGERIES (SWINE FEVER) ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Premises to which this Order applies.

1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the premises described in the Schedule hereto, and also to any other premises in the parish of Mitcham, in the administrative county of Surrey, to which the Order may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority of the said county, as the case may be, and served upon the occupier of the premises described in such Notice.

- (2.) This Order shall cease to apply to any premises upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.
- (3.) A copy of every Notice served under this Article shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

Restriction on Movement of Swine from or to Premises to which this Order applies.

2. Swine shall not, except as expressly authorised by this Order, be moved from or to any premises to which this Order applies.

Movement of Swine from Premises to which this Order applies.

- 3.—(1.) Swine (not being in a Swine-Fever Infected place and their inovement not being prohibited by notice, of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board) may be moved from any premises to which this Order applies under and in accordance with the following provisions.
- (2.) Swine may be moved to any slaughter-house for the purpose of immediate slaughter if accompanied by a licence in the Form D set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as amended by the Swine-Fever Order of 1911, authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Surrey.
- (3.) Before a licence (Form D) is granted by an Inspector under this Article the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector a declaration in the Form E set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, which shall be retained by the Inspector.
- (4.) The swine shall, before the movement is commenced, be marked by and at the expense of the owner by the painting with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each of the swine thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (5.) Swine may also be moved from any premises to which this Order applies to any other premises if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate, but no such licence shall be expressed to be granted for movement for breeding purposes.
- (6.) Before a licence (Form A) is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.

- (7.) The declaration (Form B) shall not be effective until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Surrey, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (8.) The declaration (Form B) shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.
- (9.) Swine moved with a licence (Form A) under this Article shall not, for a period of twenty-eight days after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be moved from such place of destination, except as hereinafter provided.
- (10.) Where swine are moved with a licence (Form A) to a market, fairground or sale-yard, specified in the licence, the swine shall be moved from such premises only if accompanied by a licence in the Form C set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the market, fairground or saleyard is situate and only to a slaughterhouse specified in the licence, or to the premises from which the swine were moved to the market, fairground or saleyard.
- (11.) Swine required by this Article to be detained for a period of twenty-eight days may be moved before the expiration of that period to a slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area if such movement is authorised by a licence in the Form C above mentioned granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the swine are detained, and the swine are accompanied by the licence.
- (12.) Swine while detained under this Article shall be kept separate from all other swine.
- (13.) Swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and where they are moved to a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.
- (14.) Licences granted under this Article shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (15.) No licence under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 shall be required for the movement into a Scheduled Area for the purposes of that Order of swine which are being moved under and in accordance with a licence granted under this Article.

Cleansing and Disinfection of Vehicles used for Conveyance of Swine.

- 4.—(1.) Any float, cart or van which has been used for the conveyance of swine under the preceding Article shall immediately after each occasion of such use be cleansed and disinfected by and at the expense of the person using the same for such purpose as follows:
 - (i.) The floor of the float, cart or van and all other parts thereof with which the swine or their droppings have come in contact shall be scraped and swept, and the scrapings and sweepings, and all dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter shall be effectually removed therefrom; then

- (ii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water; then
- (iii.) The same parts of the float, cart or van shall be disinfected in one of the modes prescribed by the Diseases of Animals (Disinfection) Order of 1906.
- (2.) The scrapings and sweepings, and the dung, sawdust, litter, and other matter removed under this article shall forthwith be well mixed with quicklime, and be effectually removed from contact with swine.

Movement of Swine to Premises to which this Order applies.

- 5.—(1.) Swine may be moved to any premises to which this order applies if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 authorising such movement, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Surrey, under this Order or under the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, as the case may be. The licence shall be in force for not more than eight days inclusive of the day of issue.
- (2.) Before a licence is granted by an Inspector under this Article, the owner of the swine, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, shall sign, and deliver or send by post to the Inspector, a declaration in the Form B set forth in the First Schedule to the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, countersigned as hereinafter provided.
- (3.) The declaration shall not be effective until it is countersigned by a police officer of the district where the swine are, who, before countersigning the declaration, shall, so far as is practicable, satisfy himself as to the correctness of the statements contained therein.
- (4.) The declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting the licence thereon.
- (5.) The swine moved under this Article shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay.
- (6.) Swine while detained on premises to which this order applies need not be kept separate from other swine.

Production of Licences: Names and Addresses.

- 6.—(1.) Any person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Copies of Movement Licences to be sent to Local Authority of Place of Destination.

7. A copy of a licence which authorises movement of swine to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the licence acts as Inspector shall forth-

with be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

Licences after Completion of Movement.

8.—(1.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to any market, fair-ground or saleyard the licence shall be delivered up in exchange for the licence for movement of the swine from such premises.

(2.) Where swine are moved with a licence under this Order to any premises other than a market, fairground or saleyard, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing the movement.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

9. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

10.—(1.) If a pig is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the pig, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the pig is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If a pig is not marked as required by this Order, the owner, consignee, or other person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an

offence against the Act of 1894.

- (3.) If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order in respect of the cleansing and disinfection of any float, cart or van used for the conveyance of swine, the person using the same for such purpose, or other person for the time being in charge of the float, cart or van shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any pig as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the pig, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (5.) If a person in charge of a pig being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

11. In this Order---

"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894:

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries:
