At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 23rd day of March, 1915.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 28th day of November, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to make Regulations (called the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914), under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the Realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, and the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915:

And whereas for the purpose of giving effect to the said Amending Acts, and for other purposes, it is expedient that there should be made in the said Regulations such amendments as hereinafter appear:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. After Regulation 2 the following Regulation shall be inserted:—

"It shall be lawful for the Admiralty or Army Council to take possession of any un-

occupied premises for the purpose of housing workmen employed in the production, storage, or transport of war material."

2. At the end of Regulation 7 the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

"For the purpose of ascertaining the amount of the output of any such factory or workshop or any plant therein, the Admiralty or Army Council may require the occupier of any such factory or workshop, or any officer or servant of the occupier, or where the occupier is a company any director of the company, to furnish to the Admiralty or Army Council such particulars as to such output as they may direct, and if any such person fails to comply with any such requirement he shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations."

3. For Regulation 8 the following Regulation shall be substituted:—

"The Admiralty or Army Council may take possession of any factory or workshop or of any plant belonging thereto without taking possession of the factory or workshop itself, and may use the same for His Majesty's naval or military service at such times and in such manner as the Admiralty or Army Council may consider necessary or expedient, and the occupier and every officer and servant of the occupier of the factory

or workshop, and where the occupier is a company, every director of the company, shall obey the directions of the Admiralty or Army Council as to the user of the factory or workshop or plant, and if he fails to do so he shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations."

4. After Regulation 8 the following Regulation shall be inserted:—

"8A. It shall be lawful for the Admiralty or Army Council—

(a) to require any work in any factory or workshop to be done in accordance with the directions of the Admiralty or Army Council, given with the object of making the factory or workshop or the plant or labour therein as useful as possible for the production of war material;

(b) to regulate or restrict the carrying on of work in any factory or workshop or remove the plant therefrom, with a view to increasing the production of war material in other factories or workshops,

and the occupier and every officer and servant of the occupier of the factory or workshop, and where the occupier is a company, every director of the company, shall obey the directions, regulations, or restrictions of the Admiralty or Army Council so given, and if he fails to do so he shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations."

5. At the end of the first paragraph of Regulation 14, the following proviso shall be inserted:—

"Provided that if the person with respect to whom it is proposed to make such an order as aforesaid undertakes to comply with such conditions as to reporting to the police, restriction on movements, or otherwise as may be imposed on him, the order may, instead of requiring him to cease to reside in any locality, authorise him to continue to reside therein if he complies with such conditions as to the matters aforesaid as may be specified in the order, and if any person in respect of whom such an order is made fails to comply with any such condition he shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations."

6. In Regulation 22, after the words "without the written permission of the Postmaster-General" there shall be inserted the word "make," and after the words "no person shall sell any such apparatus to any person who has not obtained such permission as aforesaid" there shall be inserted the words "and any person having in his possession or under his control any such apparatus, whether with or without the permission of the Postmaster-General, shall on demand deliver the apparatus to the Postmaster-General, or as he may direct."

In the second paragraph of the same Regulation, after the words "any apparatus for sending or receiving messages by telegraphy" there shall be inserted the words "wireless telegraphy."

7. For Regulation 24 the following Regulations shall, as from the fifth day of April nineteen hundred and fifteen, be substituted:—

24. No person shall without lawful authority transmit (otherwise than through the post) or convey, to or from the United King-

dom, or receive or have in his possession for such transmission or conveyance, any letter or any written message for any other person, and if any person contravenes this provision he shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

This Regulation shall not apply to "ship-owners' letters" as defined by section thirty of the Post Office Act, 1908, nor to any other class of letters or written messages that may be for the time being exempted by order of the Secretary of State.

"24A. If any person sends from the United Kingdom, whether by post or otherwise, any letter or other document containing any matter written in any medium which is not visible unless subjected to heat or some other treatment, he shall be guilty of any offence against these Regulations."

8. In Regulation 45 the following words shall be inserted after the words "has been duly issued":—

"or allows any other person to have possession of any pass, permit, or passport issued to him, or applies to any building, structure, premises or vehicle, any lights, letters or marks, for the time being used to indicate that buildings, structures, premises, or vehicles, to which they are applied are used for naval or military purposes, or any lights, letters or marks, so nearly resembling the same as to be calculated to deceive."

9. The following Regulation shall be substituted for Regulation 56:—

(1) Except as otherwise provided by this Regulation, a person alleged to be guilty of an offence against these Regulations may be tried either by court-martial, or by a civil court with a jury, or by a court of summary jurisdiction.

(2) Where a person is alleged to be guilty of an offence which is by these Regulations declared to be a summary offence he may be tried by a court of summary jurisdiction and not otherwise.

(3) Where a person is alleged to be guilty of an offence other than an offence declared by these Regulations to be a summary offence, the case shall be referred to the competent naval or military authority who shall forthwith investigate the case and determine whether or not the case is to be proceeded with, and if it is to be proceeded with, whether or not it is an offence of such a minor character as can adequately be dealt with by a court of summary jurisdiction.

(4) If it is determined that the case is not to be proceeded with, the alleged offender, if in custody, shall (unless he is detained on some other charge) forthwith be released.

(5) If it is determined that the case is to be proceeded with, but that the offence is of such a minor character as aforesaid, the offender may be tried by a court of summary jurisdiction and not otherwise.

(6) If it is determined that the case is to be proceeded with and that the offence is not of such a minor character as aforesaid, then—

(a) if the offender is a British subject and is not a person subject to the Naval Discipline Act or to military law, and he claims, in the manner hereinafter pro-

vided, to be tried by a civil court with a jury instead of being tried by a court-martial, the case shall be handed over, for the purposes of trial, to the civil authority;

(6) if the offender, being a British subject, does not make any such claim, or if the offender is not a British subject or is a person subject to the Naval Discipline Act or to military law, the competent naval or military authority shall, subject to any general or special instructions given by the Admiralty or Army Council, order the case to be tried by court-martial, or, where in pursuance of such instructions the case is not to be tried by court-martial, shall order it to be handed over, for purposes of trial, to the civil authority.

(7) Any case which is handed over to the civil authority may be tried by a civil court with a jury:

Provided that if on further investigation it appears to the prosecution that a case so handed over to the civil authority is of such a character as can be adequately dealt with by a court of summary jurisdiction it may, if the Admiralty or Army Council consent, or in Scotland if the Lord Advocate after consultation with the Admiralty or Army Council so directs, be so dealt with.

(8) For the purpose of enabling such a claim as aforesaid to be made, the competent naval or military authority shall, as soon as practicable after his arrest, give to the alleged offender notice in writing, in the form set out in Part I. of the Schedule to these Regulations, of the general nature of the charge and of his right (if he is a British subject and not a person subject to the Naval Discipline Act or to military law) to claim to be tried by a civil court with a jury instead of being tried by court-martial:

Provided that it shall not be necessary to give such a notice if the offence is an offence which is by these Regulations declared to be a summary offence or it has been determined that the offence is an offence of such a minor character as aforesaid.

(9) A person to whom such a notice has been given may if he is a British subject and not a person subject to the Naval Discipline Act or to military law, within six clear days from the date when it was so given to him claim to be tried by a civil court with a jury instead of being tried by court-martial by giving notice in writing to that effect to the competent naval or military authority in the form set out in Part II. of the Schedule to these Regulations.

(10) If the alleged offender is in custody he shall, if he is to be tried by court-martial, be kept in or handed over to military custody, and, if he is to be tried otherwise than by court-martial, be kept in or handed over to civil custody.

(11) In England and Ireland offences against these Regulations shall not be prosecuted before a civil court with a jury except by or with the consent of the Attorney-General for England or Ireland, as the case may be, nor before a court of summary jurisdiction by any person, other than the competent naval or military authority or a person authorised by him, or an officer of police, an officer of customs and excise, or an aliens officer, except with the consent of the

Attorney-General for England or Ireland, as the case may be.

(12) For the purposes of this Regulation the expression "British subject" includes a woman who has married an alien but who before marriage was a British subject.

10. After Regulation 56 the following Regulation shall be inserted:—

56A. Any offence tried by a civil court with a jury shall be deemed to be a felony, and on conviction of the offender he shall be liable to such punishment as might have been inflicted under Regulation 57 if the case had been tried by a general court martial.

Where sentence of death is passed by such a civil court, the court may order the sentence to be executed in any manner in which a court martial may order a sentence of death to be executed. If the manner in which the sentence is to be executed is by shooting, the court may direct that the offender be handed over to the military authority, and in such case the sentence shall be executed as if it had been passed by a court martial, but in England shall not be carried into execution until after such time as is allowed by the Criminal Appeal Act, 1907, for giving notice of appeal or notice of application for leave to appeal under that Act, nor pending such appeal or application; or in Scotland until after such date as may be specified in the sentence.

In England and Ireland a court of quarter sessions shall not have jurisdiction to try such a felony.

In Scotland the court having jurisdiction to try such a felony shall be the High Court of Justiciary.

For the purpose of the trial of a person for such a felony, the offence shall be deemed to have been committed either at the place in which the same actually was committed, or in any place in the United Kingdom in which the offender may be found, or to which he may be brought for the purpose of speedy trial.

11. In Regulation 57, after the figure "22" there shall be inserted the figure "24."

12. After Regulation 58 the following Regulation shall be inserted:—

58A. Whenever His Majesty by Proclamation suspends the operation of section one of the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, either generally or as respects any specified area, then, as respects all offences committed against these Regulations, or (as the case may be), all such offences committed within the specified area, so much of Regulation 56 as relates to trial by a civil court with a jury, and in particular paragraphs (6) to (10) thereof, shall, so long as the Proclamation remains in force, cease to have effect, without prejudice however to any proceedings under the said section which may be pending at the date of the issue of such Proclamation, and in lieu of the said paragraphs, the following provision shall have effect:—

"If it is determined that the case is to be proceeded with and that the offence is not of such a minor character as aforesaid, the case may be tried by court martial, and notwithstanding anything in Regulation 57 a field general court martial convened by an officer authorized to convene such a court martial shall have the like jurisdiction to deal with the case as in the last mentioned Regulation is conferred on a general court martial."

13. At the end of Regulation 62 the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

“For the purposes of these Regulations, the expression ‘war material’ includes arms, ammunition, warlike stores and equipment, and everything required for or in connection with the production thereof.”

14. The amendments specified in the Second

Schedule to these Regulations, which relate to minor details, shall be made in the Regulations specified in the first column of the said Schedule.

15. At the end of the Regulations there shall be inserted, as a schedule, the First Schedule hereinafter set forth.

- Regulation 30 For the words "or sale" there shall be substituted the words "sale, transfer, or disposal," after the word "sells" there shall be inserted the words "transfers or disposes of," and after the word "sale" where it secondly occurs there shall be inserted the words "transfer or disposal."
- Regulation 41 After the words "or other official uniform," there shall be inserted "or any badge supplied or authorised by the Admiralty or Army Council."
For the words "any uniform," there shall be substituted "any uniform or badge."
For the words "any such uniform," there shall be substituted "any such uniform or badge."
After the words "a member of His Majesty's Forces," there shall be inserted "or any such badge as aforesaid to any person not authorised to wear the same."

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 18th day of March, 1915, in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas the rates of pay, and the conditions of payment, authorized by Your Majesty's Order in Council, bearing date the 8th day of August, 1911, for Probationary Second Lieutenants, Royal Marines, are not applicable under existing circumstances:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the grant of pay at the rate of 7s. 6d. a day during the period of Hostilities to Probationary Second Lieutenants, Royal Marines, when embarked or appointed to the Royal Marine Brigades or Batteries.

"We further beg leave to recommend that the pay of Second Lieutenants, Royal Marines, entered temporarily for the period of Hostilities, be increased from 5s. to 7s. 6d. a day, as from the 24th November, 1914, such increase having been granted to Second Lieutenants appointed to Your Majesty's Army under similar circumstances, and that these Officers be granted pay at the rate of 8s. 6d. a day, when promoted to the rank of Lieutenant.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 25th day of February, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say :—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for apportioning the income of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Stradbroke, in the County of Suffolk, and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, between that Benefice and a certain other Benefice, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Tannington with the Chapelry of Brundish annexed, which said last-named Benefice is also situate in the said County of Suffolk, and in the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas the Bishop of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich is the Patron, in right of his See, of the said Benefice of Stradbroke, and also of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish is at present insufficiently endowed; and that the said Benefice of Stradbroke has endowments of such an amount that, after the charge hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been placed upon the same endowments, the said Benefice of Stradbroke will still be sufficiently endowed:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Henry Bernard, Bishop of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, has represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the Cure of Souls within the Parish of Tannington with Brundish, aforesaid, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of Stradbroke which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Stradbroke is now full, the Vicar or Incumbent thereof being the Reverend Abbot Roland Upcher:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, acting as Archbishop of the Province within which each of the said two Benefices is situate, and with the consent of the said Henry Bernard, Bishop of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, acting as such Bishop, and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of each of the said two Benefices as aforesaid, (in testimony whereof they, the said consenting parties, have respectively signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with their several Archiepiscopal and Episcopal Seals), and with the consent of the said Abbot Roland Upcher, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and as from the day on which any such Order shall be published in the London Gazette, all the tithe-rent-charges, glebe lands, and all other (if any) the endowments which shall at that date or which may thereafter belong to the same Benefice shall be charged and for ever thereafter chargeable in favour of the Incumbent, for the time being, of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish with the annual sum or yearly charge hereinafter mentioned, that is to say, a clear annual sum or yearly charge of £12 10s., the same annual sum or yearly charge of £12 10s. to be, as from the day aforesaid, due and payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish, and the same annual sum or yearly charge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish, or his representatives, on the one hand, and his Successors in the same Incumbency on the other hand; and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged, as aforesaid, by equal half-yearly payments on the 1st day of January, and the 1st day of July, in every year.

"Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent, for the time being, of the said

Benefice of Stradbroke shall by any deed, duly executed by him under his hand and seal, in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant, convey, and annex, to the said Benefice of Tannington with Brundish any part or parts of the endowments belonging to the said Benefice of Stradbroke which shall, in the opinion of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, for the time being, be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly charge of £12 10s., hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid, then the same annual sum or yearly charge of £12 10s. shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and determine, and be no longer payable as hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts, may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted Separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when, with respect to his own Diocese, it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a Separate Benefice by itself, or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place, or District, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a Separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may with advantage be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a Separate Parish for ecclesiastical

purposes, and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a Scheme in writing, (the Scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration), describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to Patronage, and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all Parties interested, and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such Scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such Scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same, and such Consent as aforesaid, by his Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect:—

And whereas the Right Reverend Archibald, Lord Bishop of Exeter, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 20th day of July, 1914, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

“I, Archibald, Lord Bishop of Exeter, in pursuance of the 26th Section of The Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to your Grace as follows:—

“There is, in the County of Devon, and Diocese of Exeter, the Benefice or Rectory of Ashwater, the Parish whereof contains a population of 679 persons, or thereabouts, with accommodation in the Parish Church for 250 persons:

“The net annual value of the Benefice of Ashwater is £467, or thereabouts:

“There is also, in the same County and Diocese, the Benefice or Perpetual Curacy of Clawton, the Parish whereof contains a population of 360 persons, or thereabouts, with accommodation in the Parish Church for 150 persons:

“The net annual value of the Benefice of Clawton is £152, or thereabouts:

describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to Patronage, and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested, and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such Scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such Scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same, and such Consent as aforesaid, by his Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing, annexed to this Representation, describing the mode in which it appears to me the proposed alterations may best be effected, and how the changes consequent thereon in respect of ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to Patronage, and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested, and I do hereby submit the same to your Grace, together with the Consents thereto in writing of Henry Lindsay Archer-Houblon, the Patron of both the said Benefices, the Reverend John Southby, the Incumbent of the Benefice of Baulking with Woolstone, and the Reverend Edward MacGregor Hadow, the Incumbent of the Benefice of Uffington, to the intent that, if your Grace shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with such Scheme, you may certify the same, and such Consents, by your Report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme, drawn up by the said Bishop of Oxford, and the Consents referred to in the said Representation, are as follows:—

"SCHEME.

"That that portion of the Benefice or Perpetual Curacy of Baulking with Woolstone known as (and formerly the Chapelry of) Woolstone shall be separated from the said Benefice, and united for ecclesiastical purposes to the contiguous Parish and Benefice of Uffington.

"That the people residing within the limits of Woolstone shall, if entitled to any accommodation in the Parish Church of Baulking, cease to be so entitled (except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any Pew or Sitting in the Church of Baulking, and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same), and shall become Parishioners of the Parish of Uffington with Woolstone.

"That two Churchwardens shall be annually chosen for each of the said Churches of Uffington and Woolstone, in the customary manner, and at the time when Churchwardens are usually appointed, and every person so chosen shall be duly admitted and shall, as heretofore, do all things as to ecclesiastical matters pertaining to the Office of Churchwardens.

"That Baptisms, Marriages, and all other Offices of the Church, shall be performed and solemnized, as heretofore, in the said Churches respectively, and all fees, ecclesiastical dues, and payments, in respect thereof shall be paid and belong to the Incumbent for the time being of Uffington with Woolstone.

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Llangadwaladr, in the County of Anglesey, and of the Parish of Llangranog, in the County of Cardigan, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made Representations to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial grounds in the Civil Parishes of Llangadwaladr and Llangranog aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

LLANGADWALADR.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of St. Cadwaladr or Llangadwaladr, in the Parish of Llangadwaladr, in the County of Anglesey; and in the Churchyard attached thereto, with the following exceptions, that is to say:—

In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF FEMALE LEARNER IN LONDON IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE POSTMASTER-GENERAL.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 14 and 16. If an examination begins in one of the first four months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of January in that year. If an examination begins in one of the second four months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of May in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last four months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of September in that year.

2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) That they are unmarried or widows.
- (b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.
- (c) That they are natural-born or naturalised British subjects.

3. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

4. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

- 1. English Composition (including Writing and Spelling).
- 2. Arithmetic (first four rules, Simple and Compound, including English and Metric Weights and Measures, Reduction, Vulgar Fractions and Decimals, excluding Recurring Decimals).
- 3. Geography.

Candidates must pass in Writing and obtain such an aggregate number of marks as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. No Candidate will be admitted to examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking, signed by her Parent or Guardian, that she will, if successful, reside either with her parents or guardians or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.

6. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height.

7. Persons who may have accepted a situation as Learner in any London office will not be eligible to compete. Other persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the written permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the Competition.

8. Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, will not be qualified to receive appointments until

the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. A fee of 4s. will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination.

LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL (MONEY).

(Regulating expenditure on capital account and loans by London County Council, 1st April, 1915, to 31st March, 1916, and following six months; Particulars of expenditure; Loans by London County Council to other bodies and persons; Incorporation or application of provisions of London County Council (Finance Consolidation) Act, 1912, and London County Council (Money) Act, 1914.)

THE London County Council (in this Notice called "the Council") intend to apply to Parliament in the present Session for leave to bring in a Bill for the following purposes (namely):—

To regulate the expenditure on capital account and the lending of money by the Council

during the financial year ending the 31st March, 1916, and during the six months ending the 30th September, 1916.

To define the purposes for which and the extent to which the Council may during the said periods respectively expend money on capital account in accordance with the provisions of the London County Council (Finance Consolidation) Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the principal Act").

(i) Accommodation for Quarter Sessions and additional accommodation for Stores Department.

(j) The acquisition of lands, provision of schools, reconstruction, adaptation and extension of divisional offices and other purposes of the Acts relating to education (including rehousing persons of the working classes displaced).

(k) The purchase, construction, reconstruction, and equipment of tramways; the provision of buildings, power stations, machinery and rolling stock; the purchase of lands and other purposes in connection with Acts relating to tramways.

(l) Pumping stations, outfalls, machinery, sewers, sludge vessels, and other purposes of main drainage.

(m) Provision of appliances for testing electricity meters.

(n) Establishment of ambulance service.

(o) New Coroner's Court at Wandsworth.

(p) The execution of any powers which may be conferred upon the Council by any Acts passed by Parliament in the present Session.

(q) Generally all other subjects in respect of which capital expenditure may be necessary.

To define the bodies and persons to whom and the extent to which the Council may during the said periods respectively lend money in accordance with the principal Act.

To incorporate or apply all or any of the provisions of the principal Act and of the London County Council (Money) Act, 1914.

To vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would interfere with the objects of the intended Act or any of them and to confer other rights and privileges.

Printed copies of the proposed Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons, in accordance with the provisions of the Standing Orders, on or before the 14th day of April next.

Notices of Dissolution of Partnership will not be inserted unless signed by the Partners named therein, or by their legal representatives; and the signature or representative character of the signatory must be verified by Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

A Notice of Dissolution of Partnership not signed by all the Partners, or their legal representatives, must be accompanied by a Statutory Declaration made by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court to the effect that such notice is given in pursuance of the terms of the partnership to which it relates.

Advertisements purporting to be issued in pursuance of Statutes or under Orders of Court will not be inserted unless signed or attested by a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

Advertisements relating to Bills before Parliament will not be inserted unless signed by a Parliamentary Agent or a Solicitor of the Supreme Court.

Authorised Scale of Charges for Notices and Advertisements.

- (a) Notices under the Bankruptcy Acts (except the Discharge and Closure Act, 1887, see (b))—5s.
- (b) Notices under the Bankruptcy (Discharge and Closure) Act, 1887—10s.
- (c) Notices under the Companies Winding-up Act, 1890, and the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908, as prescribed by the Rules under the Acts—5s. Other Companies Winding-up Notices at the rates given under (f).
- (d) Notices under the County Courts Act, 1888, when received from the Registrar of County Court Judgments—10s.
- (e) Friendly Societies Notices—5s.
- (f) All other Notices or Advertisements, including Applications to Parliament, and Scotch Sequestrations, will be charged by the number of lines appearing as plain matter in the type of the Gazette:—

If not exceeding 10 lines of printed matter—10s.

For each additional 5 lines or under—5s.

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In Notices of Dissolution of Partnership, the signatures of the Partners will not be charged for.

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
