TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Tuesday, the 6th April, 1915, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be

issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, and 52 Vic., cap 6, to the amount of £15,000,000, in replacement of Bills falling due on the 10th April 1915

April, 1915.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 10th April, 1915, and will be payable at six months after date, viz. —on the 10th October, 1915.

3. The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London banker.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the

Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Wednesday, the 7th April, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock on Saturday, the 10th April.

6. Persons tendering for Bills are hereby notified that, having regard to the provisions of the Acts 22 George III, cap. 45, and 41 George III, cap. 52, the acceptance of any such Tender is subject to the express condition that no Member of the House of Commons shall be admitted to any share or part in or to any benefit to arise from the Contract thereby made for the allotment of such Bills.
