The said sum of £3,000 to be paid by six equal annual instalments of £500 each. First instalment to be paid twelve months after Order signed, and remaining instalments each following twelve months. The sum of £200 part of first instalment to be paid prior to signing of Order; and that, upon the required consent being given, Judgment may be entered against the bankrupt in the King's Bench Division of the High Court for the sum of £3,000, £1 10s. costs of Judgment having been paid to the Trustee.
