14716	Corporal ...	Deveney, F. G. ...	Royal Engineers ...	For conspicuous gallantry in conveying messages and repairing telephone wires under very severe fire on many occasions.
8581	Serjeant ...	Devonshire, J. ...	1st Battalion, Manchester Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry and ability in holding a trench with two platoons at Givenchy on 21st December, 1914, against two determined attacks by the enemy; when finally forced to retire he cleared the Germans out of the trench and brought away his wounded, engaging in hand to hand fighting through the village.
6733	Lance Corporal	Dillingham, A. G. ...	2nd Battalion, Bedfordshire Regiment	For gallant conduct and resource on the night of 25th October, 1914, at Ypres. After a shell had killed 3 men and wounded 9 of his party he re-organised the personnel of the ammunition carts with great coolness.
8831	Private ...	Donovan, P. ...	3rd Battalion, Royal West Kent Regiment	For gallant conduct on 23rd August 1914, at St. Ghislain; whilst his battalion was retreating he returned towards the enemy, under a heavy fire, and placed a wounded man under cover.
5212	2nd Corporal	Dower, J. H. ...	Royal Engineers (No. 4 Company, 1st Sappers and Miners)	For gallantry on 19th December, 1914, in voluntarily bringing to the firing line a supply of hand grenades under fire and in full view of the enemy, and subsequently for assisting the bomb-throwing party of the Seaforth Highlanders.
7948	Company Quartermaster-Serjeant	Downs, G. ...	1st Battalion, Cheshire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry near Ypres in continuing to work his machine gun after the trenches on his left flank had been evacuated, thereby securing the general line from being broken. Has shown marked ability in machine-gun work throughout the campaign.
6591	Lance-Serjeant	Drew, H. A. ...	2nd Battalion, Dorsetshire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry on 17th November, 1914, in the engagement at Sahil (Turkey in Asia), although wounded, he continued to lead his men with gallantry and coolness under a heavy fire.
2190	Lance-Corporal	Drew, T. A. W. ...	2nd Battalion, Monmouthshire Regiment (T.F.)	For conspicuous gallantry on 2nd January, 1915, at Le Touquet, in voluntarily going to the rescue of a dangerously wounded comrade in full view of the enemy, who were only a hundred yards distant. Lance-Corporal Drew brought the wounded man into cover, but was himself wounded in doing so.
899	Corporal ...	Duffy, T. ...	1st Battalion, Manchester Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry near Neuve Chapelle on 27th November, 1914, in the attack on the enemy's sap-heads, and subsequently for great courage in leaving his trench under very heavy machine gun fire, and bringing three wounded men into cover.
3972	Private ...	Dunster, W. ...	1st Battalion, Devonshire Regiment	For gallant conduct on many occasions in attending on the wounded under fire whilst acting as stretcher-bearer, and also for gallantry and coolness on 20th November, 1914, in removing the wounded from the trenches under fire of the enemy's snipers.
4725	Serjeant ...	Edwards, H. ...	1st Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment	For gallant conduct on 3rd January, 1915, at Neuve Chapelle, in the able assistance rendered in the attack on a German trench when 30 of the occupants were killed or wounded.
