8507	Lance-Corporal	Gough, J.	1st Battalion, South Staffordshire Regiment	For gallantry under heavy fire. Has performed very good work during the campaign.
6817	Corporal ...	Gourlay, A.	2nd Battalion, Royal Scots	For gallant conduct and resource at Vailly, in obtaining very valuable information in regard to the enemy's position, and in the engagements from 12th to 16th October, 1914, for leading his platoon, when under fire, in a very capable manner.
8244	Acting Corporal	Gray, G.	2nd Battalion, Leicestershire Regiment	For the gallantry displayed in the operations on 23rd and 24th November, 1914.
12479	Private ...	Green, R. B.	1st Battalion, Grenadier Guards	For conspicuous gallantry on 28th October, 1914, in remaining in the firing line after being wounded, although ordered away. He also rendered good service at Kruseik when acting as Observer in a trench, under heavy fire.
1628	Corporal ...	Green, T.	3rd Battalion, Rifle Brigade	For conspicuous gallantry on several occasions, especially on 24th September, 1914, in attending on three wounded men under heavy shell fire, and on the same day voluntarily joined in an attack on the enemy's trenches. Again on the 18th October he advanced under heavy rifle fire and rescued three wounded men.
5039	Company Serjeant-Major	Hall, R. S.	2nd Battalion, Royal Dublin Fusiliers	For gallantry and ability. After the engagement at Ligny he collected a large number of detached men and reorganised them under very trying circumstances.
10578	Corporal (Acting Serjeant)	Hall, R. W.	Royal Engineers	For gallant conduct on 26th October, 1914, at Paschendale-Becelaere road, in leaving a house under heavy rifle and machine gun fire and rescuing a severely wounded man who was lying in the open.
T.S./1067	Driver ...	Hardesty, A. G.	Army Service Corps	For conspicuous gallantry and coolness on 5th November, 1914, at Ypres, in extricating the horses after a shell had burst in the stables; six men and many horses were killed by the shells on this occasion.
9639	Private ...	Harding, B. W.	1st Battalion, Royal Scots	For gallant conduct and devotion to duty on many occasions, especially on 18th January, 1915, near Vierstraat, in assisting to rescue a wounded Non-commissioned Officer whilst exposed to a heavy fire.
7280	Company Serjeant-Major	Harland, H.	1st Battalion, Manchester Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry and presence of mind on the night of 20th December, 1914, near Givenchy, during the attack on the enemy's trenches, which was opposed by a very heavy fire; and also for his gallant conduct in the second attack on the following day.
2989	Private ...	Harper, J.	3rd Battalion Gloucestershire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry on 25th January, 1915, at Givenchy; when the bombardment by the enemy was very fierce he voluntarily conveyed a message under very dangerous circumstances to the front trench. This act of gallantry entailed the crossing of 800 yards of fire-swept ground on two occasions.
6742	Serjeant ...	Harrington, G. W.	2nd Battalion, Durham Light Infantry	For conspicuous gallantry on 20th September, 1914, at Troyon, valley of the Aisne, in voluntarily rescuing wounded men on two occasions whilst under heavy fire. On 21 September he went out to the enemy's trenches at dawn, and brought back information of great value to our artillery.
