3086	Private ...	Inglis, A. ...	2nd Battalion, Royal Highlanders	For conspicuous gallantry and coolness on 24th December, 1914, at Givenchy. Went out voluntarily to stalk a sniper, but on his way found some of our wounded men who had been lying exposed for two days; he then obtained assistance and dressed their wounds, remaining with them until night, when it became possible to remove them to cover.
T.S. 347	Driver ...	Ingrey, F. ...	Army Service Corps (attached 111th Indian Field Ambulance)	For conspicuous gallantry on 29th October, 1914, near Richebourg. When in charge of an ambulance-wagon which had become sunk in marshy ground he was ordered to return, but, although under a heavy shell fire, he refused to abandon the wagon and eventually extricated it.
6890	Lance-Corporal	Irish, A. A. ...	1st Battalion, Hampshire Regiment	For gallantry on 19th December, 1914, in reconnoitring in daylight the ground over which an advance had to be made.
24	Serjeant ..	Irwin, H. ...	Northumberland Hussars	For gallant conduct and ability. Commanded the troop most successfully after his Officer had been wounded.
9730	Acting-Serjeant	Jackson, A. ...	4th Battalion, Royal Fusiliers	For gallant conduct on the night of 1st February, 1915, at Spanbroek near Kemmel, in assisting to rescue a wounded comrade, whilst exposed to heavy fire for a considerable time.
10736	Private ...	Jacobs, F. ...	1st Battalion, Royal Welsh Fusiliers	For gallantry in assisting to rescue a wounded man.
8038	Serjeant ..	James, A. ...	2nd Battalion, Scots Guards	For gallant conduct and ability on the night of 18th-19th December, 1914, when he led his men and captured a trench from the enemy.
7453	Second-Corporal	Jennings, J. ...	15th Field Company, Royal Engineers	For gallantry on 15th November, 1914, in assisting to place wire entanglements in front of our trenches, under fire from the enemy who were only 100 yards distant.
7352	Lance-Corporal	Johnson, W. ...	2nd Battalion, South Staffordshire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry at Givenchy on 20th February, 1915. After his Officers had been wounded, he led the party of the right column with gallantry and skill in the attack into the German trench.
8666	Private ...	Johnston, J. ...	2nd Battalion, Royal Irish Rifles	For conspicuous gallantry throughout the campaign. On 12th December, 1914, near Kemmel, when acting as stretcher bearer, he assisted to carry a wounded Officer across fire-swept ground, and again on the 16th idem performed a similar act of gallantry.
38373	Corporal ..	Jones, C. T. ...	28th Battery, Royal Field Artillery	For conspicuous gallantry on 20th December, 1914, when working a trench mortar the enemy entered his trench, but he succeeded in driving them out by a well-directed fire. Corporal Jones was assisted by only two men, and the enemy were throwing bombs.
11535	Corporal ...	Jones, R. ...	2nd Battalion, Scots Guards	For conspicuous gallantry in conducting an attack successfully, after his Officer had been wounded, and subsequently for gallantry in assisting to bring a wounded Officer into safety.
10456	Sapper ...	Jones, T. ...	15th Field Company Royal Engineers	For gallantry on 15th November, 1914, in assisting to place wire entanglements in front of our trenches, under fire from the enemy who were only 100 yards distant.
