9190	Private ...	Kirk, W. W. ...	Royal Army Medical Corps	For gallant conduct on several occasions in bringing in the wounded under heavy fire.
9413	Acting-Corporal	Kirkpatrick, E. P.	2nd Battalion, Royal Scots Fusiliers	Has been noted for conspicuous gallantry.
8233	Acting-Company-Serjeant-Major	Kirkwood, R. P. ...	2nd Battalion, King's Own Scottish Borderers	For conspicuous gallantry and coolness in action, especially at Ypres from 7th to 9th November, 1914, when he shewed a fine example at a critical time in holding his post. Has been noted for the excellent services rendered throughout the campaign.
94394	Gunner ...	Lailey, C. ...	106th Battery, Royal Field Artillery	For gallant conduct in the engagement of 31st October, 1914.
1676	Private ...	Laskie, A. L. ...	Honourable Artillery Company	For gallant conduct and devotion to duty on the night of 5th-6th December, 1914, near Kemmel, in leaving his trench in company with an Officer, and under a very heavy fire, to search for a missing comrade. This man was eventually found wounded, and Private Laskie assisted in bringing him into cover.
2817	Corporal (Acting Serjeant)	Lazzell, A. ...	Motor Cyclist Section, Royal Engineers	For gallant conduct on many occasions in circumstances of great risk, particularly on 14th November, 1914, near Ypres, when he conveyed operation orders for the 2nd Division over heavily shelled ground, and delivered them in good time.
1203	Lance-Corporal	Leahy, C. U. ...	1st Battalion, Seaforth Highlanders	For gallant conduct, coolness and presence of mind in an emergency. By his prompt action at a time when the trench was being rushed by the enemy, he prevented the line being penetrated by them. He was killed on 7th November, 1914.
11024	Lance-Corporal	Lee, T. ...	23rd Field Company, Royal Engineers	For gallant conduct throughout the campaign, especially on 10th January, 1915, during the attack on the machine gun post near Cuinchy, when he worked for two hours on the top of the embankment constructing a barricade under heavy fire. On the same day he rescued two wounded men from an exposed position.
9496	Private ...	Leslie, S. B. ...	2nd Battalion, Coldstream Guards	For gallant conduct on 1st February, 1915, at Cuinchy, when he was one of the bombing party in the successful counter attack on the enemy's position. This work demanded great coolness and skill.
326	Bandsman	Lewis, C. ...	4th Battalion, Royal Fusiliers	For gallant conduct on the night of 1st February, 1915, at Spanbroek, near Kemmel, in assisting to rescue a wounded comrade whilst exposed to heavy fire for a considerable time.
865	Acting Corporal	Lindsay, J. ...	1st Battalion, East Lancashire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry, ability, and general good work on numerous occasions, especially at Le Gheer on 17th January, 1915, in voluntarily assisting another man in extinguishing a fire caused by German shells. This work was accomplished in full view of the enemy, under heavy rifle, machine gun, and shell fire. He was previously employed in erecting wire entanglements every evening, 80 yards from the enemy.
9699	Acting Serjeant	Lismore, J. ...	1st Battalion, East Lancashire Regiment	For gallant conduct and good work at Ligny, and again at La Ferté. Has been noted for gallantry at all times.
7797	Private ...	Little, R. ...	2nd Battalion, West Riding Regiment	For gallant conduct on many occasions especially near Ypres in carrying messages under heavy fire. Has been noted for his willingness to undertake risky work and has never failed in delivering his messages.
