4254	Lance-Corporal	Lockton, J. W. ...	3rd Battalion, Coldstream Guards	For the gallantry displayed in leading his section in the engagement at Cuinchy on 6th February, 1915, and for the fine example shown to his men throughout the day. Was previously brought to notice for gallant conduct.
7978	Acting Company Serjeant-Major	Lodge, S. ...	1st Battalion, Northamptonshire Regiment	For conspicuous courage and marked ability on 29th January, 1915, at Cuinchy. The enemy drove our men from a trench by bomb fire and then occupied it. Serjeant Lodge at once organised a party of ten men, charged and retook possession, taking seven Germans as prisoners and killing the remainder. On several previous occasions this Non-commissioned Officer has displayed great bravery.
11314	Private ...	Long, A. ...	1st Battalion, Coldstream Guards	For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on 23rd December, 1914, in rescuing a number of wounded men at great risk, the enemy being only 50 yards distant.
22876	Company Serjeant-Major	Longley, E. ...	Royal Engineers ...	For gallantry and efficiency in the performance of his duties.
6662	Serjeant ...	Lucas, J. H. ...	2nd Battalion, Yorkshire Regiment	For gallantry on many occasions between 16th and 25th October, 1914, in conveying messages under heavy fire along a firing line extending for 1,100 yards.
3143	Lance-Corporal	Macfarlane, F. A. J.	14th Battalion, The London Regiment (London Scottish T.F.)	For gallant conduct on 23rd December, 1914, in going out from his trench for a distance of 200 yards and carrying a wounded officer into safety.
5523	Lance-Corporal	Mack, G. A. ...	1st Battalion, Royal Scots Fusiliers	For conspicuous gallantry at Vailly, when he carried wounded men from the trenches into cover on three occasions, crossing a hundred yards of open ground under heavy fire.
9393	Acting-Corporal	MacNeil, W. ...	1st Battalion, Seaforth Highlanders	For gallantry, energy and good work performed, especially in bomb throwing on the enemy.
1472	Private ...	Madill, R. ...	2nd Battalion, Royal Highlanders	For gallant conduct on 4th November, 1914, in assisting in the rescue of a wounded man.
7622	Lance-Corporal	Maher, J. ...	2nd Battalion, Leinster Regiment	For gallant conduct at Premesques on 20th October, 1914, in carrying messages on numerous occasions under heavy fire. Was previously brought to notice for gallantry on 23rd September at Cour de Soupir, when he brought up food to the trenches whilst exposed to heavy shell fire.
4977	Company-Serjeant-Major (now 2nd Lieutenant)	Mann, S. ...	1st Battalion, Royal Scots Fusiliers	For conspicuous gallantry and coolness throughout the campaign. On the 18th October, 1914, he rescued two wounded men whilst exposed to machine gun and rifle fire.
9917	Private ...	Mansell, W. ...	3rd Battalion, Worcestershire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry on 7th November, 1914, at Ploegsteert. During a very heavy attack by the enemy he went forward alone under a heavy fire and shot a number of Germans, thereby preventing any further advance by them in that direction.
9608	Corporal ...	Marsh, A. ...	1st Battalion, East Kent Regiment	For gallantry and ability on 23rd October, 1914, in obtaining valuable information on a dangerous reconnaissance near Le Quesne Farm.
