14772	Acting-Serjeant	Mills, A. J....	1st Battalion, Grenadier Guards	For gallantry on 24th and 25th October, 1914, in keeping up communication between companies under very heavy shell and rifle fire.
8127	Lance-Corporal	Mitchell, A. ...	2nd Battalion, Scots Guards	For conspicuous gallantry on 18th-19th December, 1914, when, exposed to a very destructive fire against the enemy's barbed wire fence, he carried a wounded Officer, with great difficulty, back to our trenches.
1993	Private ...	Mitchell, G. ...	2nd Battalion, Royal Highlanders	For gallant conduct from 19th to 21st December, 1914, in throwing bombs into the enemy's position, the effect of which was that their advance was checked.
906	Private ...	Mitchell, J. ...	1st Battalion, Manchester Regiment	For the gallant conduct displayed on 27th November, 1914, near Neuve-Chapelle.
8110	Private ...	Moore, A. ...	1st Battalion, Rifle Brigade	For gallant conduct on 19th December, 1914, in carrying up ammunition on six occasions to the firing line, whilst under fire.
9028	Acting-Serjeant	Moore, H. G. ...	2nd Battalion, York and Lancaster Regiment	For gallantry and ability on reconnaissance duty on many occasions to the north of Vailly, in the vicinity of Maison Rouge, when he obtained useful information relative to the enemy's position.
8558	Private ...	Moore, W. J. ...	2nd Battalion, Dorsetshire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry on 17th November, 1914, in the engagement at Sahil (Turkey in Asia), in carrying ammunition on many occasions to the firing line under a heavy fire. During the performance of this duty he was always in full view of the enemy—there being no cover—and he was wounded.
23658	Lance-Corporal	Morgan, A. R. ...	12th Field Company, Royal Engineers	For conspicuous gallantry on 10th February, 1915, at Armentières, in rescuing a wounded man from a burning building under the most difficult circumstances. The building was full of smoke and poisonous shell fumes from the shells which had burst therein.
7023	Corporal ...	Morrison, W. ...	1st Battalion, Gordon Highlanders	For gallant conduct in assisting to rescue a wounded Non-Commissioned Officer under heavy fire at very close range. Has rendered good service during the campaign.
4097	Private ...	Mosdell, W. ...	Royal Army Medical Corps	For gallant conduct and good work performed on many occasions under fire, in finding the wounded and bringing assistance to them, especially at Neuve Chapelle.
7521	Bandsman	Mullenger, G. ...	2nd Battalion, Norfolk Regiment	For gallant conduct on 7th December, 1914, during the engagement near Kurna (Turkey in Asia), in voluntarily assisting to carry a wounded comrade from the firing line to the Field Ambulance whilst exposed to a very heavy fire.
5638	Private ...	Mulvey, P. ...	2nd Battalion, Leinster Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry, ability and coolness. After every Officer and Non-Commissioned Officer had been put out of action in a German attack, he assumed command and with great determination directed effective fire on the enemy and kept his men well in hand.
9181	Private ...	Murray, M....	1st Battalion, Connaught Rangers	For gallant conduct from 19th to 23rd December, 1914, in working a trench mortar with zeal and ability under a heavy fire until he was killed.
8024	Acting-Corporal	Nolan, J. ...	1st Battalion, East Yorkshire Regiment	For gallantry and devotion to duty on 20th September, 1914, in the Valley of the Aisne, in bringing into cover a wounded Officer and several men under a very heavy fire. All the wounded rescued by him would have otherwise fallen into the enemy's hands.
