8537.	Corporal ...	Northcote, W. ...	Cable Section, Scottish Army Troops, T.F. (attached 8th Signal Company Royal Engineers)	For gallantry on many occasions under shell fire. Has frequently been occupied a whole night repairing wires cut by the enemy.
9083	Acting-Serjeant	Notley, H. ...	1st Battalion, Cheshire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry and marked ability at Rue D'Ouvert, near Festubert, on 13th October, 1914, when he behaved with the greatest gallantry during a period of 16 hours in the defence of a Farm, in a very critical situation.
172	Private ...	Nourse, C. B. ...	Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry	For conspicuous gallantry at St. Eloi on 28th February, 1915, when he was one of the first to enter the German trenches in the attack, escalated the barrier, and continued to fight on the far side until he had fired 130 rounds of ammunition.
8575	Private ...	Olds, C. A. ...	Royal Army Medical Corps	For gallant conduct in the performance of his duties whilst exposed to heavy shell fire.
7511	Serjeant ...	O'Lone, W. ...	2nd Battalion, Royal Irish Rifles	For conspicuous gallantry on numerous occasions under most difficult circumstances, especially at Illies, and also for gallantry in voluntarily conveying most important messages under heavy rifle and shell fire on two occasions.
7284	Lance-Corporal	Osbaldeston, A. ...	1st Battalion, Royal Irish Rifles	For gallantry on numerous occasions in conveying messages whilst exposed to heavy fire.
6003	Private ...	Otton, J. W. ...	4th Battalion, Middlesex Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry on 5th November, 1914, near Neuve Chapelle in attempting to rescue a wounded Non-commissioned Officer from in front of the enemy's trenches. He was killed in the attempt.
2538	Lance-Serjeant	Page, F. J. ...	16th Lancers ...	For most conspicuous gallantry at Wulverghem on 5th November, 1914, in assisting in leading a body of 40 unattached men in a successful charge against the enemy, in which he was mortally wounded.
10584	Private ...	Park, W. J. ...	2nd Battalion, Royal Lancaster Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty near Ypres, on 17th February, 1915, when he conveyed a message to the fire trenches, although wounded in the thigh on the way, and then joined in the attack on the German trenches. After the attack he conveyed another message back to his Headquarters, and was then taken into the hospital.
6141	Serjeant-Major	Parker, J. ...	2nd Battalion Manchester Regiment	For gallant conduct and good service throughout the very heavy fighting in which the Battalion has been engaged.
65464	Gunner ...	Patterson, A. ...	105th Battery, Royal Field Artillery	For gallantry on numerous occasions in repairing telephone wires under heavy fire.
10426	Private ...	Peacock, E. W. ...	1st Battalion, East Surrey Regiment	For gallant conduct on 16th December, 1914, in repairing the telephone wires on three occasions whilst exposed to heavy rifle and shell fire.
9903	Private (Acting-Serjeant)	Pearce, A. ...	1st Battalion, Cheshire Regiment	For gallant conduct outside La Bassée, in removing snipers (who were enfilading our trenches) from a house, and then holding possession of the house under heavy fire.
8371	Private ...	Penn, J. ...	1st Battalion, Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment	For gallant conduct on 22nd December, 1914, when he carried out a daring reconnaissance by daylight, under a heavy fire.
