Regimental No.	Rank.	Name.	Corps.	Action for which commended.
10001	Private ...	Saville, J. ...	2nd Battalion, Coldstream Guards	For gallant conduct on 1st February, 1915, at Cuinchy, when he was one of the bombing party in the successful counter-attack on the enemy's position. This work demanded great coolness and skill.
11973	Serjeant ...	Scheidweiler, F. C.	3rd Battalion, Royal Fusiliers (attached Meerut-Signal Company)	For gallantry on 20th December, 1914, at Givenchy, in repairing a broken telephone line, over ground which was being subjected to a heavy shrapnel fire.
10243	Private ...	Scott, R. ...	2nd Battalion, Gordon Highlanders	For gallant conduct and resource at Kruseik, in repairing a telephone wire under very heavy fire, and also for conveying a message under heavy fire, at great risk.
5741	Company Serjeant-Major	Serafield, E. B. ...	1st Battalion, Royal Irish Fusiliers	For gallant conduct and ability near Haucourt, during a night charge by the Germans. Has set a fine example to the men of his company.
64761	Acting-Bombardier	Sculpher, W. ...	37th Battery, Royal Field Artillery	For gallant conduct when in charge of a party conveying ammunition. Although stopped by staff officers and warned that the route was being swept by shell fire, continued on the journey and delivered it to the battery.
5722	Company Serjeant-Major	Seaman, F. ...	2nd Battalion, Coldstream Guards	For conspicuous gallantry and ability at Cuinchy on 1st February, 1915, when he entered the tunnel under railway embankment and prevented the enemy coming through; had they succeeded our men would have been taken in flank or rear. He realised the great importance of holding his ground, and, although wounded, kept the enemy at bay.
8853	Serjeant ...	Sharland, J. ...	2nd Battalion, East Surrey Regiment (attached 110th Indian Field Ambulance)	For gallant conduct on the night of 23rd-24th November, 1914, near Festubert, in collecting and attending to the wounded whilst under fire.
8653	Private ...	Shannon, J. ...	1st Battalion, Cheshire Regiment	For gallant conduct in continually conveying messages under shell and rifle fire.
7784	Bandsman	Sharpe, A. W. ...	2nd Battalion, Norfolk Regiment	For gallant conduct on 7th December, 1914, during the engagement near Kurna (Turkey in Asia), in voluntarily assisting to carry a wounded comrade from the firing line to the field ambulance, whilst exposed to a very heavy fire.
4911	Serjeant-Major	Sharpington, F. ...	1st Battalion, Royal Fusiliers	For conspicuous gallantry on 6th November, 1914. The enemy having set fire to a farm near Fleurbaix in which the small arm ammunition carts were kept, he succeeded in saving them all, and then returned and rescued a lady (aged 76) who was in the burning building.
6055	Private ...	Shearer, W. ...	2nd Battalion, Royal Irish Rifles	For conspicuous gallantry on all occasions, especially near Hooze, on 11th November, 1914, when he took a message into the trenches whilst exposed to most destructive fire. His absolute fearlessness has been most noticeable in dangerous situations.
9017	Private ...	Shee, D. ...	3rd Battalion, King's Royal Rifle Corps	For conspicuous gallantry at St. Eloi, on 15th February, 1915, when he rushed forward with one other man ahead of his Company, right into the enemy's trenches, the effect of which was that the Germans threw down their arms.
