9570	Private ...	Smith, L. ...	2nd Battalion, Border Regiment	For gallant conduct in conveying messages on many occasions whilst exposed to the enemy's fire.
4643	Corporal ...	Smith, T. ...	1st Battalion, Rifle Brigade	For the gallantry he displayed in the engagement at Ligny.
8325	Serjeant ..	Snashall, E. ...	1st Battalion, Dorsetshire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry on numerous occasions, especially at Givenchy on 13th October, 1914, when he was in command of the last platoon covering the Battalion's retirement. During 14th and 15th October, he remained in a very exposed position day and night, and prevented the enemy's patrols reaching La Bassée Canal bridge.
6666	Serjeant ...	Snelling, R....	7th Dragoon Guards	For gallant conduct near Festubert on the night of 20th-21st December, 1914, in assisting a severely wounded Officer into cover, whilst exposed to heavy machine-gun fire. Was also brought to notice for gallantry and coolness in the handling of his section on that night.
15585	Sapper ...	Spackman, T. ...	7th Divisional Signal Company, Royal Engineers	For gallantry in repairing cables under heavy fire by night and day.
19306	Private ...	Speller, C. ...	Royal Army Medical Corps	For gallant conduct on several occasions in bringing in the wounded under heavy fire.
5833	Serjeant ...	Spence, W. ...	2nd Battalion West Riding Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry on 24th August, 1914, at Wasmes; although severely wounded, he assumed command of a party of men and cleared the enemy out of a position taken up by them.
8335	Private ...	Spencer, A....	Royal Army Medical Corps	For gallant conduct on several occasions in bringing in the wounded under heavy fire.
14432	Private ...	Spencer, A. S. S. ...	4th Battalion, Middlesex Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry on 5th November, 1914, near Neuve Chapelle; in company with two other men (both of whom were killed) he went to the front of the enemy's trenches and rescued a wounded Non-commissioned Officer, whilst assailed by very heavy fire—his equipment being struck by bullets in several places.
72331	Acting-Bombardier	Spencer, J. ...	29th Battery, Royal Field Artillery	For gallant conduct on 2nd November, 1914, in repairing a telephone wire under shell and rifle fire, and assisting to rescue a wounded comrade whilst under fire. Was also brought to notice for good work performed on 9th December.
11029	Quartermaster Serjeant	Spowage, A. ...	Royal Army Medical Corps	For gallant conduct and good work throughout the campaign, especially at Juty, from 13th to 30th September, 1914, when he displayed great zeal and devotion to duty in attendance on the wounded.
7866	Lance-Corporal	Standley, J. T. ...	1st Battalion, South Staffordshire Regiment	For gallantry under heavy fire. Has performed very good work during the campaign.
16847	Sapper ...	Stannard, T. ...	7th Divisional Signal Company, Royal Engineers	For gallantry in repairing cables under heavy fire by night and day.
842	Private ...	Stark, M. ...	2nd Battalion, Royal Highlanders	For gallant conduct on 4th November, 1914, in assisting in the rescue of a wounded man.
2217	Private ...	Stewart, D....	2nd Battalion, Royal Highlanders	For conspicuous gallantry and dash on 23rd and 24th November, 1914, in voluntarily assisting in the leading of parties of the 58th Vaughan's Rifles, which resulted in the recapture of the enemy's trenches.
