# TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Tuesday, the 13th inst., at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Acts 40 Vic., cap. 2, 52 Vic., cap. 6, and 5 Geo. V, cap. 23, to the amount of £15,000,000.

- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 17th April, 1915, and will be payable at six months after date, viz.:—on the 17th October, 1915.
- 3. The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for, and the Tenders of private individuals must be made through a London banker.
- 4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Wednesday, the 14th inst., and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than twelve o'clock on Saturday, the 17th April, 1915.
- 6. Persons tendering for Bills are hereby notified that, having regard to the provisions of the Acts 22 George III, cap. 45, and 41 George III, cap. 52, the acceptance of any such

Tender is subject to the express condition that no Member of the House of Commons shall be admitted to any share or part in or to any benefit to arise from the Contract thereby made for the allotment of such Bills.

The provisions in question do not apply to Contracts entered into by an incorporated trading company in its corporate capacity and made for the general benefit of the company.

7. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED IST APRIL 1915.)

SHEEP - DIPPING (SCOTLAND AND NORTH OF ENGLAND) ORDER OF

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

# Application of Order.

1.—(1.) This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, (hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping

Area.")
(2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly outside the Dipping Area, the whole farm or holding and the sheep thereon shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be in the Area.

# Mode of Dipping Prescribed.

2. Where under this Order it is provided that sheep are to be dipped, they shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheepdip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved.

General Dipping during periods from (a) 15th July to 31st August, and (b) 1st September to 15th November.

3.—(1.) All sheep in the Dipping Area during any part of a prescribed dipping period shall, subject to the next following Article, be caused to be dipped within the Dipping Area during that period by the owner or person in The first prescribed dipping charge thereof. period shall commence in each year on the fifteenth day of July and terminate on the thirty-first day of August, and the second prescribed dipping period shall commence in each year on the first day of September and terminate on the fifteenth day of November.

(2.) There shall be an interval of at least ten days between the first and second dippings

prescribed by this Article.

(3.) In the case of sheep moved into the Dipping Area between the twenty-first day of August and the first day of September, or between the fifth day of November and the sixteenth day of that month, it shall be sufficient compliance with this Article if the sheep are dipped within ten days after the movement.

### Exemptions from Dipping.

4. The provisions of the preceding Article shall not apply to the following sheep:-

(i) Sheep moved by railway through the

Dipping Area;

(ii) Sheep slaughtered in the Dipping Area, or moved out of the Dipping Area, before the expiration of the period within which their dipping is required under the preceding Article

(iii) Sheep which, in the opinion of the Local Authority of the District where they are kept, it is impracticable or inexpedient. to dip in accordance with the requirements of this Order, on account of their being intended for exhibition or of any other special circumstances, and which are accordingly exempted by an exemption signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority. The exemption may be granted subject to conditions as to subsequent dipping or otherwise. copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board. The exemption shall be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect;

(iv) As regards dipping during the first prescribed dipping period, sheep which have been dipped within the Dipping Area between the fourteenth day of June and the commencement of the first prescribed dipping

period; provided that

(a) the dipping has been in the mode prescribed by this Order;

(b) notice of time and place of the intended dipping has been given in the manner required by Article 5 of this Order and such return of the dipping has been made as is required by that Article; and

- (c) the sheep have after the dipping until the expiration of the first prescribed dipping period been kept separate, as far as practicable, from sheep kept on the same premises which have not been dipped in accordance with this Order.
- (v) As regards dipping during either of the prescribed dipping periods, sheep which during that period have been dipped under and in accordance with the provisions of an Order of the Board, or of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under any such Order.

Notice to Local Authority of Time and Place of intended Dippings, and Returns of Dippings.

- 5.—(1.) For the purposes of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dipping whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped under Article 3 shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:
  - i.) The notice shall be delivered, or sentpost, to such person as the Local Authority of the District may appoint toreceive such notices in respect of sheep in their District;
  - (ii.) The notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping, unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local. Authority;

(iii.) The notice shall state the time and place of the intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to be-

dipped.

(2.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.

(3.) A return in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, shall be sent immediately after each dipping by the owner or person in charge of the sheep dipped to the person appointed to receive such returns by the Local Authority of the District. in which the sheep are dipped, except in any case in which an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority is present at the dipping.

# Isolation of Sheep after Dipping.

6. Sheep after having been dipped during either prescribed dipping period, shall during the remainder of the period be kept separate, as far as practicable, from sheep kept on the same premises which have not been so dipped.

# Declaration after Prescribed Dipping Periods.

7. The occupier of a farm or holding in the Dipping Area on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in that behalf, on or after the first day of September, but not later than the fifteenth day of September, and on or after the sixteenth day of November, but not later than the thirtieth day of November, in each year, send a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep, in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority of the District in which the farm or holding is situate.

# Notice of Appointment of Persons to receive Returns, &c.

8. The Local Authority shall appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their District to receive notices, returns, and declarations under the preceding Articles, and shall give adequate notice in their District of appointments so made.

# Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped within Prescribed Dipping Periods.

9. Where any sheep shall not have been dipped as required by this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, without prejudice to any proceedings for the offence, serve the owner or person in charge of the sheep and the owner or person in charge of any sheep then in contact with the undipped sheep with a notice, in the Form D set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, requiring the dipping of the sheep described in the notice and prohibiting their movement from the farm, holding, or other place where they are at the time the notice is served (except with a o licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District) until all the sheep shall have been dipped, after the service of the notice, in the presence and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority or have been slaughtered, and thereupon it shall be unlawful for the owner or person in charge of the sheep to move the sheep, or permit the sheep to be moved, in contravention of the notice.

# Cleansing of Dipping Places.

10. The place on any farm or premises in the Dipping Area which has been used for the dipping shall, without unnecessary delay, be thoroughly cleansed by the occupier, and all tufts of wool gathered and disinfected or destroyed.

# Samples of Dip may be taken.

11. Every owner or person in charge of sheep being dipped under this Order shall permit and give every facility to an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board, or to a constable, to take samples of dip which is being or has been used for the dipping of sheep.

Power to provide Dipping Places.

12. The Local Authority of any District in the Dipping Area may provide and fit up and maintain dipping places, but subject to the approval in writing by the Board of the site of each dipping place; provided that no dipping place shall be used under this provision if its use would injuriously affect the water in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, well, pond, or place constructed or used for the supply of water for drinking or other domestic purposes.

Power for Local Authority to regulate time and place of Dipping in particular cases.

13. The Local Authority of any District in the Dipping Area may in any case where they think such procedure desirable for the purposes of securing the dipping required by this Order serve a notice on the owner or person in charge of any sheep requiring that the sheep shall be dipped at such time and place as is stated in the notice and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and the sheep shall thereupon be dipped in accordance with the requirements of such notice. The notice may be in the Form E set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

### Powers of Entry and Examination.

14. An Inspector of the Board, and an Inspector of the Local Authority of any District, subject to the direction of the authority appointing him, may, for the purposes of this Order enter any premises within the District and examine any sheep thereon.

# Power for Local Authority to make Regulations as to Exposure of Sheep at Markets.

- 15.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District comprised in the Dipping Area may make Regulations for prohibiting the exposure for sale in any market, fairground, or saleyard in their District during either prescribed dipping period of sheep which have not been previously dipped within such period as may be prescribed by the Regulations and are not accompanied by such declaration as to the sheep having been so dipped as may be prescribed by the Regulations.
- (2.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Article.
- (3.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under this Article, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

# Special Provision as to Movement of Sheep from Ireland.

16. The provisions of the Sheep (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1908 shall apply to the provisions of this Order and of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, as if the District referred to in that Order included the Area to which this Order applies, and also with the substitution for the declaration referred to in Article 3 of the firstmentioned Order, of the declaration in the Form (B) contained in the Sheep Dipping (Ireland) Order of 1912 or any Order substituted therefor.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

17. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

# Offences.

18.—(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, or by any notice served, or the conditions of any exemption granted, under this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which its dipping is required by this Order, or the notice or conditions, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person fails to give any notice or send any return or declaration required by this Order, or falsely makes any return or declaration, for the purposes of this Order, or offers or utters any such return or declaration knowing the same to be falsely made, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a sheep is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is kept, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence

against the Act of 1894. (4.) If a sheep is exposed for sale in any market, fairground, or saleyard, in contravention of any Regulation made under this Order, the occupier of the premises where the sheep is exposed, and the person exposing the same, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, and the purchaser thereof, knowing the same to be exposed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

# Interpretation.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 5TH APRIL 1915.)

SHEEP-DIPPING (ISLAND OF LEWIS) ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

### Application of Order.

- 1.—(1.) This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, (hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping Area.")
- (2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly outside the Dipping Area, the whole farm or holding and the sheep thereon shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be in the Area.
- (3.) While this Order remains in operation the Dipping Area described in the First Schedule hereto shall not form part of any Dipping Area to which provisions requiring the general periodical dipping of sheep are applied by any other Order of the Board.

# Mode of Dipping Prescribed.

2. Where under this Order it is provided that sheep are to be dipped, they shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved.

General Dipping during periods from (a) 15th February to 15th April, and (b) 1st September to 26th November.

- 3.—(1.) All sheep in the Dipping Area during any part of a prescribed dipping period shall, subject to the next following Article, be caused to be dipped within the Dipping Area during that period by the owner or person in charge thereof. The first prescribed dipping period shall commence on the fifteenth day of February and terminate on the fifteenth day of April, and the second prescribed dipping period shall commence on the first day of September and terminate on the twenty-sixth day of November.
- (2.) In the case of sheep moved into the Dipping Area between the fifth day of April and the sixteenth day of that month, or between the sixteenth day of November and the twenty-seventh day of that month, it shall be sufficient compliance with this Article if the sheep are dipped within ten days after the movement.
- (3.) The provisions of this Article relating to the first prescribed dipping period shall not take effect in the year nineteen hundred and fifteen.

Exemptions from Dipping.

- 4. The provisions of the preceding Article shall not, as regards each prescribed dipping period, apply to the following sheep:—
  - (i.) Sheep slaughtered in the Dipping Area or moved out of the Dipping Area, without contravening Article 16 of this Order, before the expiration of that period;
  - (ii.) Sheep which during that period have been dipped under and in accordance with the provisions of an Order of the Board, or of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under any such Order;
  - (iii.) Sheep which, in the opinion of the Local Authority, it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip in accordance with the requirements of this Order, on account of their being intended for exhibition or of any other special circumstances, and which are accordingly exempted by an exemption signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority. The exemption may be granted subject to conditions as to subsequent dipping or otherwise. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board. The exemption shall be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

Notice to Local Authority of Time and Place of intended Dippings.

- 5.—(1.) For the purposes of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dipping whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped under Article 3 shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:—
  - (i.) The notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such person as the Local Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sheep in their District.
  - (ii.) The notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping, unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local Authority.
  - (iii.) The notice shall state the time and place of each intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped.
- (2.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.

# Isolation of Sheep after Dipping.

6. Sheep after having been dipped during either prescribed dipping period, shall during the remainder of the period be kept separate, as far as practicable, from sheep kept on the same premises which have not been so dipped.

#### Declaration after Prescribed Dipping Periods.

7. The occupier of a farm or holding in the Dipping Area on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in that behalf, not later than fourteen days after the

expiration of each prescribed dipping period, send a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep, in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority.

Notice of Appointment of Persons to receive Notices, &c.

8. The Local Authority shall appoint persons to receive notices and declarations under the preceding Articles, and shall give adequate notice in their District of appointments so made.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped within Prescribed Dipping Periods.

9. Restriction on Movement of Sheep into Dipping. Area during period from 16th April to 31st August.

15.—(1.) Sheep shall not be moved into the Dipping Area during the period commencing on the sixteenth day of April and terminating on the thirty-first day of August, unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Ross and Cromarty.

(2.) Sheep authorised by a licence so granted to be moved to a slaughterhouse shall on arrival thereat be there detained until they areslaughtered.

3.) Sheep authorised by a licence so granted to be moved to any premises other than a slaughterhouse shall, on arrival at the premises specified in the licence, be there detained until they have been dipped in the mode prescribed by Article 2 of this Order, except that they may be moved for the purpose of dipping or for the purpose of slaughter or for feeding purposes if such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority. The sheep, until they are so dipped, shall not be permitted to come in contact with any sheep kept on the same premises. which have already been dipped in accordance with this Order.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of Dipping Area during period 1st September to 26th November.

16.—(1.) Sheep shall not be moved out of the Dipping Area during the period commencing on the first day of September and terminating on the twenty-sixth day of November, unless they are accompanied by a licenceauthorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Ross and Cromarty.

(2.) Unless the Inspector is satisfied

(a) that the sheep are intended for immediate slaughter and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the sheep should in accordance with the provisions of this Order be dipped before movement for such purpose; or

(b) that the sheep are to be moved direct to a slaughterhouse;

a licence for movement under this Article shall be granted only for sheep in respect of which the Inspector is satisfied that they have been dipped, in accordance with the provisions of Article 3 of this Order, and have since the dipping been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped.

Special Provision as to Movement of Sheep from Ireland.

17. - (2.) Where sheep are moved with a licence under this Order, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing the said movement.

#### General Provisions as to Movement.

19. Sheep, while being moved with a licence under this Order, shall as far as practicable be kept separate from all other sheep, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 20.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

21. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

- (4.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (5.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (6.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a licence as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

# Application of Order.

1.—(1.) This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping Area").

(2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly outside the Dipping Area the whole farm or holding and the sheep thereon shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be in the Area.

# Mode of Dipping Prescribed.

2. Where under this Order it is provided that sheep are to be dipped, they shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved.

#### PART I.

RETURNS BY OWNERS OF SHEEP.

Returns by Owners of Sheep in Dipping Area on 1st September.

- 3.—(1.) Every owner of sheep in the Dipping Area shall, on the first day of September in each year, or as soon after that date as may be practicable, send by post or deliver to the Clerk of the Local Authority of any District in which his sheep may be, or to any other person appointed for such purpose by the Local Authority, a return showing the name or description of the farm or holding or other premises in the District upon which the sheep are, the description of his sheep on such farm or holding or other premises, on the first day of September, and the number of such sheep so far as such number can reasonably be ascertained.
- (2.) The owner of any sheep brought into the Dipping Area between the said date and the sixteenth day of November in each year shall send or deliver a similar return relating to the sheep so brought into the Area.

(3.) Every return shall be made on a form approved by the Local Authority, who shall provide forms for this purpose to owners of sheep applying therefor.

#### GENERAL DIPPING.

General Dipping during period from 1st September to 15th November.

4.—(1.) The owner of any sheep in the Dipping Area during any part of the prescribed dipping period shall, subject to the mext following Article, cause the same to be

dipped within the Dipping Area during that period. The prescribed dipping period shall commence in each year on the first day of September and terminate on the fifteenth day of November.

(2.) The dipping shall be carried out on such dates, at such dipping places, and in such manner as shall be required by a notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the notice.

(3.) All sheep after having been dipped shall during the remainder of the prescribed dipping period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so

dipped.

# Exemptions from Dipping.

5. The provisions of the preceding Article shall not apply to the following sheep:—

(i.) Sheep moved by railway through the Dipping Area;

(ii.) Sheep slaughtered in the Dipping Area, or moved out of the Dipping Area under and in accordance with the provisions of Part II. of this Order, before the expiration of the prescribed dipping period:

tion of the prescribed dipping period;

(iii.) Sheep which, in the opinion of the Local Authority of the District where they are kept, it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip in accordance with the requirements of this Order, on account of their being intended for exhibition or of any other special circumstances, and which are accordingly exempted by an exemption signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority. The exemption may be granted subject to conditions as to subsequent dipping or otherwise. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board. The exemption shall be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect;

(iv.) Sheep which on or since the first day of August then last past have been dipped in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District, and since such dipping have been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped; or

(v.) Sheep which during the prescribed dipping period have been dipped under and in accordance with the provisions of an Order of the Board or of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under any such

Order.

# Powers of Entry and Examination.

6. An Inspector of the Board, and an Inspector of the Local Authority of any District, subject to the direction of the authority appointing him, may, for the purposes of this part of this Order, enter any premises within the District and examine any sheep thereon.

#### PART II.

Restriction on Exposure at Markets, &c., during period from 1st September to 15th November.

7. Sheep shall not, except as hereinafter provided, be exposed for sale or exhibition in any market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition in the Dipping Area during the prescribed dipping period, unless they shall have

within forty-two days before such exposure been dipped in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District where the sheep are dipped.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of Dipping Area during period from 22nd August to 15th November.

- 8.—(1.) Sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be moved out of the Dipping Area during the period commencing on the twenty-second day of August and terminating on the fifteenth day of November in each year, unless—
  - (i.) they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted under the provisions of this Article by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are when the licence is granted; or
  - (ii.) they are moved direct to a slaughterhouse having previous to such movement been marked by the painting or stamping with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each sheep thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (2.) A licence for movement under this Article may be granted—
  - (i.) upon production to the Inspector granting the licence of
    - (a) a certificate, in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect, showing that the sheep to be moved have, within forty-two days before the licence is granted, been dipped in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District; and
    - (b) a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect, to the effect that the sheep to be moved are sheep referred to in the certificate and that since the dipping the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped; provided that for movement to a market, fairground or saleyard in the administrative county of Salop, it shall be sufficient if the sheep have been so kept separate while in the Dipping Area.
- (3.) A licence for movement under this Article may also be granted upon production to the Inspector of
  - (a) a certificate by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to the effect that he has within ten days before the licence is granted examined each of the sheep to be moved, and found it to be free from sheep-scab; and
  - (b) a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, to the effect that since such examination the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition.

A licence under paragraph (3.) shall only be granted where, in the opinion of the Inspector granting it, compliance with paragraph (2.) is impracticable or inexpedient. (4.) A declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting a licence thereon. A certificate shall also be so retained unless it refers to more sheep than are proposed to be moved, in which case a note shall be made thereon and initialled by the Inspector who grants the licence, stating the number of the sheep for which the licence is granted.

(5.) The licence shall be in force for eight days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the Form D set forth in the Second Schedule

hereto or to the like effect.

- (6.) A copy of a licence under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the licence, if such place is situate in another District.
- (7.) Sheep moved under this Article to a slaughter-house shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

# Movement of Lambs.

9. Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any lambs in the Dipping Area and in the District for which he is appointed Inspector are intended for immediate slaughter and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before movement for such purpose, or that the lambs are to be moved direct to a slaughter-house, he may, subject to any directions by the Local Authority appointing him, by licence authorise the movement of the lambs to any market, fairground, saleyard or other premises, whether in the Dipping Area or not, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence, and thereupon the lambs may be moved in accordance with such licence and conditions, and be exposed for sale in the market, fairground or saleyard, free from any restrictions imposed by any Order of the Board or any Regulation made under an Order of the Board. Provided that an Inspector of a Local Authority shall not issue any such licence for movement to premises in the District of another Local Authority unless the consent of each Local Authority onsent of such Local Authority, generally or in the particular the consenteither instance, has been previously obtained. Article does not apply to lambs more than nine months old.

#### PART III.

### GENERAL PROVISIONS.

#### Certificates of Dipping.

10. Where sheep are dipped in the presence and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of the Local Authority, he shall give the owner or person in charge of the sheep a certificate in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

# Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped' as Required by this Order.

11. Where any sheep shall not have been dipped as required by this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, without prejudice to any proceedings for the offence, serve the owner or person in charge of the sheep and the owner or person in charge of any sheep then in contact with the undipped sheep with a notice, in the Form E set forth in the Second Schedule

hereto, or to the like effect, requiring the dipping of the sheep described in the notice, and prohibiting their movement from the farm, holding, or other place where they are at the time the notice is served (except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District) until all the sheep shall have been dipped, after the service of the notice, in the presence and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, or have been slaughtered, and thereupon it shall be unlawful for the owner or person in charge of the sheep to move the sheep, or permit the sheep to be moved, in contravention of the notice.

# Licences after Completion of Movement.

12. Where sheep are moved with a licence under this Order, the licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing the said movement.

### General Provisions as to Movement.

13. Sheep, while being moved under this Order, shall as far as practicable be kept separate from all other sheep, and, if moved with a licence, shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

# Provision for Movement through Dipping Area.

14. For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of the Dipping Area in any case where they are moved through such Area by railway, or where they are moved through, or out of, the Dipping Area under and in accordance with any other Order of the Board or any licence issued thereunder.

# Special Provision as to Movement of Sheep from Ireland.

- 15.—(1.) The provisions of the Sheep (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1908 shall apply to the provisions of this Order with the substitution for the declaration referred to in Article 3 of the first-mentioned Order, of the Form (B) contained in the Sheep-Dipping (Ireland) Order of 1912 or any Order substituted therefor.
- (2.) Sheep landed from Ireland in the Dipping Area shall not for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be moved out of such Area if they are consigned to a place of destination outside such Area, but sheep so landed shall be moved from the landing-place to the nearest available railway station, and forthwith moved by railway out of such Area.

#### Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

16.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

# Local Authority to enforce Order.

17. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

# Offences.

- 18.—(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order or by any notice served, or the conditions of any exemption granted, under this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which its dipping is required by this Order or the notice or conditions shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a sheep is exposed for sale or exhibition in any market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition, in contravention of this Order, the occupier of the premises where the sheep is exposed, and the person exposing the same, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, and the purchaser thereof, knowing the same to be exposed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted or stamped on any sheep, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the sheep, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (5.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (6.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a licence as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

# Revocation.

19. The Orders described in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

# ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 1ST APRIL 1915.)

SHEEP - DIPPING (ENGLAND AND SOUTH WALES) ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

# Application of Order.

- 1.—(1.) This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping Area").
- (2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly outside the Dipping Area, the whole farm or holding and the sheep thereon shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be outside the Area.

# Mode of Dipping Prescribed.

2. Where under this Order it is provided that sheep are to be dipped, they shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved.

# General Dipping during Period from 15th July to 31st August.

- 3.—(1.) All sheep in the Dipping Area during any part of the prescribed dipping period shall, subject to the next following Article, be caused to be dipped within the Dipping Area during that period by the owner or person in charge thereof. The prescribed dipping period shall commence in each year on the fifteenth day of July, and terminate on the thirty-first day of August.
- (2.) In the case of sheep moved into the Dipping Area between the twenty-first day of August and the first day of September, it shall be sufficient compliance with this Article if the sheep are dipped within ten days after the movement.

#### Exemptions from Dipping.

- 4. The provisions of the preceding Article shall not apply to the following sheep:—
  - (i.) Sheep moved by railway through the Dipping Area;
  - (ii.) Sheep slaughtered in the Dipping Area, or moved out of the Dipping Area, before the expiration of the prescribed dipping period;
  - (iii.) Sheep which, in the opinion of the Local Authority of the District where they are kept, it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip in accordance with the requirements of this Order, on account of their being intended for exhibition or of any other special sircumstances, and which are accordingly

- exempted by an exemption signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority. The exemption may be granted subject to conditions as to subsequent dipping or otherwise. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board. The exemption shall be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect;
- (iv.) Sheep which have been dipped within the Dipping Area between the fourteenth day of June and the commencement of the prescribed dipping period; provided that—
  - (a) the dipping has been in the mode prescribed by this Order;
  - (b) notice of time and place of the intended dipping has been given in the manner required by Article 5 of this Order and such return of the dipping has been made as is required by that Article; and
  - (c) the sheep have after the dipping until the expiration of the prescribed dipping period been kept separate, as far as practicable, from sheep kept on the same premises which have not been dipped in accordance with this Order;
- (v.) Sheep which during the prescribed dipping period have been dipped under and in accordance with the provisions of an Order of the Board or of any regulations made by a Local Authority under any such Order.
- Notice to Local Authority of Time and Place of intended Dipping and Returns of Dippings.
- 5.—(1.) For the purposes of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dipping whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped under Article 3 shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:—
  - (i.) The notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such persons as the Local Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sheep in their District;
  - (ii.) The notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping, unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local Authority;
  - (iii.) The notice shall state the time and place of the intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped.
- (2.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.
- (3.) A return in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, shall be sent immediately after each dipping by the owner or person in charge of the sheep dipped to the person appointed to receive such returns by the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are dipped, except in any case in which an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority is present at the dipping.

#### Isolation of Sheep after Dipping.

6. Sheep after having been dipped during the prescribed dipping period shall during the remainder of the period be kept separate, as far as practicable, from sheep kept on the same premises which have not been so dipped.

# Declaration after Prescribed Dipping Period.

7. The occupier of a farm or holding in the Dipping Area on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in that behalf, on or after the first day of September but not later than the fifteenth day of September in each year, send a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority of the District in which the farm or holding is situate.

# Notice of Appointment of Persons to receive Returns, &c.

8. The Local Authority shall appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their District to receive notices, returns, and declarations under the preceding Articles, and shall give adequate notice in their District of appointments so made.

# Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped within Prescribed Dipping Period.

9. Where any sheep shall not have been dipped as required by this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, without prejudice to any proceedings for the offence, serve the owner or person in charge of the sheep and the owner or person in charge of any sheep then in contact with the undipped sheep with a notice, in the Form D set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, requiring the dipping of the sheep described in the notice and prohibiting their movement from the farm, holding, or other place where they are at the time the notice is served (except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District) until all the sheep shall have been dipped, after the service of the notice, in the presence and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, or have been slaughtered, and thereupon it shall be unlawful for the owner or person in charge of the sheep to move the sheep, or permit the sheep to be moved, in contravention of the notice.

# Cleansing of Dipping Places.

10. The place on any farm or premises in the Dipping Area which has been used for the dipping of sheep for the purposes of this Order shall, without unnecessary delay, be thoroughly cleansed by the occupier, and all tufts of wool gathered and disinfected or destroyed.

## Samples of Dip may be taken.

11. Every owner or person in charge of sheep being dipped under this Order shall permit and give every facility to an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board, or to a constable, to take samples of dip which is being or has been used for the dipping of sheep.

# Power to provide Dipping Places.

12. The Local Authority of any District in the Dipping Area may provide and fit up and maintain dipping places, but subject to

the approval in writing by the Board of the site of each dipping place; provided that no dipping place shall be used under this provision if its use would injuriously affect the water in any stream, reservoir, aqueduct, well, pond, or place constructed or used for the supply of water for drinking or other domestic purposes.

## Power for Local Authority to regulate time and place of Dipping in particular cases.

13. The Local Authority of any District in the Dipping Area may in any case where they think such procedure desirable for the purposes of securing the dipping required by this Order serve a notice on the owner or person in charge of any sheep requiring that the sheep shall be dipped at such time and place as is stated in the notice and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and the sheep shall thereupon be dipped in accordance with the requirements of such notice. The notice may be in the Form E set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

# Powers of Entry and Examination.

14. An Inspector of the Board, and an Inspector of the Local Authority of any District, subject to the direction of the authority appointing him, may, for the purposes of this Order enter any premises within the District and examine any sheep thereon.

# Power for Local Authority to make Regulations as to Exposure of Sheep at Markets.

15.—(1.) The Local Authority of any District comprised in the Dipping Area may make Regulations for prohibiting the exposure for sale in any market, fair ground, or saleyard in their District during the prescribed dipping period, of sheep which have not been previously dipped within such period as may be prescribed by the Regulations, and are not accompanied by such declaration as to the sheep having been so dipped as may be prescribed by the Regulations.

(2.) The Local Authority shall forthwith send to the Board two copies of every Regulation made by them under this Article.

(3.) If the Board are satisfied on inquiry, with respect to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under this Article, that the same is for any reason objectionable, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

# Special Provision as to Movement of Sheep from Ireland.

16. The provisions of the Sheep (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1908 shall apply to the provisions of this Order and of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under this Order, with the substitution for the declaration referred to in Article 3 of the first-mentioned Order, of the declaration in the Form (B) contained in the Sheep Dipping (Ireland) Order of 1912 or any Order substituted therefor.

#### Local Authority to enforce Order.

17. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Offences.

18.—(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, or by any notice served, or the conditions of any exemption granted,

under this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which its dipping is required by this Order or the notice or conditions shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person fails to give any notice or send any return or declaration required by this Order, or falsely makes any return or declaration for the purposes of this Order, or offers or utters any such return or declaration knowing the same to be falsely made, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of

1894

(3.) If a sheep is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is kept, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence

against the Act of 1894. (4.) If a sheep is exposed for sale in any market, fairground, or saleyard, in contravention of any Regulation made under this Order, the occupier of the premises where the sheep is exposed, and the person exposing the same, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, and the purchaser thereof, knowing the same to be exposed in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

#### Interpretation.

19. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires-

"Sheep" includes lambs;

"Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector and any person appointed by a Local Authority to be their Inspector for the purposes of this Order; "Person" includes a corporate body;

"Owner" includes a joint owner; "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;
"The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of

Animals Act, 1894.

# CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING BRITISH PORTS.

#### PART I.

# Closing of Ports.

Former Notices.—Nos. 1 and 101 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

- (1) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that it may be necessary to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give Notice that on approaching the shores of the United Kingdom, or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire, referred to in Part III of this Notice, a sharp look-out should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph (5), Part II, of this Notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them. In the event of such signals being displayed, the port or locality should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may exist.
- (2) If entrance to a port is prohibited, three red vertical lights by night, or three red vertical balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph (5), Part II, of this Notice.

If these signals are displayed, vessels must either proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

(3) At all the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III of this Notice, search-lights are occasionally exhibited for exercise.

Instructions have been given to avoid directing moveable search-lights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp look-out for the signals indicated in paragraph (2) above, when search-lights are observed to be working.

#### PART II.

#### Examination Service.

- (4) In certain circumstances it is also necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter the ports or localities at home or abroad, referred to in Part III of this Notice.
- (5) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7) will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the ports and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor. If Government vessels, or vessels belonging to the local port authority, are found patrolling in the offing, merchant vessels are advised to communicate with such vessels with a view to obtaining information as to the course on which they should approach the Examination Anchorage. Such communication will not be necessary in cases where the pilot on board has already received this information from the local authorities.
- (6) As the institution of the Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7), and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gur or sound rocket.

In entering by night any of the ports mentioned in Part III, serious delay and risk will be avoided if four efficient all round lamps, two *red* and two *white*, are kept available for use.

(7) By day the distinguishing flags of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border) and a blue ensign.

Also, three red vertical balls if the port is colosed.

SPECIAL FLAG THREE RED BALLS

By night the steamer will carry: -

- (a) Three red vertical lights if the port is closed.
- (b) Three white vertical lights if the port is open.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show an unbroken light around the horizon.

- (8) Masters are warned that, when approaching a British port where the Examination Service is in force, they must have the distinguishing signal of their vessel ready to hoist immediately the Examination Steamer makes the signal.
- (9) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any of these ports when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions given to them by the Examination Steamer. In the absence of any instructions from the Examination Steamer they must proceed to the position marked "Examination Anchorage" on the Admiralty Charts and anchor there, or keep the sea.

Whilst at anchor in the Examination Anchorage, Masters are warned that they must not lower any boats (except to avoid accident), communicate with the shore, work cables, move the ship, or allow anyone to leave the ship, without permission from the Examination Steamer

- (10) In case of fog, Masters are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the Examination Anchorage itself should be approached with caution.
- (11) Merchant vessels when approaching ports are especially cautioned against making use of private signals of any description, either by day or night: the use of them will render a vessel liable to be fired on.
- (12) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

#### PART IV.

Sweeping Operations.

H.M. Vessels are constantly engaged in sweeping operations off ports in the United Kingdom.

Whilst so engaged, they work in pairs connected by a wire hawser, and are consequently hampered to a very considerable extent in their manœuvring powers.

With a view to indicating the nature of the work on which these vessels are engaged, they

will show the following signals:—

A black ball at the foremast head and a similar ball at the yardarm, or where it can best be seen, on that side on which it is dangerous for vessels to pass.

For the public safety, all other vessels, whether steamers or sailing craft, must keep out of the way of vessels flying this signal, and should especially remember that it is dangerous to pass between the vessels of a pair.

This Notice is a repetition of Notice No. 101 of 1915, with the addition of paragraph (8).
