- 1. The limits of age for this situation are 14 and 16. If an examination begins in one of the first 4 months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of January in that year. If an examination begins in one of the second 4 months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of May in that year. ### 3. Geography.

Candidates must pass in writing and obtain such an aggregate number of marks as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 5. No Candidate will be admitted to examination who does not, at such time as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking, signed by her parent or guardian, that she will, if successful, reside within a suitable distance from the Post Office, either with her parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.
- 6. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height.
- 7. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination, before the commencement of the competition.
- 8. Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 10. A fee of 4s. will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice, that Open Competitive Examinations for situations as Female Learner in the Department of the Postmaster-General will be held on the 17th June, 1915, under the foregoing Regulations.

SHEEP-DIPPING (WEST RIDING AND PEAK DISTRICT) ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

### Application of Order.

- 1.—(1.) This Order applies to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as "the Dipping Area").
- (2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly outside the Dipping Area the provisions of this Order shall, notwithstanding anything contained in any other Order of the Board, apply to the farm or holding, and the sheep thereon, as if the whole farm or holding were in the Area.
- (3.) While this Order remains in operation, the Dipping Area described in the First Schedule hereto shall cease to form part of any Dipping Areas to which the provisions of any other Orders of the Board relating to the general dipping of sheep apply, and accordingly such Orders shall not apply to any portion of the Dipping Area described in the First Schedule hereto or to the sheep therein so long as they remain in the Dipping Area to which this Order applies.

### Mode of Dipping Prescribed.

2. Where under this Order it is provided that sheep are to be dipped, they shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab, or purporting to be so approved.

### PART I.

### GENERAL DIPPING.

Double Dipping during period from 1st September to 30th September.

- 3.—(1.) All sheep in the Dipping Area during the prescribed dipping period shall, subject to the next following Article, be caused by the owner or person in charge thereof to be dipped within the Dipping Area twice during that period, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings. The prescribed dipping period shall commence in each year on the first day of September and terminate on the thirtieth day of September.
- (2.) All sheep after having been dipped shall during the remainder of the prescribed dipping period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so dipped.

Exemptions from General Dipping.

- 4.—(1.) The provisions of this Order requiring the dipping of all sheep during the prescribed dipping period shall not apply to—
  - (i.) Sheep moved by railway through the Dipping Area;
  - (ii.) Sheep slaughtered in the Dipping Area, or moved out of the Dipping Area under and in accordance with the provisions of Part II of this Order, before the expiration of the prescribed dipping period; or
  - (iii.) Sheep for which an exemption from the general dipping has been obtained from the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are, which exemption shall be granted only for sheep which since the first day of July in the current year shall have been dipped in the presence, and to the satisfaction, of an Inspector of a Local Authority twice on separate dates with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the dippings, and have since the second dipping been kept separate as far as practicable from sheep not so dipped. The sheep thus exempted shall until the first day of October be kept separate as far as practicable from sheep which have not been dipped in the manner prescribed by Article 3 of this Order. Every exemption shall be signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority and shall be subject to any conditions specified in the exemption. A copy of every exemption shall be sent to the Board.
- (2.) In the case of sheep which, in the opinion of the Local Authority of the District where they are kept, it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip in accordance with the requirements of this Order, on account of any special circumstances, the prescribed dipping period may be extended by the Local Authority to the twenty-first day of October. In such case the sheep shall not, until they have been so dipped, be moved out of the Dipping Area or be allowed to come in contact with sheep which have been so dipped.
- Notice to Local Authority of Time and Place of intended Dippings, and Returns of Dippings.
- 5.—(1.) For the purpose of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dipping whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped under Article 3 or Article 4 (2) shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:—
  - (i) The notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such person as the Local Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sheep in their District.
  - (ii.) The notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping, unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local Authority.
  - (iii.) The notice shall state the time and place of each intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped.
- (2.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes

impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after

such date as is practicable.

(3.) A return in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, shall be sent immediately after each dipping by the owner or person in charge of the sheep dipped to the person appointed to receive such returns by the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are dipped, except in any case in which an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority is present at the dipping.

Declaration after Dipping Period.

6.—(1.) The occupier of a farm or holding in the Dipping Area on which sheep are kept shall personally, or by his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, on or after the first day of October, but not later than the fifteenth day of October, send a declaration as to the dipping of the sheep in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, to the person appointed to receive such declarations by the Local Authority of the District in which the farm or holding is structed.

(2.) In any case where the prescribed dipping period is extended the declaration shall be so sent not later than fourteen days

after the expiration of the extension.

Powers of Entry and Examination.

7. An Inspector of the Board and an Inspector of the Local Authority of any District, subject to the direction of the authority appointing him, may, for the purpose of this Part of this Order, enter any premises within the District and examine any sheep thereon.

### PART II.

MOVEMENT OF SHEEP OUT OF DIPPING AREA, AND EXPOSURE AT MARKETS, &c., WITHIN DIPPING AREA DURING PRESCRIBED DIPPING PERIOD.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of Dipping Area during Period from 1st Sep-

tember to 30th September.

8.—(1.) Sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be moved out of the Dipping Area during the period commencing on the first day of September and terminating on the thirtieth day of September unless—

- (i.) they have been dipped twice on separate dates with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the two dates, the second dipping having taken place within twenty-eight days before the date of movement, and are accompanied by a declaration signed by their owner, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, stating that the sheep have been so dipped, and the dates of dipping, and that since the second dipping the sheep have been kept separate as far as practicable from other sheep not so dipped; or
- (ii.) they are moved direct to a slaughterhouse having previous to such movement been marked by the painting or stamping with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each sheep, thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.
- (2.) Sheep moved under this Article to a slaughter-house shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Restriction on Exposure of Sheep at Markets, &c., within Dipping Areä during period from 1st September to 30th September.

- 9. Sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be permitted to enter, or be exposed for sale or exhibition in, any market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition in the Dipping Area during the period commencing on the first day of September and terminating on the thirtieth day of September, unless they have been dipped—
  - (a) in the case of sheep on premises situate within the Dipping Area, twice on separate dates with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the two dates, the second dipping having taken place within twenty-eight days before the date of entry or exposure; and
    (b) in the case of sheep on premises situate

(b) in the case of sheep on premises situate outside the Dipping Area, once within twenty-eight days before the date of entry

or exposure;

and are accompanied by a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, stating that the sheep have been so dipped, and the dates of dipping, and that since the dipping, or, where two dippings are required by this Order, since the second dipping, the sheep have been kept separate as far as practicable while in the Dipping Area from other sheep not so dipped.

Grant of Movement and Market Licences in special cases.

- 10.—(1.) Sheep may be moved out of the Dipping Area or be permitted to enter or be exposed for sale or exhibition in a market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in the Dipping Area if accompanied by a movement licence or market licence, as the case may be, granted by an Inspector—
  - (a) upon production to him of a certaficate by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to the effect that he has within ten days before the licence is granted examined each of the sheep to be moved, and found it to be free from sheep-scab; and a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, to the effect that since such examination the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition; or
  - (b) upon production to him of an exemption from the general dipping granted under Article 4 of this Order and relating to the sheep for which the licence is applied for.
- (2.) A licence under this Article shall only be granted where, in the opinion of the Inspector granting it, compliance with the provisions of Articles 8 or 9 is impracticable or inexpedient.
- (3.) A declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting a licence thereon. A certificate shall also be so retained unless it refers to more sheep than are proposed to be moved, in which case a note shall be made thereon and initialled by the Inspector who grants the licence, stating the number of the sheep for which the licence is granted. The licence shall be in force for eight days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

(4.) No certificate or declaration shall be required for the grant of a movement licence authorising movement of sheep out of the Dipping Area from a market, fairground, sale-yard, or place of exhibition in the Dipping Area.

### Special Provisions as to Lambs.

11. Where an Inspector of a Local Authority is satisfied that any lambs in his District are intended for immediate slaughter and that it is impracticable or inexpedient that the same should in accordance with this Order be dipped before movement for such purpose, or that the lambs are to be moved direct to a slaughter-house, he may, subject to any directions by the Local Authority, by licence authorise the movement of the lambs to any market, fairground, saleyard, or other premises, whether in the Dipping Area or not, subject to such conditions (if any) as are inserted in the licence, and thereupon the lambs may be moved in accordance with such licence and conditions, and be exposed for sale in the market, fairground, or saleyard free from any restrictions imposed by any Order of the Board; provided that an Inspector of a Local Authority shall not issue any such licence for movement to premises in the District of another Local Authority unless the consent of such Local Authority, either generally or in the particular instance, has been previously obtained. This Article does not apply to lambs more than nine months old.

### PART III.

### GENERAL.

Appointment by Local Authorities of Persons to receive Returns, &c.

12.—(1.) Each Local Authority shall appoint persons for their District or for separate parts of their district to receive notices, returns, and declarations under this Order, and shall give adequate notice of

appointments so made.

(2.) The Local Authority of a District in the Dipping Area in which a market, fair, sale, or exhibition is held shall take such steps as may be necessary to enforce thereat the provisions of this Order relating to the exposure of sheep for sale or exhibition at such market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition, and for that purpose may appoint one or more persons to receive the declarations or licences, as the case may be, required by this Order to accompany sheep entering therein. The declarations or licences shall, upon entry of the sheep into the market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition, be delivered to any person so appointed on demand by him. The person receiving declarations or licences shall deliver them to an Inspector of the Local Authority.

### Special Provision as to Movement of Sheep from Ireland.

13. The provisions of the Sheep (Movement from Ireland) Order of 1908 shall apply to the provisions of this Order, with the substitution for the declaration referred to in Article 3 of the first-mentioned Order, of the declaration in the Form (B) contained in the Sheep Dipping (Ireland) Order of 1912, or any Order substituted therefor.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep not Dipped as Required by Order.

- 14.—(1.) Where any sheep shall not have been dipped as required by this Order an Inspector of the Local Authority may, without prejudice to any proceedings for the offence, serve the owner or person in charge of the sheep, and the owner or person in charge of any sheep then in contact with the undipped sheep, with a notice, in the Form (D) set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect, requiring the dipping of the sheep described in the notice, and prohibiting their movement from the farm, holding, or other place where they are at the time the notice is served (except with a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District) until all the sheep shall have been dipped, after the service of the notice, in the presence and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, or have been slaughtered, and thereupon it shall be unlawful for the owner or person in charge of the sheep to move the sheep, or permit the sheep to be moved, in contravention of the notice.
- (2.) The dipping required may, if the Inspector considers it desirable, be a double dipping on separate dates, with an interval of not less than seven and not more than fourteen days between the two dates.

Power for Local Authority to regulate time and place of Dipping in particular cases.

15. The Local Authority of any District in the Dipping Area may in any case where they think such procedure desirable for the purposes of securing the dipping required by this Order serve a notice on the owner or person in charge of any sheep requiring that the sheep shall be dipped at such time and place as is stated in the notice and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and the sheep shall thereupon be dipped in accordance with the requirements of such notice. The notice may be in the Form E set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

### General Provisions as to Movement.

16. Sheep, while being moved under this Order, shall be kept as far as practicable separate from all other sheep, and, if moved with a licence, shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

### Provision for Movement through Dipping Area.

- 17. For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of the Dipping Area—
  - (i.) where they are moved through the Area by railway; or
  - (ii.) where they are moved through the Area by road, provided that such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District of the place where the sheep enter the Area; or

. (iii.) where they are moved through the Area under and in accordance with any Order of the Board or any licence issued thereunder.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

18.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a declaration or licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the declaration or licence, if any, by which the sheep is required to be accompanied during the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or In-

spector, or other officer.

### Local Authority to enforce Order.

19. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

### Offences.

- 20.—(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, or by any notice served, or the conditions of any exemption granted, under this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which its dipping is required by this Order, or the notice or conditions, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a sheep is permitted to enter or is exposed for sale in any market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition, in contravention of this Order, the occupier of the premises, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (3.) If a sheep is not isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is kept, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (4.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (5.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate any mark painted or stamped on any sheep, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the sheep, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(6.) If a person in charge of a sheep, where under this Order a declaration or licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(7.) If any person tails to give any notice or send any return or declaration required by this Order, or falsely makes any return or declaration for the purposes of this Order, or offers or utters any such return or declaration knowing the same to be falsely made, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of

1894.

### Interpretation.

- 21. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires-
  - "Sheep" includes lambs;
  - "Inspector" includes Veterinary Inspector and any person appointed by a Local Authority to be their Inspector for the purposes of this Order; "Person" includes a corporate body;

- "Owner" includes a joint owner
- "The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries;
- "The Act of 1894" means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

#### Short Title.

22. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP-DIPPING (WEST RIDING AND PEAK DISTRICT) ORDER OF 1915.

### FIRST SCHEDULE.

Dipping Area to which this Order applies.

An Area comprising such parts of the administrative counties of Chester, Derby, Lancaster, and the West Riding of Yorkshire, and such parts of the county boroughs of Halifax, Huddersfield, Rochdale, and Sheffield as lie within the following boundary, namely. Commencing at a point in the boundary between the counties of Derby and Chester where the River Goyt intersects the road from Macclesfield to Buxton, at Moss House, proceeding thence in an easterly direction along the northern side of that road by Goyt's Moss Farm and Clough House to St. John's Road, Buxton, thence along the northern side of that road to the junction of Station Road with The Quadrant, thence along the northern sides of The Quadrant and Spring Gardens to the River Wye, thence southerly and westerly along the course of that river to the footbridge at Upperdale, thence in a south-easterly direction along the north-eastern side of the road through Upperdale to the junction of Castlegate Lane with Ashford Lane and the road to Hassop at Headstone Head, thence southerly along the eastern side of the main road to Ashford to the point where that road crosses the Midland Railway, thence south-easterly along the northeastern side of that railway to where it crosses the main road at Great Rowsley, thence easterly and north-easterly along the northern side of the main road to Chesterfield to the point of crossing of the Lancashire, Derbyshire and East Coast Railway and the Midland Railway at Chesterfield, thence north-westerly and north-easterly along the western side of the latter railway to the point where it is crossed by the Great Central Railway, thence northwesterly along the western side of that railway to its junction with the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway at Penistone, thence northwesterly, westerly and southerly along the south-western, southern and eastern sides of that railway, via Huddersfield, Bradley, Sowerby, and Todmorden to Belfield, thence via Huddersfield, south-easterly along the north-eastern side of the road from Belfield to Milnrow, thence continuing along the northern and eastern sides of the main road via New Hey, Denshaw, and Delph to Dob-Cross at the point where the London and North-Western Railway (Huddersfield and Manchester Line) crosses that

road, thence southerly along the eastern side of that railway to where it is crossed by the main road from Mossley to Stalybridge at Stalybridge, thence southerly along the eastern side of that road to its junction with the main road from Stalybridge to Glossop, thence southeasterly along the north-eastern side of the latter road via Mottram-in-Longdendale and the Roman Road to the point where it is crossed by the Great Central Railway, and thence in a south-westerly direction along the southern side of the Great Central Railway to the Railway Bridge over the River Etherow at Broadbottom, thence south-westerly along the centre of the River Etherow to the confluence of that river with the River Goyt, thence southerly along the centre of the latter river to its crossing by the main road from Chapel-en-le-Frith to Macclesfield, thence in a south-westerly direction along the south-east side of that road to its junction with Bullhill Lane, thence southerly along the east side of that lane to its junction with the main road from Macclesfield to Buxton, thence easterly along the north side of that road to the boundary between Cheshire and Derbyshire, thence northerly along that boundary to the point of commence-

Pilotage stations established at certain Ports on account of defensive Minefields.

Former Notice.—No. 154 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

With reference to the extension of the system of Mine defence, notice is hereby given that Pilotage is now compulsory at the following ports for all vessels (including fishing vessels) which have a draught of over eight feet, and that it is highly dangerous for any vessel to enter or leave such ports without a pilot. Fishing and other small vessels having a draught of over eight feet are to assemble at the Pilotage stations and will be conducted into and out of port in groups.

(1) Firth of Forth. All incoming vessels are only permitted to enter the Firth of Forth during daylight hours; they are to pass between the Isle of May and Anstruther Wester, thence they must steer a direct course for Kinghorn Ness. On approaching Inchkeith, the Pilot vessel in the North channel is to be closed, and a pilot embarked.

Vessels are warned that they should on no account pass to the southward of a line joining the north point of the Isle of May and Kinghorn Ness, until in the longitude of 3° W., when course may be shaped for the centre of North channel.

Outward bound vessels should steer to pass the longitude of 3° W. in latitude 56° 06′ 30′ N., then shape course to pass between Anstruther Wester and the Isle of May.

The above orders apply to vessels proceeding to any port in the Firth of Forth, whether to the eastward of Inchkeith or not.

(2) Moray Firth. All vessels bound to Cromarty or Inverness must call for a pilot at Wick or Burghead.

Outgoing vessels are to discharge their pilots at one or the other of these places.

It is dangerous for any vessel to be under way to the south-westward of a line joining Findhorn and Tarbetness without a pilot.

(3) SCAPA FLOW. All entrances are dangerous and entry is absolutely prohibited by any of them except as provided in succeeding paragraphs.

Examination services have been established in the entrances to Hoxa and Hoy sounds, vessels wishing to enter must communicate with the Examination vessel and follow the instructions received from her very carefully.

The only vessels permitted to enter Hoy sound from the westward are those bound for Stromness: vessels cannot enter Scapa Flow from Stromness.

Vessels are not permitted to enter Hoxa or Hoy sounds by night.

Passage through Cantick sound is entirely prohibited.
