His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the promotion to the rank of Major-General of Colonel (temporary Brigadier-General) Havelock Hudson, C.B., C.I.E., for distinguished service in the field, with effect from the 18th February, 1915, inclusive, and supernumerary to the establishment of Major-Generals, Indian Army.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the appointment of the undermentioned Officers to be Companions of the Distinguished Service Order, in recognition of their gallantry and devotion to duty whilst serving with the Expeditionary Force:—

Major Henry William Newcome, 47th Battery, Royal Field Artillery.

For the excellent work performed throughout the campaign, especially on the 10th

and 11th March, 1915, during the action at Givenchy, when he directed the fire of his Battery from a ruined house with great skill whilst exposed to very heavy rifle fire.

The reports furnished by Major Newcome during the engagement were of the greatest value.

Major Andrew Hamilton Gault, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry.

For conspicuous gallantry at St. Eloi on 27th February, 1915, in reconnoitring quite close to the enemy's position and obtaining information of great value for our attack which was carried out next day.

On the 28th February Major Gault assisted in the rescue of the wounded under most difficult circumstances whilst exposed to heavy fire.

Major Baptist Barton Crozier, 56th Battery, Royal Field Artillery.

Rendered valuable service in observing our artillery fire during the actions of 10th and 11th March, 1915, at Givenchy, whilst exposed to the enemy's heavy rifle fire and our own shrapnel. Has been conspicuous for gallantry and coolness under fire throughout the campaign.

Major William Henry Denne, 2nd Battalion, The Bedfordshire Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry at Neuve Chapelle on 12th March, 1915, when he led a party of 20 men in a counter-attack under the most severe fire. All the 20 men were shot down, and he himself was seriously wounded.

Captain Wilfred Edward Nicol, 1st Battalion, Grenadier Guards.

For gallantry and ability at Neuve Chapelle from 10th to 14th March, 1915, when he was largely instrumental in the capture of the great number of prisoners by reason of his able handling of the hand grenade company.

Captain (temporary) William Arthur Cecil Saunders-Knox-Gore, 1st Battalion, The King's Royal Rifle Corps.

For gallantry and conspicuous ability throughout the campaign. On the 27th February, 1915, he photographed the enemy's position at Givenchy and made an important reconnaissance—the enemy's snipers being only 150 yards distant.

Captain Dick Macdonald Porteous, 1st Battalion, Princess Louise's (Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders).

For conspicuous gallantry on many occasions throughout the campaign.

His very great daring and total disregard of danger on reconnaissance duty, especially at St. Eloi on 19th February, 1915, were most noticeable.

Lieutenant Gerald Arthur Cammell, 44th Battery, Royal Field Artillery.

For conspicuous gallantry at Neuve Chapelle on 10th March, 1915. When employed as observing Officer he saw that the 2nd line of the 1st Battalion, 39th Garhwal Rifles, had lost their British Officers and at once proceeded to lead the men. He went forward in the attack with 4 men under very heavy fire, but was wounded after going 20 yards—as were 3 of his 4 men.

Lieutenant (temporary) James Robertson Campbell Greenlees, M.B., 22nd Field Ambulance, Royal Army Medical Corps.

For his great gallantry and devotion to duty at Neuve Chapelle from 10th to 14th March, 1915, in attending on the wounded under very heavy fire.

Lieutenant Greenlees has been twice previously brought to notice for similar acts of gallantry.

His Majesty the KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Military Cross on the undermentioned Officers in recognition of their gallantry and devotion to duty, whilst serving with the Expeditionary Force:—

Lieutenant T. H. Beves, 2nd Battalion, The Border Regiment.

For conspicuous gallantry and exceptionally good work performed at Neuve Chapelle on 11th March, 1915.

He led his men with great ability in the attack and was twice wounded.

Lieutenant W. G. Colquhoun, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry.

For conspicuous gallantry and resource on numerous occasions, especially at St. Eloi on 26th January, 1915, when he rescued, with the assistance of one man, a mortally wounded officer after three others had failed in the attempt, being under very heavy close-range fire the whole time.

Again on 27th February, 1915, at St. Eloi, this officer rendered valuable assistance on reconnaissance duty under very difficult and dangerous circumstances.

Lieutenant N. W. Curran, 5th (Princess Charlotte of Wales's) Dragoon Guards.

For gallantry and ability on the night of 25th-26th February, 1915, when he carried out an excellent reconnaissance of the enemy's position, and also undertook a difficult task of ascertaining what sapping operations the Germans were carrying out, with complete success.

Lieutenant Curran encountered much difficulty in this duty from barbed wire fences, and was fired at from point blank range.

Lieutenant G. D. G. Elton, 2nd Battalion Princess Victoria's (Royal Irish Fusiliers).

For conspicuous gallantry at St. Eloi from 14th to 16th March, 1915, when he obtained valuable and very essential information relative to the enemy's position on four occasions, whilst exposed to heavy close-range rifle fire.

Second Lieutenant A. H. Hales, 1st Battalion, The Duke of Edinburgh's (Wiltshire Regiment).

For conspicuous gallantry at Spanbroek Molen on 12th March, 1915, in leading the attack after being twice wounded, and subsequently for placing other wounded men under cover.

Lieutenant R. C. Hargreaves, 4th Battalion, The Rifle Brigade (The Prince Consort's Own).

For conspicuous gallantry at St. Eloi on 15th March, 1915, when he captured two of the enemy's barricades.

Has been noted for his enterprise in bombing the German saps and trenches, performing this dangerous work on several occasions when quite alone.

Second Lieutenant E. G. W. W. Harrison, 7th Mountain Battery, Royal Garrison Artillery.

For gallantry and initiative at Givenchy, on 10th March, 1915, when he rushed up his gun under heavy shell fire and close-range rifle fire, and destroyed a hostile machine gun.

Second Lieutenant W. S. Morrison, Royal Field Artillery (Special Reserve).

For conspicuous gallantry at Neuve Chapelle, from 10th to 14th March, 1915, when he accompanied the Infantry in the attack, and kept up communication with his Battery, although his wires were often cut.

He was wounded and knocked down twice by shells bursting near him, but continued performing his duties.

Lieutenant T. M. Papineau, Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry.

For conspicuous gallantry at St. Eloi, on 28th February, 1915, when in charge of bomb throwers during our attack on the enemy's trenches.

He shot two of the enemy himself, and then ran along the German sap throwing bombs therein.

Lieutenant J. G. Priestly, M.B., Royal Army Medical Corps.

For gallantry and devotion to duty at Neuve Chapelle, on 13th March, 1915, when he continued attending on the wounded with great gallantry, although himself badly wounded.

Second Lieutenant R. H. Slater, 1st Battalion, The King's Royal Rifle Corps.

For conspicuous gallantry at Givenchy, on 10th March, 1915, when he brought away the guns safely from near the enemy's wire entanglements after five of his men had been shot. He went out a second time under fire to bring in a gun which had been left in the open.

Subadar Parbat Chand, 59th Scinde Rifles (Frontier Force).

For conspicuous gallantry and exceptionally good service at Neuve Chapelle, on 12th March, 1915, when he commanded his Corps for five hours with marked ability after the European Officers had fallen.

Subsequently this Officer took command of the Machine Gun Section after the British Officer had been killed.

The President of the French Republic has conferred, with the approval of His Majesty the King, the decoration of "Croix de Chevalier" of the Legion of Honour on the undermentioned Officers, in recognition of their distinguished service in the campaign:—
