SHEEP-DIPPING (DEVON) ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

PART I.

Special Provision as to Sheep-Dipping in Dartmoor District.

- 1.—(1.) All sheep (except those exempted by this Article) which are on any lands described in the First Schedule hereto at any time during the period in each year commencing on the first day of July and terminating on the twenty-fourth day of that month shall be caused to be dipped during that period by the owner or person in charge thereof.
- (2.) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to the following sheep:—
 - (i.) Sheep moved by railway through the District described in the First Schedule hereto;

(ii.) Sheep slaughtered in, or moved out of, the said District before the twenty-fifth day of July;

(iii.) Sheep which, in the opinion of the Local Authority, it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip in accordance with the re-
