PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES FOR THE HOLLOW-WARE TRADE (GREAT BRITAIN).

SECTION 1.—In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the above Act, by the Board of Trade, and dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Hollowware Trade as defined by the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 6th July, 1914, hereby give notice that they propose to fix the following minimum or lowest time-rates of wages, clear of all deductions, for Female Workers, that is to say:—

(a) For Female Learners:

The minimum or lowest time-rates of wages for Female Learners shall be as follows:----

Thereafter the minimum rate shall be that applicable to the worker's age.

(b) For Female Workers other than Learners:

The minimum or lowest time-rate of wages for Female Workers other than Learners shall be:

13s, 6d. per week.

For the purpose of this section the term Learner shall mean a person who is employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the minimum rate for Workers other than Learners.

SECTION 2.—The weekly rates set out in this Notice are based on a week of 54 hours, and are subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours spent by the worker in the factory or workshop in any week is less or more than 54.

SECTION 3.—The above rates shall apply to all female workers employed in those branches of the Hollow-ware trade which are engaged in the making of Hollow-ware from sheet iron or sheet steel, including the processes of galvanising, tinning, enamelling, painting, japanning, lacquering, and varnishing.

SECTION 4.—The above minimum rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider Objections to the above proposals which may be lodged with them within three months from 21st April, 1915. PROPOSAL TO FIX MINIMUM RATES FOR THE TIN BOX AND CANISTER TRADE (GREAT BRITAIN).

SECTION 1.—In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the above Act by the Board of Trade and dated 27th April, 1910, the Trade Board established under the above Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Tin Box and Canister Trade in Great Britain as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 12th June, 1914, hereby give notice, as required by Section 4 (2) of the above Act, that they propose to fix the following minimum or lowest time-rates of wages, clear of all deductions,* for female workers, that is to say:---

Subject to the following conditions :---

(a) That notwithstanding the above rates no workers under 18 years of age shall be employed on power presses which, on account of their size, heaviness, or upon other grounds, are unsuitable for the employment of such persons, unless paid a minimum rate of 14s. 1d. per week.

(b) That as regards a worker employed under 18 years of age it shall be a condition of employment that she is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides her with reasonable facilities for such learning.

(c) That female workers of 18 years of age and over who have been employed in the trade for an aggregate period of less than 12 months, and who cannot suitably be employed on piece-work shall, until the expiry of such 12 months' period of employment, be paid at a rate of not less than 12s. per week.

SECTION 2.—The above rates are weekly rates based on a week of 52 hours, but they shall be subject to a proportionate deduction or increase according as the number of hours actually spent by the worker in the factory or workshop in any week is less or more than 52.

SECTION 3.—The above rates shall, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Act, apply to all female workers employed in the trade for which the Trade Board is established, namely: the making of boxes and canisters from tinplate, excluding the sealing of filled boxes and canisters with solder, and excluding the following branches of work, namely: the lining of packing cases with tinplate, the making of trunks, uniform cases, suit and dress cases, bonnet and helmet boxes, cash and deed boxes, despatch boxes, letter boxes, kegs and drums, and any other branch of work which does not form part of the tin box and canister trade. Provided that notwithstanding anything contained in this section the above minimum rates shall not apply to Clerks, Saleswomen, Travellers or to any other workers whose work stands in a relationship to the trade similar to that of the foregoing excluded classes.

SECTION 4.—The above minimum rates are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within three months from 21st April, 1915. 



2. BY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR. A PROCLAMATION.

Isle of Man

to Wit.

WHEREAS it is deemed advisable to make Orders for regulation of Orders for regulating the importation of animals into this Island.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and under and by virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, do hereby Order as follows:-

LANDING REGULATIONS.

1. No animal shall be landed in this Island unless accompanied by a Permit issued from the Government Office, which Permit may contain such conditions as may at the time of issue be considered desirable. No animal other than a calf shall be landed in this Island except at the Port of Douglas. Calves may be landed either at Douglas or Ramsey.

2. Any person importing animals shall give at least twelve hours' notice, in writing or by telegram, to the Chief Constable, Douglas, Isle of Man, of his intention to land the animals, "and of the name of the boat by which it is proposed to import them.

3. No animals shall be allowed to be landed unless accompanied by the certificate of a duly qualified Veterinary Surgeon, that such animals are free from disease at the time of shipment on an examination of such animals made within twenty-four hours prior to shipment. Such certificate shall be produced to an Officer of Police before the animals can be ment. landed, and shall be delivered up to the Superintendent of the Government Lairs on the removal of the animals to the Lairs.

The official marking of animals by a Government Veterinary Inspector at a port of shipment will be accepted in lieu of a certificate.

Where animals are imported without a certificate, but are officially marked, they shall be inspected by an Officer of Police, who before permitting them to be landed shall satisfy himself that they are properly marked.

4.—(1) Each cargo of animals landed under this Order shall on landing be driven to the Government Lairs, and the animals shall be there detained until their movement therefrom is permitted by a Government Veterinary Inspector, to be appointed by the Lieutenant-Governor, which permission shall not be granted unless and until the whole cargo has been examined by him, and certified by him to be free from disease.

(2) If two or more cargoes or parts of cargoes are permitted to be in the Government Lairs at the same time, they shall, for the purposes of this Order, be treated as one cargo.

(3) Every consignment of animals removed to the Government Lairs shall be accompanied by a statement showing the place or premises from which the animals were originally moved,

and their place of destination within this Island.

5. Animals landed under this Order and removed into the Government Lairs shall, while detained in such Lairs, be supplied with a proper and sufficient supply of food and water by the owners or consignees thereof.

6. The Superintendent of the Government Lairs shall have power to forbid persons entering the same without permission from himself.

7. The Superintendent of the Government Lairs shall keep in a book, to be provided for the purpose, a record of all animals moved into or out of the Lairs.

ANIMALS SUFFERING FROM TUBERCULOSIS.

8. Any animal removed to the Government Lairs which, on being examined by the Government Veterinary Inspector, is found to be showing symptoms of tuberculosis, shall at the option of the owner or consignee, either be at once removed from the Lairs to the nearest public abattoir and there slaughtered under inspection or sent back by such owner or consignee at his own expense to the port from which such animal was shipped.

IMPORTATION OF ANIMALS FROM ABROAD.

9. It shall not be lawful to land in this Island any animal brought from any country or place outside the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Channel Islands.

10. It shall not be lawful to land in this Island-

(a) The carcase of an animal which has died or been slaughtered on board a vessel while in a port in any country outside the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and the Channel Islands, or during the passage from any such port to this Island or thereafter while in any port in this Island; or,

(b) the dung of any such animal; or

(c) any fittings, pens, hurdles, or utensils used for or about any such animal unless they have been scraped and then thoroughly washed or scrubbed or scoured with water, and subsequently disinfected, and unless the permission of the Chief Constable has been obtained.

11. The Principal Officer of Customs and Excise in this Island, or any Officer of Police, may seize and detain any carcase, dung, fittings, pens, hurdles, or utensils landed in contravention of this Order, and he shall forthwith report the facts to the Government Office with a view to the destruction or disposal of such carcase, dung, fittings, pens, hurdles, or utensils.

INTERPRETATION.

12. In this Order—

"Government Lairs" means such place or places as the Lieutenant-Governor may from time to time appoint for the detention of animals under this Order.

"Animals" for the purpose of this Order means bulls, cows, oxen, heifers, calves, sheep,

lambs, goats, and swine. "Disease" for the purpose of this Order means cattle plague (that is to say, rinderpest, or the disease commonly called cattle plague), Contagious Pleuro-pneumonia of cattle, Footand-Mouth Disease, Sheep-pox, Sheep Scab, Swine Fever (that is to say, the disease known as Typhoid Fever of Swine, Soldier, Purples, Red Disease, Hog Cholera, or Swine Plague), or Anthrax.

"Carcase" means the carcase of an animal, and part of a carcase, and the meat, flesh, bones, hide, skin, hoofs, horns, offal or other part of an animal separately or otherwise, or any portion thereof.

REPEAL.

13. The Orders in Council of the 29th day of January, 1907, the 16th day of April, 1907, the 4th day of June, 1907, the 4th day of January, 1909, the 18th day of October, 1910, the 1st day of July, 1912, the 12th day of February, 1913, the 20th day of July, 1914, and the 6th day of August, 1914, are hereby repealed.

COMMENCEMENT.

14. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of May, 1915.

SHORT TITLE.

15. This Order may be cited as "The Animals (Importation) Order of 1915."

(Power to City and South London, Central London, London Electric and Metropolitan District Railway Companies to enter into Agreements between themselves and with the London General Omnibus Company Limited as to Interchange Routeing, &c., of Traffic, Issue of Through or Alternatively Routed Tickets, and the Formation of a Common Fund for Making Good Deficiencies in the Revenues of any of the said Companies; Payments out of Common Fund and Distribution of Balance thereof; Appointment, &c., of Joint Committee for Purposes of Agreements; Conditions, &c., under which Agreements may be made and Sanction of Shareholders and others thereto; Incorporation, Repeal, Amendment, &c., of Acts.)

N OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament by or on behalf of the City and South London Railway Company, the Central London Railway Company, the London Electric Railway Company, and the Metropolitan District Railway Company (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Railway Companies"), or one or some of them, for leave to bring in a Bill (hereinafter referred to as "the Bill") for all or some of the following amongst other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorize the Railway Companies or any of them, with the consent of the propritors to be obtained and signified in such manner as the Bill may provide, to enter into and carry into effect, vary and rescind agreements

between themselves and with the London General Omnibus Company Limited (all of which Companies are hereinafter collectively referred to as "the Companies ") for and with respect to all or any of the following matters, viz., the interchange routeing and working of passenger traffic carried on the respective railways owned or leased solely or jointly, or worked or run over by the Railway Companies or any of them and the omnibuses owned or worked by the London General Omnibus Company Limited or by any of such means; the issue of through or alternatively routed tickets and the application of the receipts of or attributable to the Companies. parties to any such agreement arising from such traffic; the payment into a common fund (hereinafter referred to as "the common fund '') of the whole or part of the balances of the respective revenues, as defined by the Bill, of the said Companies remaining after making or providing for such payments (hereinafter referred to as "the prescribed payments") by the said Companies as the Bill may prescribe and the administration and distribution of the common fund.

2. To enable and require any such agreement to provide for all or some of the following matters, viz., the making of such payments out of the common fund to any of the Companies parties to any such agreement whose revenues. as defined by the Bill are insufficient to meet the prescribed payments in any year, half-year or other period ending on a thirtieth day of June or thirty-first day of December, or on such other day as the Bill may define, such sum as may be of necessary to make good any deficiency; and the distribution among the said Companies of the balance of the common fund (after paying thereout any such deficiency as aforesaid) remaining in any such year, half-year or other period in such manner and proportions as the Bill may authorize and the agreement may provide, and to enable such agreement to provide for the making of interim payments and the adjustment thereof at the close of any year, half-year or other period aforesaid in such manner as the Bill may authorize.

3. To provide for the appointment by the Companies parties to any such agreement of a Joint Committee of the said Companies for the purposes of any such agreement and to confer on the said Companies such powers of appointment, nomination, removal, renewal, variation and regulation of the Joint Committee and on the said Companies and the Joint Committee such other powers for carrying into effect the objects of the Bill as the Bill and the said agreements may provide, and to authorize the said Companies to delegate to such Committee such of the powers of the said Companies as they think fit and as may be required for the purposes of any such agreement.

4. To make provision with respect to the terms and conditions under which the Companies may carry into effect the objects of the Bill and enter into and carry into effect any agreement under and for the purposes of the Bill and for obtaining the sanction or approval to any such agreement of the proprietors or shareholders of or other persons interested in the Companies parties to any such agreement.

5. To confer on the Companies all necessary powers for enabling them to carry out the aforesaid objects and to enter into and carry into effect any such agreement as aforesaid and to prescribe and define for the aforesaid purposes of the Bill and any such agreement entered into thereunder, the revenues and the prescribed payments of the Companies.

6. To vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would in any manner impede or interfere with the objects or purposes of the Bill and to confer, vary or extinguish all other rights and privileges.

7. The Bill will or may incorporate with or without amendment or variation the Companies Clauses Acts, 1863 and 1869, and the Railways Clauses Act, 1863.

8. To alter, amend, extend and enlarge and if need be to repeal all or some of the provisions of the following Acts or some of them (that is to say): —The City and South London Railway Acts, 1884 to 1913; the Central London Railway Acts, 1891 to 1914; the London Electric Railway Acts, 1893 to 1914; 27 and 28 Vict., cap. 322, and any other Act relating to the Metropolitan District Railway Company and any other Act relating to any of the Railway Companies.
