The KING has been pleased to give and grant unto William Cooper, Esq., Consul-General for Sweden at Teheran, His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to wear the Insignia of the Second Class of the Order of the Lion and the Sun, which Decoration has been conferred upon him by His Majesty the Shah of Persia, in recognition of valuable services rendered by him.

The KING has been pleased to grant unto Philip Ernest Frank, of the Inner Temple, Gentleman, Barrister-at-Law, Bachelor of Arts of the University of Oxford, a Lieutenant in the Shropshire Yeomanry (second son of Ernest Frank, of the parish of Chelford, in the county of Chester), and unto Clementia, his wife, only daughter of Nicolas Tindal-Carill-Worsley (formerly Nicolas Tindal), late of Platt Hall, in the township of Rusholme, and County Palatine of Lancaster, Gentleman, Master of Arts of the University of Oxford, deceased, by Elizabeth, his wife, daughter and heir of Charles Carill-Worsley, late of Platt Hall aforesaid, Gentleman, also deceased, His Royal Licence and Authority that they may take and henceforth use the surnames of Tindal-Carill-Worsley instead of that of Frank; that he, the said Philip Ernest Frank, may bear the arms of Tindal, Carill, and Worsley, quarterly, and that such surnames and arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by the issue of their marriage; the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in the College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal Licence and Permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in His Majesty's said College of Arms.

The KING has been graciously pleased to grant unto Gilbert Neville Irby, of Glanaethwy, in the county of Carnarvon, Esquire, commonly called the Honourable Gilbert Neville Irby, and unto Esme, his wife, His Royal Licence and authority that they may, in compliance with a clause contained in the last will and testament of Dame Emily Frances Smyth, late of Ashton Court, in the county of Somerset, widow, deceased, take and henceforth use the surname of Smyth in lieu of and in substitution for that of Irby; that they may bear the arms of Smyth quarterly with those of Irby, and that such surname and arms may in like manner be taken, borne, and used by the issue of their marriage; the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms, and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms.
