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LIGHT RAILWAYS ACTS, 1896 AND 1912.

NORTH LINDSEY LIGHT RAILWAYS.

The Light Railway Commissioners have re-submitted to the Board of Trade for confirmation under the above-mentioned Acts an Order made by them authorising the North Lindsey Light Railways Company to raise additional capital and for other purposes, amended so as to provide for an extension of time for the exercise of the powers under the North Lindsey Light Railways Orders of 1906 and 1913.
