Madrid, Octob. 1. N. S.

BY an Expreſs from *Barcelona*, we have Advice, That 40 Men of War had appeared off of that place, ſuppoſed to be part of the French Fleet, which is returning towards the Ocean. The Marquis de los Velez has reſigned the place of Preſident of the Council of the Indies, which is given to the Duke of *Montalto*.

From the Imperial Army under the Command of the Duke de Croy near Futack, Octob. 2. N. S. On the 22d of the laſt month the whole Army paſſed the *Danube* at *Peter Waradin*, and encamped along the River about a Mile from that place. The 25th the General received Advice, That the Grand Viſier was ſtill encamped near *Belgrade*, employing his Foot to repair the Fortifications which were ruined during the late Siege; That his Cavalry lay diſperſed in ſmall Bodies, that they might be the better able to ſupply themſelves with Forage; That the Tartars were poſted near the *Sarve*, and ſent their Parties frequently over that River to make Incurſions into *Sclavonia*; And that the Grand Viſier had ſent a Detachment of 4000 men to Conduſt a Convoy of Proviſions to *Temeſwar*. This News was confirmed on the 27th, with this farther account, That 'twas believed the Turks, after having ſupplied *Temeſwar*, would march on towards *Gyula*; and the ſame day Expreſſes were diſpatched to give notice thereof to General *Veterani*, who Commands the Emperors Forces on that ſide. The 29th Major General *Hofkirken* marched from our Camp with his own Regiment of Horſe, and *Vaudemonts* and *Bajompieres* towards *Segedin*, to cover thoſe Parts againſt the Enemies Incurſions, and to joyn, if he found it neceſſary with General *Veterani*. The ſame day Major General *Arco* left the Camp with two Bavarian Regiments, one of Foot, and the other of Dragoons, and took his march towards *Verif-Marton*, having Orders to return home. On the 30th the Army marched to this place; a Garriſon of 2500 Men, Commanded by an old Experienced Officer, being left in *Peter Waradin*.

Vienna, Octob. 9. N. S. The Emperor went from hence on Sunday laſt in the Evening to *Ebersdorf*, having before held a great Council of War to conſider of making early and vigorous Preparations for the next Campaign. The Letters from *Croatia* acquaint us with the following Particulars of the late Expedition of their Ban *Batthiany* into *Bosnia*. On the 17th he began his march with the Troops of that Province from *Coſtanizza*, and the 19th in the Afternoon arrived near *Brunzeni Mayden*, which he reſolved to Attack; and having accordingly poſted his Troops, began the next Morning to fire upon the place with ſeveral pieces of Cannon. He ſummoned the Turks to give up the Town, but they answered, that they would defend it to the laſt: And thereupon the Ban ordered an Aſſault to be made; and after a Diſpute of two hours, the *Croatians* entred the Town, and made themſelves Maſters of it; About Six Hundred Turks were put to the Sword, and many others were ſaved and made Priſoners after the firſt fury of the Soldiers was over: In this ſtorm about Twenty of the *Croatians* were killed, and as many wounded. The Baſſa of *Bosnia* lay all this while with ſome Troops he had drawn together at a place called *Vetouje*, and the Turks at *Mayden* expected he would have come to their aſſiſtance, but he did not ſtir; The Ban of *Croatia* ſent out Parties to deſtroy all the Country two or three miles round, which they performed, and having rejoyned their Main Body, he cauſed the Town of *Mayden* to be burnt, after having taken the Bombs and Ammunition out of the Magazine the Turks had there, and then returned home with a great Booty.

From Prince Lewis of Baden's Head Quarters at Herenberg, Oct. 7. N. S. The Imperial Forces, with thoſe of *Bavaria*, *Franconia*, and *Suabia*, are ſtill poſted near this place to obſerve the Enemy;

who on the 4th inſtant left their Camp near *Kieſ* and marched to *Lohr*, where they will continue till they go into Winter-quarters. One of our Parties, Commanded by Major *Zalm*, met 2 or 3 days ago a French Party not far from their Camp, and put them to the Rout, killing 40 of the Enemy upon the place, and bringing back ſeveral Priſoners and 50 Horſes.

Hailbron, Oct. 10. N. S. Prince *Lewis* of *Baden* is expected in few days at *Nuremberg*, to aſſiſt at a Meeting which is appointed to be held there for ſetling the Winter-quarters, and other Matters relating to the Subſiſtence of the Confederate Forces; at which the Count de *Hoboulae* is to be preſent on the part of the Emperor, and the Baron *Von Poſen* from the Elector of *Saxony*.

Cologne, Oct. 16. N. S. Six Regiments of *Brandenburg* Horſe, who ſerved on the *Upper Rhine* this Summer, paſſed that River ſome days ago at *New-Wiedt*, between *Coblentz* and *Andernac*, under the Command of Major-General *de Witz*, and to morrow or the day following they will enter into the Archbiſhoprick of *Cologne*, where they are to have their Winter-quarters, together with five Battalions of Foot who come by Water from *Mentz*; though the Repartition of the ſaid Quarters is not yet ſetled by the States of this Country. Yeſterday came into this place a Battalion of *Munſteriens*, and another is expected in 2 or 3 days to remain in Garriſon here during the Winter. Our laſt Advices from the *Palatinate* tell us; That the French Army was poſted at *Lohr*, not far from *Strasbourg*, and the Confederates about *Herenberg*, but that both Armies were going to ſeparate, and to enter into Winter-quarters.

Hamburg, Oct. 16. N. S. The Miniſters that have aſſiſted in the Negotiation about the Buſineſs of *Ratzburg*, having happily concluded the ſame, and ſeen the Ratifications exchanged, are moſt of them parted from hence on their return home. The Treaty is as follows.

BE it known to every one; Whereas great Differences have ariſen between his Royal Majeſty of *Denmark*, *Norway*, &c. on the one ſide, and the moſt Serene Houſe of *Brunſwicke Lunenburg*, *Zell*, and *Hanover*, on the other, by reaſon of the new Fortifications made at *Ratzburg*, and the conſiderable number of Men that has been brought over to this ſide the *Elbe*, and put into that place; For preventing the dangerous Conſequences thereof, by the Interpoſition of his Imperial Majeſty, and of Their Royal Majeſties of *Great Britany* and *Sweden*, the States General of the *United Provinces*, and his Electoral Highneſs of *Brandenburg*, and under the Guarantie promiſed by each of them, the Matter is amicably Adjudged and Agreed, as follows.

I. The former Friendſhip and good Correſpondence between the King of *Denmark* and the Houſe of *Brunſwick Lunenburg*, is hereby Renewed and Reſta bliſhed, and whatever may have paſſed on either ſide upon occaſion of theſe Differences, contrary to the ſame, ſhall be wholly aboliſhed and forgotten.

II. The Houſe of *Brunſwicke Lunenburg* Declares, That they will demolish the Fortification made in and about the Town of *Ratzburg*, and begin therewith the day after the Exchange of the Ratifications of this Treaty; That ſee
