#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by Section 3 of the Prize Courts Act, 1894, His Majesty in Council is authorized to make Rules of Court for regulating, subject to the provisions of the Naval Prize Act, 1864, and the said Act, the procedure and practice of Prize Courts within the meaning of the Naval Prize Act, 1864, and the duties and conduct of the Officers of the Courts and of the Practitioners therein, and for regulating the fees to be taken by the Officers thereof, and the costs, charges, and expenses to be allowed to the Practitioners therein:

And whereas in pursuance of the Prize Courts Act, 1894, certain Rules were made by the Order of His Majesty in Council, dated the 5th day of August, 1914, and amended by the Orders of His Majesty in Council, of the 30th day of September, 1914, and the 28th day of November, 1914, respectively, which said Rules and amended Rules were by the said Orders in Council directed to take effect pro-

visionally in accordance with the provisions of Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, from the dates of the said Orders in Council respectively:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, were duly complied with in respect of the said Rules and amended Rules, and the same were *finally* made by the Orders of His Majesty in Council, dated respectively the 17th day of September, 1914, the 28th day of November, 1914, and the 3rd day of February, 1915:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Rules and amended Rules should be further amended:

And whereas the provisions of Section 1 of the last-recited Act have been complied with in respect of such further amendment:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise in Him vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—
1. That in Order IX. (Discovery, Inspection, and Admission of Documents and Facts) of the said Rules:—

In Rule 1, the words "upon filing an affidavit" shall be omitted.

In Rule 1, instead of the words "any other party" there shall be substituted the words "any party other than the proper Officer of the Crown."

- 2. That in Order XI. (Sale, Appraisement, Safe Custody and Inspection of Prize) of the said Rules, in Rule 1, the following words shall be omitted:—" on account of the condition of a ship, or on the application of a claimant, and on or after condemnation."
- 3. That in Order XV. (Evidence and Hearing) of the said Rules, the following Rule shall be added:—
  - "21. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules the proper Officer of the Crown may apply to the Judge for leave to administer interrogatories for the examination of any person whether a party to the cause or not."
- 4. That Order XXIX. (Requisition by Admiralty) of the said Rules, as amended by His Majesty's Order in Council dated the 28th day of November, 1914, shall be, and the same is hereby, revoked, and in lieu thereof the following Order shall have effect:—

#### "ORDER XXIX.

#### "REQUISITION.

- "1. Where it is made to appear to the Judge on the application of the proper Officer of the Crown that it is desired to requisition on behalf of His Majesty a Ship in respect of which no final decree of condemnation has been made, he shall order that the Ship shall be appraised, and that upon an undertaking being given in accordance with Rule 5 of this Order the Ship shall be released and delivered to the Crown.
- 2. Where a decree for the detention of a Ship has been made in accordance with Order XXVIII., the proper Officer of the Crown may file a notice (Appendix A., Form No. 55) that the Crown desires to requisition the same, and thereupon a Commission (Appendix A., Form No. 56) to the Marshal directing him to appraise the Ship shall issue. Upon an undertaking being given in accordance with Rule 5 of this Order the Ship shall be released, and delivered to the Crown.

Service of this notice shall not be required before filing, but copies thereof shall be served upon the parties by the proper Officer of the Crown as soon thereafter as possible.

3. Where in any case of requisition under this Order it is made to appear to the Judge on behalf of the Crown that the Ship is required for the service of His Majesty forthwith, the Judge may order the same to be forthwith released, and delivered to the Crown, without appraisement.

4. In any case where a Ship has been requisitioned under the provisions of this Order, and whether or not an appraisement has been made, the Court may, on the application of any party, fix the amount to be paid by the Crown in respect of the value of the Ship.

5. In every case of requisition under this Order an undertaking in writing shall be filed by the proper Officer of the Crown for payment into Court on behalf of the Crown of the appraised value of the Ship, or of the

amount fixed under Rule 4 of this Order, as the case may be, at such time or times as the Court shall declare by Order that the same or any part thereof is required for the purpose of payment out of Court.

- 6. Where in any case of requisition under this Order it is made to appear to the Judgeon behalf of the Crown that the Crown desires to requisition the Ship temporarily, the Court may, in lieu of an Order of release, make an Order for the temporary delivery of the Ship to the Crown, and subject as aforesaid the provisions of this Order shall apply to such a requisition; provided that, in the event of the return of the Ship to the custody of the Court, the Court may make such Order as it thinks fit. for the release of the undertaking given on behalf of the Crown or the reduction of the amount undertaken to be paid thereby, as the case may be; and provided also that, where the Ship so requisitioned is subject to the provisions of Order XXVIII., Rule 1, relating to detention, the amount for which the Crown shall be considered liable in respect of such requisition shall be the amount of the damage, if any, which the Ship has suffered by reason of such temporary delivery as aforesaid.
- 7. The proceedings in respect of a Ship requisitioned under this Order shall continue notwithstanding the requisition.
- 8. In any case of requisition of a Ship in respect of which no cause has been instituted, any person interested in such Ship may, without issuing a Writ, provided he does not intend to make a claim for restitution or damages, apply by summons for an Order that the amount to be paid in respect of such Ship be fixed by the Court, and the Judge may, on the hearing of such summons, order the Ship to be appraised or to be valued or give such other directions for fixing the amount as he may think fit."
- 5. That in Form 4 in Appendix A. to the said Rules there shall be omitted the words "Commander of Our Ship of War" and the words "taken and seized as prize by Our said Ship of War."

W HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 142, and of the Act of the 61st and 62nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 23, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 19th day of November, in the year 1914, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 142, and of the Act of the 61st and 62nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 23, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a union of two contiguous benefices, situate within the Metropolis, and within the Diocese of Southwark, namely, the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Saint Saviour, Southwark, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Peter, Southwark, and for effecting certain other measures incidental to or arising out of such union:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Hubert Murray, Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwark, has caused proposals for a Scheme for effecting a union of the said two Benefices to be laid before us, which proposals were prepared under the 7th and 8th Sections of the firstly-mentioned Act, and were approved by the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwark, and were assented to by the Patrons of the two Benefices to be affected thereby, that is to say, by the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark, as the Patron, in right of his See, of the said Benefice and Rectory of Saint Saviour, Southwark, and by the Reverend Edward Grose Hodge, of The Vicarage, Paddington, in the Western London Postal District, Clerk in Holy Orders, and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, Philip Vernon Smith, of No. 116 Westbourne Terrace, in the said Western London Postal District, Esquire, the Reverend Edward Alexander Stuart, of The Precincts, Canterbury, Clerk in Holy Orders, and a Canon of the Cathedral and Metropolitical Church of Christ in Canter- $\mathbf{Sir}$ William Mackworth Young, K.C.S.I., of Oak Lea, Silverhill, Saint Leonard's-on-Sea, in the County of Sussex, and the Reverend Frank Theodore Woods, of The Vicarage, Bradford, in the County of York, Clerk in Holy Orders, commonly known as and hereinafter called the Hyndman Trustees, as the Patrons of the said Benefice and Vicarage of Saint Peter, Southwark, and the same proposals were also assented to by the Vestries of the Parishes concerned, that is to say, by the Vestry of the Parish of Saint Saviour, Southwark, and by the Vestry of the Parish of Saint Peter, Southwark:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, to be expedient that the said proposed union of the said two Benefices should be effected, and that such arrangements relating thereto and to the other matters hereinafter contained should be made as are hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Saint Saviour, Southwark, is now full, the Reverend Clifford Salisbury Woodward, Clerk in Holy Orders, an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Southwark, being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Southwark, is also now full, the Reverend William Arthur Corbett, Clerk in Holy Orders, being the present Incumbent thereof:

thereof:

"And whereas the said Clifford Salisbury
Woodward has consented to become the first
Incumbent of the United Benefice if and when
the union, which is hereinafter recommended
and proposed shall take effect:

and proposed, shall take effect:

"And whereas the said Hubert Murray,
Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwark, as
such Bishop, and also as the Patron of the
said Benefice of Saint Saviour, Southwark,

and the Hyndman Trustees as the Patrons of the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Southwark, and the Vestries of the said Parishes respectively, are willing that the Scheme for effecting the said union should embody certain modifications of the said proposals, and this present Scheme does embody the same modifications accordingly, but otherwise is based upon the said proposals:

said proposals:
"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark, (in testimony whereof he has to this Scheme set his hand and Episcopal Seal), and with the consents of the Hyndman Trustees, that is to say, the said Edward Grose Hodge, Philip. Vernon Smith, Edward Alexander Stuart, William Mackworth Young, and Frank Theodore Woods, (in testimony whereof they have to this Scheme set their hands and seals), and with the consents of the Vestry of the said Parish of Saint Saviour, Southwark, and of the Vestry of the said Parish of Saint Peter, Southwark, (in testimony of which consents. this Scheme is signed in the case of each of the said Vestries by the Chairman of a Meeting of the same Vestry duly convened for the purpose of giving such consent), we, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council. all that is in this Scheme contained under the several parts or headings hereinafter mentioned, as follows:

#### "PART I.

"As to the proposed union itself, and certain immediate incidents thereof, we recommend and propose:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Saint Saviour, Southwark, and the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Southwark, be united into one Benefice under the style of 'The Benefice of Saint Saviour with Saint Peter, Southwark,' which said United Benefice is hereinafter called 'the United Benefice.'

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the Benefice of Saint Peter, Southwark, shall be vacant the union shall forthwith take effect and the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Saviour, Southwark, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if both of the said present Benefices shall be full, then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Southwark, and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Saviour, Southwark, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and in any case it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwark to admit to the United Benefice such first Incumbent without any form or fee of or for presentation, and he shall thereupon become Incumbent of the United Benefice. Until the time of the union taking effect the said two Benefices shall remain separate and the rights and liabilities in respect thereof, and of the Incum-

bents of each of them, shall remain unaffected. "3. That if after this Scheme shall have been ratified by an Order of Your Majesty in Council, and before the said union shall have taken effect, the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Southwark, shall, with the consent of the Bishop of Southwark, retire from his Incumbency in order that the said union may take immediate effect, then

the Incumbent so retiring from his Incumbency shall be entitled during the period hereinafter specified, to receive out of the annual income of the United Benefice, and by way of compensation, an annual sum of £320, which annual sum shall commence as from the day on which the said union shall take effect, and shall be payable by equal quarterly payments in every year, provided always that the balance of the loan granted by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty upon a mortgage of the revenues of the Benefice of Saint Peter, Southwark, shall be repaid by such retiring Incumbent before any such quarterly payment shall become due. Subject to the repayment of the said loan in manner aforesaid the first quarterly payment of the said annual sum by way of compensation to the retiring Incumbent shall become due at the end of three calendar months next after the day on which the said union shall take effect, and the said annual sum shall be payable to the retiring Incumbent during the remainder of his life if he continue to be a Member of the Church of England, but not otherwise, or until he shall accept other Church preferment. And upon his accepting such preferment if the emoluments thereof be of the net annual value of not less than £350 the said annual sum of £320 shall thenceforth absolutely cease to be payable, but if the emoluments of such other Church preferment so accepted by the retiring Incumbent be of less net annual value than £350, then whilst he shall hold such other preferment the said annual sum of £320 shall in each year be reduced by a sum equal to the amount by which the said annual sum of £320 together with the net annual value of the emoluments of such other Church preferment for the same year shall exceed the sum of £350, the net annual value of the emoluments of such other Church preferment to be computed in the same manner as the annual value of a Benefice for the purpose of the Incumbents Resignation Act, 1887, and to be reckoned exclusively of the value of any house of residence. Provided always that if such retiring Incumbent shall hereafter be convicted of any offence against the Ecclesiastical Law the punishment for which would be deprivation or suspension, his right to receive such annual sum, payable by way of compensation as aforesaid, shall cease or shall be suspended as from the date of such And provided also that if the same annual sum, or any part thereof, payable by way of compensation as aforesaid, shall cease to be payable to such retiring Incumbent by his ceasing to be a Member of the Church of England as aforesaid, or by his being convicted of any offence against the Ecclesiastical Law as aforesaid, or by his acceptance of such Church preferment as aforesaid, or by his death (as the case may be) on any other than one of the quarterly days of payment, then he or his executors or administrators shall be entitled to a proportionate part of the said annual sum for the period which, at the time of such cesser, shall have elapsed of the then current quarter, which proportionate part shall be payable at the end of the then current quarter.

"4. That the said annual sum shall be charged upon the annual income of the United Benefice, and shall be payable out of the same by the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice, and as between the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice,

and the retiring Incumbent and his assigns, the said annual sum shall be a first charge at law and in equity upon the income of the United Benefice, the Incumbent of which United Benefice shall be deemed to have accepted the same subject to a trust to pay to the said retiring Incumbent or his assigns the said annual sum out of the income of the said United Benefice, and for that purpose to use all due diligence to receive and collect the income of the said United Benefice, and that if such annual sum, or any part thereof, shall at any time be in arrear and unpaid for more than 28 days after any of the said quarterly days of payment, and the fact of the same being so in arrear shall be verified by the declaration of the Incumbent who shall have so retired, or his assigns, or in such other or further manner as shall be required by the Bishop of Southwark, it shall be lawful for the said Bishop to make an order upon the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice requiring him to pay the amount in arrear within a time to be specified in such order, and if the same be not paid within such period, then it shall be lawful for the said Bishop to sequester the profits of the said United Benefice until all such arrears and. the costs of the sequestration shall have been paid and satisfied, but the power to be so conferred upon the said Bishop shall not in any wise abridge or interfere with the rights of the Incumbent who shall have so retired, or his assigns, to recover the said annual sum and all arrears thereof by proceedings at law, or in equity, or with the legal or equitable rights of the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice to recover from the preceding Incumbent of the United Benefice, his executors or administrators, any arrears of the said annual sum which ought to have been paid by such preceding Incumbent.

#### "PART II.

"As to the Parish Church of the United Benefice and the Church of Saint Peter, Southwark, and certain matters connected therewith, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—

"1. That upon the union taking effect the Church of Saint Saviour, Southwark, shall become and thereafter continue to be the Parish Church of the United Benefice.

Parish Church of the United Benefice.

"2. That upon the union taking effect the table of fees used in the Church which will become the Church of the United Benefice shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the table of fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages, and burials of the Parish of Saint Saviour, Southwark, and of the New Parish of Saint Peter, Southwark, shall be placed in the custody of the Incumbent of the United Benefice and shall so continue.

#### "PART III.

- "As to the Endowments and the Parsonage House of the United Benefice, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:—
- "1. That upon the union taking effect all the existing endowments of the Rectory of Saint Saviour, Southwark, and of the Vicarage of Saint Peter, Southwark, shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice, and out

of the revenues and income arising from such existing endowments and from the additional endowment of the capital sum of £1,500 secured by Clause 2 of this Part of this Scheme the Incumbent of the United Benefice shall first pay the said pension or annual sum by way of compensation to the retiring Incumbent which is contemplated by Clause 3 of Part I. of this Scheme, secondly, retain for the use of: himself as such Incumbent of the United Benefice a sum of £600 or any less sum that the whole of such existing and additional endowment may suffice to provide, and thirdly, pay the whole of the residue of the revenues and income arising from such existing and additional endowment in equal moieties to the Incumbents of the Benefices of Saint Philip, Battersea, and Saint Luke, Camberwell, both in the County of Surrey, and in the said Diocese of Southwark, and their Successors, Incumbents of the same Benefices, respectively, by way of augmentation of the endowments of those Benefices.

"2. That upon the union taking effect the present Parsonage House of the Benefice of Saint Peter, Southwark, shall be the Parsonage House of the United Benefice, and the capital sum of £1,500, which by an Instrument bearing date the 12th day of July, in the year 1883, and published in the London Gazette on the 20th day of the same month, was granted by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the said Rectory of Saint Saviour, Southwark, towards defraying the cost of providing a Parsonage or House of Residence for such Rectory, shall be annexed to and shall form part of the endowments of the said United Benefice.

#### "PART IV.

"Upon the subject of Patronage, we, the  $\mathbf{said}$ Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further recommend and propose:

"1. That on the day preceding the date of the union taking effect the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Peter, Southwark, which is now vested in the Hyndman Trustees, shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than the duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be transferred from the Hyndman Trustees, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark, and his Successors for ever, and that in exchange for such Patronage so transferred the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Andrew, Newington, in the said County of Surrey, and in the said Diocese of Southwark, which Patronage is now vested in the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark, as such Bishop, shall, in like manner and by the same authority, and upon and as from the same date, be transferred from the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwark, and his Successors, Bishops of the same Diocese, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in the Hyndman Trustees, their Heirs and Assigns for ever.

"2. That the whole right of Patronage of the United Benefice shall upon and from the union taking effect be vested in the said Hubert Murray, Bishop of Southwark, and his Successors for ever."

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Southwark.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for Francisco sioners for England have, in pursuance of "The Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868," duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 15th day of April, in the year 1915, in the

words and figures following, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of 'The Ecclesiastical Commission Act, 1868, Section 3, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Bristol.

"Whereas under and by virtue of an Order in Council of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, bearing date the 7th day of June, 1862, and duly published in the London Gazette of the 10th day of the same month, there is payable by us to the Dean and Chapter of Bristol an annual sum of £6,780 until the said Dean and Chapter shall have been put into possession in fee simple of real estates sufficient to secure to them a clear annual income therefrom, after deducting rates, taxes, the cost of agency, and other outgoings, amounting to £6,780: "And whereas the said Dean and Chapter

have not yet been so put into possession of such real estates in substitution for the said annual

sum of £6,780:

"And whereas there are situate in the Parish of Saint Augustine, in the City and County of the City of Bristol, certain buildings known respectively as No. 17, College Green, and the Abbey Gate House, and also certain land containing 2,126 square yards, or thereabouts, on a part of which stand the ruins of the ancient Episcopal Palace, all which said property lies within or adjacent to the Cathedral Precincts, and is shown upon the tracing annexed hereto, and is thereon marked by the red colour, and all which properties are now vested in us for an estate in fee simple, in possession, free from incumbrances:

And whereas it is desirable that the whole of the aforesaid property should be in the ownership of the said Dean and Chapter, and they have applied to us and we have agreed to transfer to them our interest therein in consideration of the reduction by the sum of £93

of the annual sum of £6,780 aforesaid:

"And whereas the terms of such transfer are in our opinion fair and reasonable:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose, with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Bristol, and with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Bristol, as Visitor of the said Dean and Chapter, testified by their having hereunto affixed their respective corporate seals, that upon and from the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any further conveyance or act in the law, the property coloured red upon the said tracing annexed hereto with its appurtenances, shall, subject always to the liabilities and charges if any to which the said property may now be specifically liable, be transferred to the said Dean and Chapter in the manner contemplated by the said Act, and that in consideration of such transfer as aforesaid the payment of the said annual sum of £6,780 shall be reduced by the sum of £93 as from the 25th day of December, in the year

1914.
"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parlia-

proved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall

have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act. And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the Diocese of Bristol.
