A PROCLAMATION

FOR PROHIBITING THE IMPORTATION OF BELGIAN BANK NOTES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS it is desirable to prohibit the importation of Belgian Bank Notes into the United Kingdom:

Now, Therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation in pursuance of section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, and We do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:—

The importation into the United Kingdom of all Belgian Bank Notes is hereby prohibited.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Fifth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the Fifth year of Our Reign.

“And whereas we consider that the Officer appointed as Deputy Director of Ordnance Services, in the Royal Naval Division, should be granted the pay and allowances authorized

under Army Regulations for an Ordnance Officer, 3rd Class:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction this arrangement, with effect as from 27th October, 1914.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under Section 3 of the Naval Forces Act, 1903, it is provided that any Volunteer Officer, or man, when training afloat or called out for actual service, shall be deemed to be serving in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force within the meaning of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865:

"And whereas under the regulations for the government of Your Majesty's Naval Service the Field Allowance granted to Officers and men employed in military operations on shore are not payable when quarters are provided at the public expense:

"And whereas we are of opinion that in the case of Officers and men attached to the Armoured Car Aeroplane Support, when employed in military operations abroad, the application of the above restriction will not be practicable:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the continuous payment of Field Allowance, in the circumstances stated, to Officers and men of the Armoured Car Aeroplane Support borne on Ship's Books, except in cases where the nightly rate of subsistence allowance is paid.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed. And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Order, made by the late King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council on the 19th March, 1908, His Majesty was pleased to order (amongst other things) that, where any property belonging to or held for the benefit of a unit of Volunteers or Yeomanry mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to that Order was vested in or held by any Trustees other than the Commanding Officer of such unit, those Trustees should, until otherwise directed by Order in Council under Section 29 of the Territorial and Reserve Forces Act, 1907, be appointed in regard to the property so vested in or held by them to be special Trustees, to the exclusion of the Association, and should continue to hold such property in trust for the corresponding unit of the Territorial Force in like manner in all respects as they previously held it for the unit of the Volunteers or Yeomanry, and that the corresponding unit should, notwithstanding any trust, limitation, or condition affecting any such property, continue entitled to the benefit thereof in like manner as the unit was entitled thereto before it became a unit of the Territorial Force:

And whereas by virtue of the above-recited provisions of the said Order in Council, and the Deed referred to in the 4th column of the Schedule to this Order, the Trustees named in the 1st column of that Schedule hold the property described in the 2nd column of that Schedule in trust for the unit of the Territorial Force mentioned in the 3rd column of that Schedule, and it is expedient that such property should be transferred from those Trustees to the County Association mentioned in the 5th column of that Schedule:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that as from the date of this Order the said property shall, by virtue of this Order, be transferred from the said Trustees to and vested in the said County Association, and shall be held by the said Association in like manner in all respects as it was held by the said Trustees for the benefit of the said unit of the Territorial Force, or for such other purposes as the Association with the consent of the said unit (to be ascertained in manner prescribed by regulations of the Army Council) shall direct.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 15th day of April, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson, or perpetual right of Patronage, of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Noke, in the County and Diocese of Oxford:

“ Whereas the Advowson, or perpetual right of Patronage, of and presentation to the said Benefice of Noke is vested for an estate in fee simple, in possession, free from incumbrances, in George Herbert Radcliffe, of the Sanctuary, Westminster Abbey, in the County of Middlesex, Esquire:

“ And whereas the said George Herbert Radcliffe is desirous that the whole Advowson,

or perpetual right of Patronage, of and presentation to the said Benefice of Noke, now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter at Westminster (hereinafter called the said Dean and Chapter), and their Successors:

“ And whereas the said Dean and Chapter are willing to accept the proposed transfer, and in token of such their willingness have executed this Scheme as hereinafter-mentioned:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Charles, now Bishop of Oxford, in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which, by the Acts in the hereinbefore-mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter-mentioned:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Noke, which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in, or in respect of which, the right of Patronage, or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Noke:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said George Herbert Radcliffe, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter, (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Charles, Bishop of Oxford, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right

of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Noke, now vested in him the said George Herbert Radcliffe, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Dean and Chapter, and their Successors, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Dean and Chapter, and their Successors for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Oxford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 15th day of April, in the year 1915, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a Separate District for spiritual purposes out of the Parish of Saint Peter, Bedford, (otherwise Saint Peter de Merton, Bedford,) in the County of Bedford, and in the Diocese of Saint Albans:

“ Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Saint Peter, Bedford, is a Parish wherein, or in parts whereof, the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the Inhabitants thereof, and it has been made

to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said Parish of Saint Peter, Bedford, which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a Separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed Separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purpose of divine worship:

“ And whereas by a certain Indenture, bearing date on or about the 15th day of April, in the year 1915, and made, or expressed to be made, under the authority of the ‘ New Parishes Acts, 1843, 1844, and 1856,’ or some or one of them, between the Reverend John Ernest Gilbert, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Saint Peter, Bedford, of the first part, the Right Honourable Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane of Cloan, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the Patron or the Rectory of the said Parish of Saint Peter, Bedford, of the second part, the Right Reverend Edgar, Bishop of the said Diocese of Saint Albans, of the third part, and us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, of the fourth part, (which Indenture is intended to be enrolled in the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice) the said John Ernest Gilbert did, with the consents of the said Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane, acting as such Patron as aforesaid, and of the said Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans, as such Bishop as aforesaid, firstly, grant and convey unto the Minister of the District hereinafter recommended to be constituted, so soon as a Minister shall have been appointed, and to his Successors, and when such District shall have become a New Parish then to the Vicar or Incumbent of such New Parish, and to his Successors for the time being, certain ground rents amounting in the aggregate to 8*l.* per annum, and hitherto forming part of the endowments of the said Rectory of the Parish of Saint Peter, Bedford, as and for an endowment for the said proposed District, and secondly, assign unto us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, the sum of 200*l.* Metropolitan 3 per cent. Stock (part of a sum of 12,259*l.* 14*s.* 3*d.* Metropolitan 3 per cent. Stock) standing in the books of the Governor and Company of the Bank of England in the name of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as part of the endowments of the said Rectory of the Parish of Saint Peter, Bedford, to have and to hold for or towards the further endowment of the Minister or Incumbent of the said intended District, so soon as one shall have been appointed, and of his Successors, Ministers or Incumbents thereof for the time being:

“ And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of 1,000*l.* sterling towards the endowment of the said proposed District or New Parish, (as the case may be), and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being, and the said capital sum has been invested in a sum of 1,054*l.* 0*s.* 4*d.* Canada 4 pounds per cent. per annum Registered Stock (1940-60), and such sum of Stock has been transferred into our name to be held by us towards the endowment of the said proposed District or New Parish, and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent

thereof for the time being, the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of such sum of Stock to be receivable by the said Minister or Incumbent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act:

“ And whereas the said capital sum of 1,000*l.* sterling has been so contributed, and paid, as aforesaid, upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the Common Fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a capital sum of 1,000*l.* sterling in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed District or New Parish when duly licensed as before mentioned a yearly sum of 30*l.* :

“ And whereas the said grant of 1,000*l.* sterling will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, chapter 111:

“ And whereas the said ground rents amounting to 84*l.* per annum have been so granted and confirmed as aforesaid, and the said sum of 200*l.* Metropolitan 3 per cent. Stock has been so assigned as aforesaid, upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said intended District, and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto, should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edgar, Bishop of Saint Albans, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said Parish of Saint Peter, Bedford, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, become and be constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes, and that the same shall be named ‘ The District of Saint Andrew, Bedford.’

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of such New Parish, and of the nomination of a Minister or Incumbent thereto, shall, without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme, and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to, and be absolutely vested in, Your Majesty, Your Heirs, and Successors, for ever, and shall and may from time to time be exercised on behalf of Your Majesty, Your Heirs, and Successors, by the said Richard Burdon, Viscount Haldane, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, or other the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain for the time being.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of Saint Andrew, Bedford, being:—All that part of the Parish of Saint Peter, Bedford, in the County of Bedford, and in the Diocese of Saint Albans, which is bounded upon the south by the Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Bedford, upon the east, partly by the last-named Parish, and partly by the Parish of Goldington, upon the north, partly by the last-named Parish, and partly by the Parish of Clapham, upon the west by the New Parish of Saint Martin, Bedford, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Martin, Bedford, from the said Parish of Saint Peter, Bedford, at a point on the western side of the road called Foster’s Hill, at or near its northern end, opposite to the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the Bedford Cemetery, and extending thence, first north-eastward to and along the said wall or fence, and then south-eastward along the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the said cemetery, for a distance in all of 35½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last-mentioned wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of The Park, and extending thence, first south-eastward along the last-mentioned wall or fence, and then southward along the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the said Park for a distance in all of 23 chains, or thereabouts, to the point where the last-mentioned wall or fence meets the northern side of the road called Park Avenue, and extending thence, first southward to the middle of Park Avenue, and then first westward, and then south-westward, along the middle of Park Avenue for a distance of 23½ chains, or thereabouts, to its junction with the road called Pemberley Avenue, and extending thence southward along the middle of Pemberley Avenue for a distance of 18 chains, or thereabouts, to its junction with the road called Pemberley Crescent, and extending thence, first north-eastward, and then south-eastward, along the middle of Pemberley Crescent for a distance of 9 chains, or thereabouts, to its junction with Kimbolton Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Kimbolton Road for a distance of 16 yards, or thereabouts, to its junction with Oaklands Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Oaklands Road for a distance of 4½ chains, or thereabouts, to its junction with Merton Road, and extending thence, first southward, and then eastward, along the middle of Merton Road for a distance of 9½ chains, or thereabouts, to its junction with the road called Goldington Avenue, and extending thence southward along the middle of Goldington Avenue, for a distance of 15½ chains, or thereabouts, to the point where it meets the northern side of Goldington Road upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of

Saint Peter, Bedford, from the said Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Bedford."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patron and to the Incumbent of the Parish of Saint Peter, Bedford, (otherwise Saint Peter de Merton, Bedford), out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patron and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Albans.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, it is provided that, in case it appears to His Majesty in Council, upon the Representation of the Local Government Board, that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in any City or Town, or within any other limits, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, or that burials in any City or Town, or within any other limits, or in any burial grounds or places of burial, should be wholly discontinued, or should be discontinued subject to any exception or qualification, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order that no new burial ground shall be opened in such City or Town, or within such limits, without such previous approval, or (as the case may require) that, after a time mentioned in the Order, burials in such City or Town, or within such limits, or in such burial grounds or places of burial, shall be discontinued wholly, or subject to any exceptions or qualifications mentioned in such Order, and so from time to time as circumstances may require: Provided always that notice of such Representation, and of the time when it shall please His Majesty to order the same to be taken into consideration by the Privy Council, shall be published in the London Gazette, and shall be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some other conspicuous places within, the Parishes affected by such Representation, one month before such Representation is so con-

sidered: Provided also that no such Representation shall be made in relation to the burial ground of any Parish until ten days' previous notice of the intention to make such Representation shall have been given to the Incumbent and the Vestry Clerk or Churchwardens of such Parish:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Harbury, in the County of Warwick, ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of Harbury, in the County of Warwick, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued in the said Parish as hereinafter directed:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by His Order in Council of the 11th day of March last, to give notice of such Representation, and to order that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 22nd day of April, 1915, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that burials in the said Parish shall be discontinued as follows, viz.:—

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 3rd day of February, 1915, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section one of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain Warlike Stores was prohibited:

And whereas by Orders of Council, dated respectively the 2nd day of March, 1915, the 18th day of March, 1915, the 15th day of April, 1915, the 21st day of April, 1915, and the 26th day of April, 1915, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 3rd day of February, 1915, as amended and added to by the Orders of Council, dated respectively the 2nd day of March, 1915, the 18th day of March, 1915, the 15th day of April, 1915, the 21st day of April, 1915, and the 26th day of April, 1915, should be further amended by making the following amendment in and addition to the same:—

(1) That on and after the 13th May, 1915, "anthracite" should be deleted from the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all foreign ports in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than those of France, Russia (except Baltic Ports), Spain and Portugal.

(2) That on and after the 13th May, 1915, the exportation of "Coal (including anthracite and steam, gas, household and all other kinds of coal) and coke" be prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates and Allied Countries.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

UNITED KINGDOM.

Pilotage stations established at certain Ports on account of defensive Minefields.

Former Notice.—No. 360 of 1915; hereby cancelled.

With reference to the extension of the system of Mine defence, notice is hereby given that Pilotage is now compulsory at the following

ports for all vessels (including fishing vessels) which have a draught of over eight feet, and that it is highly dangerous for any vessel to enter or leave such ports without a pilot. Fishing and other small vessels having a draught of over eight feet are to assemble at the Pilotage stations and will be conducted into and out of port in groups.

(1) FIRTH OF FORTH. All incoming vessels are only permitted to enter the Firth of Forth during daylight hours; they are to pass between the Isle of May and Anstruther Wester, thence they must steer a direct course for Kinghorn Ness. On approaching Inchkeith, the Pilot vessel in the North channel is to be closed, and a pilot embarked.

Vessels are warned that they should on no account pass to the southward of a line joining the north point of the Isle of May and Kinghorn Ness, until in the longitude of 3° W., when course may be shaped for the centre of North channel.

Outward bound vessels should steer to pass the longitude of 3° W. in latitude 56° 06' 30" N., then shape course to pass between Anstruther Wester and the Isle of May.

No merchant vessel is permitted to be at an anchorage, during the hours of official night, West of a line drawn from Barnes Ness to North Carr rock, and East of Inchkeith.

The above orders apply to vessels proceeding to any port in the Firth of Forth, whether to the eastward of Inchkeith or not.

(2) MORAY FIRTH. All vessels bound to Cromarty or Inverness must call for a pilot at Wick or Burghead.

Outgoing vessels are to discharge their pilots at one or the other of these places.

It is dangerous for any vessel to be under way to the south-westward of a line joining Findhorn and Tarbetness without a pilot.

(3) SCAPA FLOW. All entrances are dangerous and entry is absolutely prohibited by any of them except as provided in succeeding paragraphs.

Examination services have been established in the entrances to Hoxa and Hoy sounds: vessels wishing to enter must communicate with the Examination vessel and follow the instructions received from her very carefully.

No vessel is permitted to approach the entrance to Hoxa sound within a radius of 5 miles under any circumstances whatever, except when actually bound to Scapa Flow. Vessels bound to Kirkwall should proceed direct to that port.

The only vessels permitted to enter Hoy sound from the westward are those bound for Stromness: vessels cannot enter Scapa Flow from Stromness.

Vessels are not permitted to enter Hoxa or Hoy sounds by night.

Passage through Cantick sound is entirely prohibited.

This Notice is a repetition of Notice No. 360 of 1915, with additions to paragraph (3) relating to Scapa Flow.
