#### A PROCLAMATION

DECLARING THAT SECTIONS 2 AND 3 OF AN ACT PASSED BY THE PARLIAMENT OF CANADA, ENTITLED "AN ACT TO ENABLE CANADIAN SOLDIERS ON ACTIVE MILITARY SERVICE DURING THE PRESENT WAR TO EXERCISE THEIR ELECTORAL FRANCHISE," ARE TO BE IN FORCE.

GEORGE R.I.

WHEREAS an Act has been passed by the Parliament of Canada entitled "An Act to enable Canadian Soldiers on active military service during the present war to exercise their electoral franchise":

AND WHEREAS by sections 2 and 3 of the said Act provision is made for the supply and distribution of ballot-papers to persons serving in the military forces of Canada in the present war, and for the marking thereof by such persons and the return thereof by officers serving in the said forces to the returning officer of the electoral district in Canada wherein an election is to be held, and for counting and

recording such ballot-papers and otherwise dealing with them in the same manner as other ballot-papers used at such elections, and generally for the duties to be performed by officers of the military forces of Canada in connection with such distribution marking and return of ballot-papers as aforesaid:

AND WHEREAS by section 4 of the said Act it is provided that sections 2 and 3 of the Act shall not come into force until a Proclamation by His Majesty the King in Council declaring them to be in force shall be published in the Canada Gazette:

And whereas it is expedient to make such Proclamation as aforesaid:

Now, THEREFORE, We are pleased, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to proclaim, and do hereby proclaim, that sections 2 and 3 of the above recited Act are in force.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this fifth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, and in the Fifth year of Our Reign.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that at a Trial of the Pyx, begun at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the city of London, on the 9th March, and concluded on the 27th April, 1915, the following Verdicts of the Pyx Jury were delivered to the King's Remembrancer, viz.:—

### TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT.

#### VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the city of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's Gold and Silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint, from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, both days inclu-We ascertained that the number of coins, both of Gold and Silver, in each packet produced to us, corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to sixty-one sovereigns or twenty-shilling pieces, and to thirty-nine half-sovereigns or ten-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was nil on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said Gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the

standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus six hundred thousandths (or + 00006), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue six Sovereigns and four Half-Sovereigns, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such Sovereigns weighed respectively—the first 123 195 grains, the second 123.441 grains, the third 123.356 grains, the fourth 123.245 grains, the fifth 123 169 grains, the sixth 123 331 grains, and that such half-sovereigns weighed respectively—the first 61.535 grains, the second 61.588 grains, the third 61.530 grains, and the fourth 61.570 grains. We then assayed the said six sovereigns and four half-sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be-the first 916.40, the second 916.80, the third 916.92, the fourth 916.68, the fifth 916.77, the sixth 916.87 respectively, and the millesimal fineness of such half-sovereigns to be-the first 916.81, the second 916.73, the third 916.80, and the fourth 916.80 respectively. We also took a coin from each of such packets of silver coins, making altogether eighty-four half-crowns, eighty florins, seventy-two shillings, sixtyone sixpences, one fourpence, twenty-five threepences, one twopence, and one penny, and weighed each of the said silver coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the said Coinage Act, 1891. We found that the amount of variation from the standard weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was minus nineteen-thousandths of an ounce (-- '019 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said Silver coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Silver Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended, was minus eight tenthousandths (or -0008), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue three half-crowns, three florins, two shillings, two sixpences, and one threepence, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such half-crowns weighed respectively—the first 218 826 grains, the second 217 930 grains, and the third 218 150 grains; that such florins weighed respectively—the first 174 631 grains, the second 173 905 grains, and the third 174 623 grains; that such shillings weighed respectively—the first 87.097 grains, and the second 87.165 grains; that such sixpences weighed respectively—the first 43.750 grains, and the second 43 458 grains; and that such threepence weighed 21 852 grains. We then assayed the said three half-crowns, the said three florins, the said two shillings, the said two sixpences, and the said threepence

separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such half-crowns to be respectively—the first 923.7, the second 924.1, and the third 925.2; of such florins to be respectively—the first 924.2, the second 924.5, and the third 923.7; of such shillings to be respectively—the first 925.6, and the second 924.6; of such sixpences to be respectively—the first 925.3, and the second 925.3; and of such threepence to be 924.8.

### TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE PERTH BRANCH MINT.

#### VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Perth, in the State of Western Australia, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to one hundred and five sovereigns or twenty shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, We found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus eight thousandths of an ounce (+ '008 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus eleven

hundred thousandths (or + '00011), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue six sovereigns, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively: the first 123.247 grains, the second 123.276 grains, the third 123.328 grains, the fourth 123.228 grains, the fifth 123.195 grains, and the sixth 123.245 grains. We then assayed the said six sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916.74, the second 916.77, the third 916.69, the fourth 916.85, the fifth 916.74, and the sixth 916.77 respectively.

#### VERDICT.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the ninth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's gold coins in the Pyx of the Branch Mint at Sydney, in the State of New South Wales, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Branch Mint from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fourteen, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins in each packet produced to us corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took two coins from each of such packets of gold coins, amounting altogether to eighty-two sovereigns or twentyshilling pieces, and to twelve half-sovereigns or ten-shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, and ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight prescribed in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870, as amended by the Coinage Act, 1891. found that the amount of variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus two thousandths of an ounce (+ '002 oz.) on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard gold Trial Plate produced

by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the standard of fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus two ten thousandths (or + '0002), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue six sovereigns and two halfsovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such sovereigns weighed respectively, the first 123 239 grains, the second 123:316 grains, the third 123:283 grains, the fourth 123:341 grains, the fifth 123 171 grains, and the sixth 123 221 grains, and that such half-sovereigns weighed respectively, the first 61.691 grains and the second 61.598 grains. We then assayed the said six sovereigns and two half-sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such sovereigns to be, the first 916.69, the second 916.73, the third 916.79, the fourth 916.81, the fifth 916.75, and the sixth 916.92, respectively, and the millesimal fineness of such halfsovereigns to be, the first 916.82 and the second 916.82 respectively.

We then melted the said Gold coins so taken out and weighed into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the standard Gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act amended as aforesaid, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act as so amended was plus seventeen hundred thousandths (or + 00017), and that, therefore, the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue six Sovereigns and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such Sovereigns weighed respectively, the first 123.173 grains, the second 123.176 grains, the third 123.123 grains, the fourth 123.282 grains, the fifth 123.223 grains, and the sixth 123.298 grains. We then assayed the said six Sovereigns separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such Sovereigns to be, the first 916.77, the second 916.98, the third 917.08, the fourth 916.83, the fifth 916.87, the sixth 916.91 respectively.

SHEEP DIPPING (BLACK MOUNTAIN DISTRICT)
ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Application of Part I of Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1914 with modifications.

- 1.—(1) Part I (Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of a Movement Area) of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1914 is hereby applied during the period commencing on the fifteenth day of July and terminating on the thirtieth day of September in each year to the Area described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall during such period be a Movement Area for the purposes of that Order, but subject to the modifications contained in this Article.
- (2.) The restrictions on movement of sheep applied by the said Order and this Order shall not apply to (i.) sheep moved through the

Movement Area by road if they are not permitted to come in contact with other sheep during the movement through the Area; or (ii.) sheep moved out of the Area for the purpose of being dipped on premises outside the Area under and in accordance with the requirements of a Notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority served under Article 2 of this Order.

Double Dipping of all Sheep during period from 1st September to 30th September.

-(1.) All sheep—except those exempted by the applied provisions of Article 4 of the Sheep-Dipping (England and South Wales) Order of 1915 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order ") which are on any lands to which this Article applies at any time during any part of the period commencing on the fifteenth day of July and terminating on the thirtieth day of September, in any year, shall be caused to be dipped during that year by the owner or person in charge thereof twice during the period commencing on the first day of September and terminating on the thirtieth day of that month (herein referred to as "the prescribed dipping period") by a thorough immersion in a sheep dip approved by the Board for sheep scab or purporting to be so approved, with an interval of not less than seven days between the dippings. dipping shall be carried out on such date, at such dipping place, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District wherein the sheep are, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice. Each dipping shall, where practicable, take place on lands to which this Article applies, but where such dipping is not practicable, the Notice may require the dipping to be carried out on other premises specified in the Notice, and may impose any conditions as to movement, detention, isolation and dipping of the sheep which the Inspector may consider desirable and specify in the Notice. Sheep which are required by this Article to be dipped in any year shall be exempt from the general dipping in that year required by Article 3 of the principal Order.

(2.) If the owner or person in charge of sheep to which a Notice served under paragraph (1) of this Article relates fails to comply with any condition specified in such Notice he shall, according to his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) Articles 3, 4 (iv.), 5 and 7 of the principal Order shall not apply to sheep affected by this Article, but otherwise that Order shall apply with the substitution of the prescribed dipping period for the prescribed dipping period therein specified.

(4.) This Article shall apply to the lands described in the Second Schedule hereto, and also to any lands in the neighbourhood to which it may be applied by a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority and served upon the occupier of the lands described in such Notice.

(5.) This Article shall cease to apply to any lands upon service on the occupier thereof of a Notice to that effect signed by an Inspector of the Board.

(6.) A copy of every Notice served under paragraph (4) of this Article by an Inspector

of the Local Authority shall forthwith be sent to the Board by the Inspector signing the same.

#### Short Title, &c.

3. This Order may be cited as the SHEEP DIPPING (BLACK MOUNTAIN DISTRICT) ORDER or 1915, and shall be read with the principal Order.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1.—(1.) Sheep brought from the Island of St. Kilda or Dune Island or Soay Island or Boreray Island, in the county of Inverness, shall not be landed in any other part of Great Britain unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising the movement of the sheep

to premises for detention under this Order granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which those premises are situate, and such licence shall operate as an authority to land the sheep at any place situate in the District of the Local Authority by whose Inspector the licence is granted, and not elsewhere. The licence shall be available for eight days, inclusive of the day of issue, and no longer.

- The sheep shall be moved from the place of landing to the place of detention specified in the licence by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement they shall, so far as practicable, be kept separate from all sheep not being moved with a licence under this Order.
- (3.) Sheep moved to a place of detention shall within seven days of their arrival thereat be dipped by the owner or other person in charge thereof by a thorough immersion in an efficient sheep-dip in the presence and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and shall not be moved from the place of detention until they have been so dipped, except for the purpose of being dipped.
- (4.) The owner or other person in charge of sheep detained under this Article shall keep the same separate from other sheep.
- (5.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing such move-
- (6.) The licence may be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule to the Invernessshire (Skye and Outer Islands) Sheep-Scab Order of 1915, with such modifications as may be necessary.
- (7.) The expression "efficient sheep-dip" means a sheep-dip approved by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries for sheep-scab, or purporting to be so approved.
- (8.) This Article does not restrict the removal of any carcase of a sheep.
- 2. If a sheep is landed or moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing or movement, and the person landing or moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been landed or moved in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

INVERNESS-SHIRE (SKYE AND OUTER ISLANDS) SHEEP-SCAB ORDER OF 1915.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

#### Application of Order.

- 1.—(1.) This Order shall apply to the areas described in the First Schedule hereto, each of which is hereinafter referred to as a Scheduled Area.
- (2.) Where any farm or holding is situate partly within and partly outside a Scheduled Area the whole farm or holding and the sheep thereon shall for the purposes of this Order be deemed to be in the Area.

#### Mode of Dipping Prescribed.

2. Where under this Order it is provided that sheep are to be dipped, they shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheepdip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved.

#### PART I.

RETURNS BY OWNERS OF SHEEP.

Returns by Owners of Sheep in Scheduled Areas on 25th July.

- 3.—(1.) Every owner of sheep in each Scheduled Area shall, on the twenty-fifth day of July in each year, or as soon after that date as may be practicable, send by post or deliver to a Police Constable of the District a return showing the name or description of the farm or holding or other premises in the Scheduled Area upon which the sheep are, the description of his sheep on such farm or holding or other premises, on the twenty-fifth day of July, and the number of such sheep so far as such number can reasonably be ascertained.
- (2.) The owner of any sheep brought into a Scheduled Area between the said date and the first day of September in each year, shall send or deliver a similar return relating to the sheep so brought into the Area.
- (3.) Every return shall be made on a form approved by the Local Authority, who shall provide forms for this purpose to owners of sheep applying therefor.

#### COMPULSORY DIPPING.

Double Dipping of all Sheep in Scheduled Areas during period from 25th July to 31st

4.—(1.) While this Order remains in operation sheep in a Scheduled Area shall be exempt from the provisions of Article 3 of the Sheep-Dipping (Scotland and North of Englanz) Order of 1915, so far as they relate to dipping within the first prescribed dipping period, and shall be subject to the substituted provisions of this Article.

(2.) The owner of any sheep in a Scheduled Area during the period commencing on the twenty-fifth day of July and terminating on the thirty-first day of August in each year (hereinafter referred to as "the prescribed dipping period ") shall cause the same to be dipped twice during that period, with an interval of not less than seven days between the dippings.

(3.) Each dipping shall be carried out on such date, at such dipping place, and in such manner as shall be required by a Notice signed by an Inspector of the Local Authority, and served by post, or otherwise, on the owner or person in charge of the sheep referred to in the Notice.

4.) All sheep after the earlier dipping shall during the remainder of the prescribed dipping period be kept isolated, as far as practicable, from sheep which have not been so dipped.

(5.) An Inspector of the Board, and an Inspector of the Local Authority, subject to the direction of the authority appointing him, may, for the purpose of this part of this Order, enter any premises within a Scheduled Area and examine any sheep thereon.

6.) This Article shall not in relation to either of the Scheduled Areas apply to the

undermentioned sheep:

(i.) sheep moved out of the Scheduled Area under and in accordance with the provisions of Article 5 of this Order, or slaughtered within the Area, during the pre-

scribed dipping period; or

- (ii.) sheep moved through the Scheduled Area by road from a place outside that Area to another place outside that Area, provided that such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority, in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.
- (7.) Articles 5 and 7 of the Sheep-Dipping (Scotland and North of England) Order of 1915, so far as they relate to the first prescribed dipping period, shall not apply to sheep in a Scheduled Area.

#### PART II.

#### RESTRICTION ON MOVEMENT.

Restriction on Movement of Sheep out of Scheduled Areas or to Markets within Scheduled Areas, during period from 25th July to 31st August.

-(1.) Sheep shall not (except as hereinafter provided) be moved out of a Scheduled Area, or be permitted to enter, or be exposed for sale or exhibition in, any market, fairground, saleyard or place of exhibition in a Scheduled Area, during the prescribed dipping period, unless-

(i.) they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement or exposure granted by an Inspector of the Local Autho-

rity; or

(ii.) they are moved direct to a slaughterhouse having previous to such movement been marked by the painting or stamping with an indelible composition of red colour of a broad line down the back and another broad line across the loins of each sheep thus +, each line being not less than nine inches long.

- (2.) A licence for movement or exposure of sheep under this Article may be granted upon production to the Inspector granting the licence of
  - (a) certificates, in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect, showing that the sheep have been dipped to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority twice on separate dates with an interval of not less than seven and not more than twenty-one days between the two dates, and that the second dipping has taken place within twenty-eight days of the granting of the licence; and (b) a declaration signed by the owner of

the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, in the Form C set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect, to the effect that the sheep are sheep referred to in the certificate, and that since the earlier dipping the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped.

(3.) A licence for movement or exposure of sheep under this Article may also be granted

upon production to the Inspector of

(a) a certificate by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon to the effect that he has within ten days before the licence is granted examined each of the sheep and found it to be free from sheep-scab; and

(b) a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, to the effect that since such examination the sheep have been kept separate from other sheep, and have not been exposed in any market, fairground, saleyard or exhibition.

A licence under paragraph (3.) shall only be granted where, in the opinion of the Inspector granting it, compliance with paragraph (2.) is impracticable or inexpedient.

- (4.) A declaration shall be retained by the Inspector granting a licence thereon. A certificate shall also be so retained unless it refers to more sheep than are proposed to be moved or exposed, in which case a note shall be made thereon and initialed by the Inspector who grants the licence, stating the number of the sheep for which the licence is granted.
- (5.) The licence shall be in force for eight days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.
- (6.) A copy of a licence under this Article shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which is situate the place of destination specified in the licence, if such place is situate in another District.
- (7.) Sheep moved under this Article to a slaughter-house shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.

#### Movement to Dipping Places.

- 6. Sheep may be moved out of a Scheduled Area to a dipping-place if accompanied by a licence in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the sheep are when the licence is granted, or by an Inspector of the Board, and subject to the following conditions, namely:-
  - (a) The sheep shall after being dipped at the dipping-place be moved as soon as prac-

ticable back into the Scheduled Area from which they were moved to the dipping-place:

(b) The movement of the sheep to and from the dipping-place shall take place under the supervision of an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority:

(c) During the movement of the sheep to and from the dipping-place and their detention thereat the sheep shall as far as practicable be kept separate from all other sheep.

#### PART III.

#### GENERAL PROVISIONS.

#### Cleansing of Dipping Places.

7. Any part of a farm or other dippingplace which has been used for the dipping of sheep for the purposes of this Order shall, without unnecessary delay after each dipping and before any sheep are placed therein, be thoroughly cleansed by the occupier at his own expense and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, and all tufts of wool gathered and disinfected or destroyed.

#### Disinfection.

8. The occupier of any premises in a Scheduled Area shall, if so required by a notice served on him by an Inspector of the Local Authority, disinfect at his own expense and to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority any building, pen or like enclosure on the premises which has been used for sheep.

#### Certificates of Dipping.

9. Where sheep are dipped in terms of this Order to the satisfaction of an Inspector of the Local Authority, he shall give the owner or person in charge of the sheep a certificate in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

#### Licences after Completion of Movement.

10. Where sheep are moved with a licence under this Order, the licence shall forthwith, after completion of the movement, be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the sheep at the time of completing the said movement.

#### General Provisions as to Movement.

11. Sheep, while being moved under this Order, shall as far as practicable be kept separate from all other sheep, and, if moved with a licence, shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence, and not elsewhere.

### Provision for Movement through Scheduled Areas.

12. For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of a Scheduled Area in any case where they are moved through such Area by road from a place outside such Area to another place outside such Area, provided that such movement is authorised by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority, in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

#### Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

13.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or

other officer.

#### Local Authority to enforce Order.

14. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

#### Offences.

- 15.—(1.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Order, the owner and person in charge of the sheep at the expiration of the period within which its dipping is required by this Order shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (2.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3.) If a sheep is permitted to enter or is exposed for sale or exhibition in any market, fairground, saleyard, or place of exhibition, in contravention of this Order, the occupier of the premises, and the owner and person in charge of the sheep, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

- (4.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by clipping, or washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted or stamped on any sheep, as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the sheep, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (5.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order. fails to give his true name and address. or gives a false name or address. he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.
- (6.) If any person fails to deliver up or send a licence or return as required by this Order, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.


