

Infected Area except under the authority, and in accordance with the conditions (if any), of a licence granted by an Inspector of the Board.

(2) Where any bush has been moved in contravention of this Article an Inspector of the Board may, by notice served by post or otherwise on the person in whose possession or under whose charge the bush is, require the movement forthwith of the bush back to the premises from which it was lifted or taken for the purpose of the movement out of the Infected Area, or its destruction forthwith by fire if the owner so prefer.

*Partial Exemption from General Order.*

6. No part of an Infected Area shall be declared to be "infected premises" under the American Gooseberry Mildew Order of 1911, and any premises included in an Infected Area shall cease to be "infected premises."

*Definitions.*

7. In this Order—

"The Board" means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

"Disease" means the disease affecting gooseberry bushes known as *Sphaerotheca mors-uvæ* or American Gooseberry Mildew, and "diseased" means affected with disease.

"Bush" includes a part of a bush.

*Offences.*

8. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who—

(1) fails to give notification of disease as required by Article 2; or

(2) fails to destroy any diseased fruit as required by Article 3; or

(3) fails to cut off and destroy all traces of disease as required by Article 4; or

(4) moves or permits to be moved any bush in contravention of Article 5, or fails to comply with any notice served under that Article.

*Short Title.*

9. This Order may be cited as the AMERICAN GOOSEBERRY MILDEW (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1915.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AMENDMENT  
ACT, 1907.

THE RURAL DISTRICT OF WARMINSTER, IN THE  
COUNTY OF WILTS.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Local Government Board, in exercise of their powers in that behalf, have, by an Order dated the 24th day of May instant, and numbered No. 29177. C

63,687, ordered and declared that, on and after the 14th day of June, 1915, sections 27 and 33 comprised in Part XI of the above Act of 1907 shall be in force in the several contributory places within the said district.

The said section 27 shall be in force in each of the contributory places within the district, subject to the following condition and adaptation, that is to say—

Unless and until the Board by a further order, made on such application and after compliance with such requirements as are described and set forth in section 3 of the said Act of 1907, otherwise declare, specify and direct the said section in its application to the contributory place and in relation to the exercise of the powers and to the discharge of the duties of the Local Authority under that section shall have effect as if the words and figure following were added to and formed part of the section, that is to say—

"7. Nothing in this section shall apply to any temporary building erected or set up for use by the Territorial Force."

COUNTY OF WEST SUSSEX.

NORFOLK BRIDGE, SHOREHAM-BY-SEA.

1. The West Sussex County Council hereby give notice that, pursuant to section 6 of the Locomotives Act, 1898, they propose, at the end of one calendar month from the 1st day of June, 1915, to apply to the Local Government Board, under the above Act, to confirm the following bye-law:—

2. "Bye-law made by the West Sussex County Council for prohibiting the use of locomotives on Norfolk Bridge, Shoreham-by-Sea, in the county of West Sussex.

"1. In the following bye-law the expression 'The County Council' means the County Council of the Administrative County of West Sussex.

"2. A person in charge of a locomotive shall not use such locomotive on Norfolk Suspension Bridge, Shoreham-by-Sea, in the county of West Sussex, which spans the River Adur, which is a suspension bridge whereon the use of locomotives is hereby prohibited, the County Council being satisfied that such suspension bridge is unsuited for locomotive traffic, and that such use would be attended with damage to the bridge and danger to the public."

3. A copy of this bye-law will be kept at the office of the undersigned, and be open for the free inspection of any ratepayer or other person interested for one calendar month from the 1st day of June, 1915.

4. A printed copy of the proposed bye-law will be supplied free of charge to any person interested.
