41209	Gunner ..	Mulcahy, J. ...	2a Reserve Brigade, Royal Field Artillery	For conspicuous gallantry and ability. Went forward with the Infantry in their attack and rendered excellent service by keeping up communications—mending the wire several times under heavy fire. Was severely wounded in the head.
9266	Serjeant ...	Munro, D. D. C. ...	2nd Battalion, Gordon Highlanders	For gallant conduct and resource at Neuve Chapelle on 12th March, 1915, when he led his men forward with ability to assist the 6th (Banff and Donside) Battalion Gordon Highlanders, in their attack on the enemy's trenches.
33	Acting Company Serjeant-Major	Murray, C. A. ...	1/3rd (City of London) Battalion, The London Regiment (Royal Fusiliers T.F.)	For gallant conduct during the assault on the German trenches at Neuve Chapelle on 10th March, 1915, and again on the following day during the enemy's counter-attack.
2224	Acting-Serjeant	Newman, F. ...	1/3rd (City of London) Battalion, The London Regiment (Royal Fusiliers T.F.)	For conspicuous gallantry at Neuve Chapelle on 10th March, 1915, during our charge on the enemy's trenches. Although wounded he continued to encourage his men.
1302	Private ...	Nicoll, J. ...	5th Angus and Dundee Battalion, Royal Highlanders (T.F.) (attached 1st Battalion)	For gallant conduct in going out voluntarily into the open and bringing several wounded men into cover, whilst under heavy machine-gun fire.
2060	Serjeant ...	Norman, F. C. ...	2nd Battalion, Royal Warwickshire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry and ability at Neuve Chapelle on 14th March, 1915, when he handled his men with great gallantry. Subsequently Serjeant Norman dressed the wounded and attended to them, whilst exposed to heavy fire.
4048	Private ...	Oakes, C. ...	2nd Battalion, Leicestershire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry from 10th to 12th March, 1915, near Neuve Chapelle, when he displayed great courage and the utmost devotion to duty in removing the wounded from the firing line to the aid post for three whole days, without rest and hardly any food. During this period he was constantly under very heavy fire.
4324	Private ...	O'Connor, P. ...	The Connaught Rangers	For conspicuous gallantry, marked ability, and initiative, from 14th to 22nd March, 1915, near Rue du Bois, in reconnoitring the enemy's position at close quarters and obtaining very exact information under circumstances of great risk.
—	Private ...	O'Sullivan, E. C. ...	Indian Volunteer Maxim Gun Company	For gallant conduct, coolness, and ability during the engagement on 3rd November, 1914, at Longido (East Africa). Whilst under heavy fire he handled his machine gun very effectively against the enemy in their counter-attack.
48673	Gunner ...	Ousbey, E. ...	11th Brigade, Staff Royal Field Artillery	For gallant conduct in repairing the telephone lines under shell and rifle fire at Neuve Chapelle on 14th March, 1915. Has rendered valuable service with the Brigade Headquarters telephones.
8607	Private ...	Palmer, W. G. ...	2nd Battalion, Dorsetshire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry near Ahwaz (Turkey in Asia) on 3rd March, 1915, when he rendered valuable service at a critical stage by rallying parties of Indian Infantry who were being hard pressed by superior numbers of the enemy. Private Palmer assisted in rescuing the wounded on several occasions during the action.
