6620	Private ...	Walker, W. ...	2nd Battalion, East Lancashire Regiment	For gallant conduct in assisting an Officer to rescue a severely wounded Non-commissioned Officer whilst under machine-gun fire.
10423	Corporal ...	Ward, J. J. ...	2nd Battalion, South Wales Borderers.	For conspicuous gallantry on the night of 5th-6th November, 1914, at Tsingtau, in going out voluntarily, regardless of danger, under very heavy close-range fire, to search for the wounded, and eventually succeeding in rescuing one wounded man.
742	Private ...	Ward, J. T. ...	1st Battalion, Seaforth Highlanders	For conspicuous gallantry and excellent service rendered on 12th March, 1915, at Neuve Chapelle. By the very effective use of a trench mortar gun, whilst exposed to heavy fire, he greatly assisted the infantry in capturing the enemy's trenches.
8779	Serjeant (now Company Serjeant-Major)	Ward, L. ...	2nd Battalion, Royal Irish Fusiliers	For conspicuous gallantry and ability at St. Eloi on 14th March, 1915. When all the Officers and the Company Serjeant-Major had been killed or wounded, he collected the men who were left, and, on being forced by enfilade fire to abandon his trench, took up another position, which he held until assistance arrived.
971	Squadron Serjeant-Major	Warren, J. C. ...	Queen's Own Oxfordshire Hussars	For conspicuous gallantry on 3rd November, 1914, at Wulverghem, when he took a prominent part with two Troops in crawling up a field to fill a gap in the line of trenches, under very heavy shell fire. Has been noted for voluntarily undertaking dangerous and difficult work.
1570	Private ...	Watt, J. S....	6th (Banff and Don-side) Battalion, Gordon Highlanders (T.F.)	For the gallantry displayed in the attack at Neuve Chapelle on 13th March, 1915. Showed a fine example to his comrades during this heavy engagement.
30533	Serjeant ...	Wells, F. J....	"S" Battery, Royal Horse Artillery	For conspicuous gallantry near Shaiba (Turkey in Asia), on 3rd March, 1915. When the teams of a gun were down during a critical moment of the engagement he rescued a defenceless driver and carried him into cover.
9952	Private ...	West, J. ...	2nd Battalion, South Wales Borderers	For gallant conduct on the night of 5th-6th November, 1914, at Tsingtau, in assisting in the search for and rescue of wounded men under very heavy close-range fire.
5814	Private ...	White, E. W. ...	1st Battalion, Wiltshire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry and coolness during the assault at Spanbroek Molen on 12th March, 1915, in bringing a machine-gun into action under a very heavy fire in very difficult circumstances, after another man had been shot in the attempt.
6834	Serjeant	Whitehouse, T. ...	1st Battalion, South Wales Borderers	For gallantry at Givenchy on the night of 26th-27th January, 1915, in voluntarily joining a party which went forward and destroyed a sap-head.
10990	Private ...	Whittaker, E. ...	1st Battalion, Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment	For conspicuous gallantry in carrying ammunition at a critical moment to the trenches, when the supply had run short, over 400 yards of open ground. Subsequently Private Whittaker heard the wounded men calling for water and went out under very heavy fire and gave them some—friend and foe alike.
