The limits of the Swine-Fever Infected Area declared by Order of the Board dated the fifth day of February, nineteen hundred and fifteen, are hereby contracted so as to comprise only the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area so described is hereby declared to be a Swine-Fever Infected Area for the purposes of the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the ninth day of June, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

**ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.**

(Dated 4th June, 1915.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—

1. And whereas it is expedient that Saffron Walden Registration District should be re-divided into two Sub-districts, to be co-extensive with the recently altered Relief Districts of the Poor Law Union of the same name, and to be constituted as follows:—

(a) A Sub-district to be called and known as Saffron Walden Sub-district, and to consist of Ashdon, Great Chesterford, Great Sampford, Hempstead, Littlebury, Little Chesterford, Little Sampford, Radwinter, Saffron Walden, and Strethall Civil Parishes; and

(b) A Sub-district to be called and known as Newport Sub-district, and to consist of Arkesden, Chrishall, Clavering, Debden, Elmdon, Langley, Newport, Quendon, Rickling, Wendens Ambo, Wenden Lofts, Wicken Bonhunt, Widdington, and Wimbish Civil Parishes;

2. Now, therefore, I, Bernard Mallet, C.B., Registrar-General of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers given me by the above mentioned Act, and with the sanction of the Local Government Board, do hereby order and declare that the foregoing alteration shall take effect accordingly.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and fifteen.

**ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.**

(Dated 4th June, 1915.)

Whereas by the 21st section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—
