

Hampstead at the junction of the Road called Rosslyn Hill with Lyndhurst Road, and extending thence westward along the middle of Lyndhurst Road for a distance of 10½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Road called Lyndhurst Gardens, and extending thence first southward, and then westward, along the middle of Lyndhurst Gardens for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to its junction with a footpath leading to Belsize Place and Belsize Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Hampstead from the said New Parish of the Trinity, West Hampstead."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of London.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department being satisfied that there is accommodation at the Bishop Brown Memorial Industrial School, Stockport, for one hundred and thirty boys, has sanctioned an increase of thirty in the number of inmates of the said School.
